COMMISSION WORKSESSION

August 11, 2025

Minutes of a scheduled worksession of the Sevier County Commission held this eleventh day of August 2025. Meeting commenced at 10:00 a.m. with Commissioners Scott Johnson, Greg Jensen, and Ralph Brown in the Conference Room, Room 116, of the Sevier County Administration Building, 250 North Main, Richfield, Utah. Clerk/Auditor Steven C. Wall, Sheriff Nathan Curtis, Road Superintendent Bob Watts, and others as listed on the attached roll representing several other State and Federal entities.

Review of Monroe Canal Piping Project:

Johnny Parsons, Monroe Mayor, then reviewed with the Commission an extension to the Monroe Canal Piping Project they are planning on doing and working with the County Road Department to extend the piping.

Discussion of possible mitigation needs after the Monroe Canyon Fire:

The Group then discussed the possible effects of flooding after the Monroe Canyon Fire, and possible storms that may be coming. Discussion followed concerning the inlets to the hydro plant, the inlets to their culinary water system, the Monroe Waste Ditch, and possible mitigation for all of the communities that may be affected including Monroe, Annabella, Koosharem, Burrville, Glenwood etc. Further discussion followed concerning possible funding through State and Federal agencies to help mitigate flooding and establish protection for water systems, roads, and the communities, getting things in place to apply for the funding, and the method for tracking expenses and how the funding would be used. They noted that funding would be needed to mitigate other possible effects of the fire.
