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Clerk/Auditor Ryan Sullivan stated recently a new ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) Software was purchased by the Clerk/Auditor's Office which included a budget module. A newer module is now available and Oracle is offering that new software at no cost to the County.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2025-3585, A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN ADJUSTMENT OF 2025 PROPERTY TAXES FOR CERTAIN PARCELS OWNED BY RURAL HOUSING DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION DBA SELF-HELP HOMES

Public Works Director Todd Edwards explained this is a feasibility study for a probable retention basin in Diamond Valley to handle stormwater solutions.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2025-3587, A RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO ZION NATIONAL PARK'S PROPOSED VISITOR USE MANAGEMENT PLAN

Regional Tourism Regulatory Affairs Director Heath Hansen stated Zion National Park has been involved in a Visitor Use Management Process since 2017, which Washington County and the State of Utah have opposed regarding restrictive reservation systems. This Resolution would affirm Washington County's opposition to the use of a reservation system for Zion National Park.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2025-3588, A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE EXECUTION OF A FEDERAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UTAH DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND WASHINGTON COUNTY FOR A FEASIBILITY STUDY OF THE VIRGIN RIVER PATH FROM SUNRISE VALLEY PARK TO GRANDPA'S POND PROJECT

Greater Zion Destination Development Manager Leslie Fonger explained these funds were awarded through the Metropolitan Planning Organization for a feasibility study of the Virgin River multi-use path from Sunrise Valley Park in Washington City to Grandpa's Pond in Hurricane City.
