6. Old Business

a. Dutch John Freedom Fest - Discussion Only

Minutes:

 In order for the Town to collect sales tax and other revenue from the festival, the town legally had to trademark the event. Therefore, starting July 1, 2025 the 4th of July celebration and associated events put on by the town of Dutch John will be advertised and refereed to as the Dutch John Freedom Fest.

- Overall the event went well.
- This years event was suppose to go 22 minutes and lasted 33 minutes.
- There was a call from the Sheriff Office regarding the fireworks from campgrounds going off prior to the event. In the future, the Town will be responsible for monitoring and taking care of rouge behavior.
- Sandy asked what the total for the breakfast was last year. Butch believes that it was \$1400.
- Al asked if Vortek (vendor) committed to working with us again. Nothing
 was said during the festival, but Butch said that they usually followup
 with a phone call. Harriet expressed concern since the 4th is on a
 Saturday next year and there is a difference in both pricing and greater
 potential for schedule conflicts. She would like to reserve the services
 ASAP.

b. Conference Hall Remodel - Discussion Only

Minutes:

 No major updates to report. Engineers should be coming out in the next week or two.

c. CIB Application Update - Discussion Only

Minutes:

- CIB has all the documents now. The Town is on the agenda for September 3.
- If a 100% grant is not awarded, then the next possible option is a 40/60 option. The 40% would be a 30 year loan with a 1% interest rate.
- Worst case scenario would be a 100% loan that would be at 4% interest over 30 years.
- Sandy asked if they could pay more without penalty. Butch said he would like to, but was unsure of the rules.

d. Truth In Taxation - Discussion Only

Minutes:

• Everything for this has been completed. The only items left are public notices that the Council can do themselves.

e. Weed Spraying - Discussion Only

Minutes:

- The estimated cost will be \$1260. Harriet went over all of the roadways and areas that need to be sprayed. Roadsides include the residential areas (first-fourth avenues) as well as the rest of town.
- They have July 21 23 blocked off for the job. Sandy was concerned about the parade on July 24, but the company said this should not be an

issue.

- Wind appears to be the biggest concern.
- Butch would like to start this process earlier next year to stay ahead of the weed growth.

7. New Business

a. 2026 Dutch John Freedom Festival - Discussion Only

Minutes:

- The Town needs a documented checklist outlining all event preparation tasks and assigning responsibility for each one.
- Discussion on the best place for vendors to park in the future. This year they were parked on sixth avenue. Harriet just wanted feedback on if this was the best place.

b. Town Road Repairs - Discussion Only

Minutes:

- Butch spoke with Rob Rodgers, who has connections with a company scheduled to perform road work in Town (Lucas property / development).
 He asked whether the Town could potentially piggyback on that project to have potholes on Sixth Avenue repaired.
- There is \$60,000 in the road fund to help cover the expense.
- Date(s) are still unknown.
