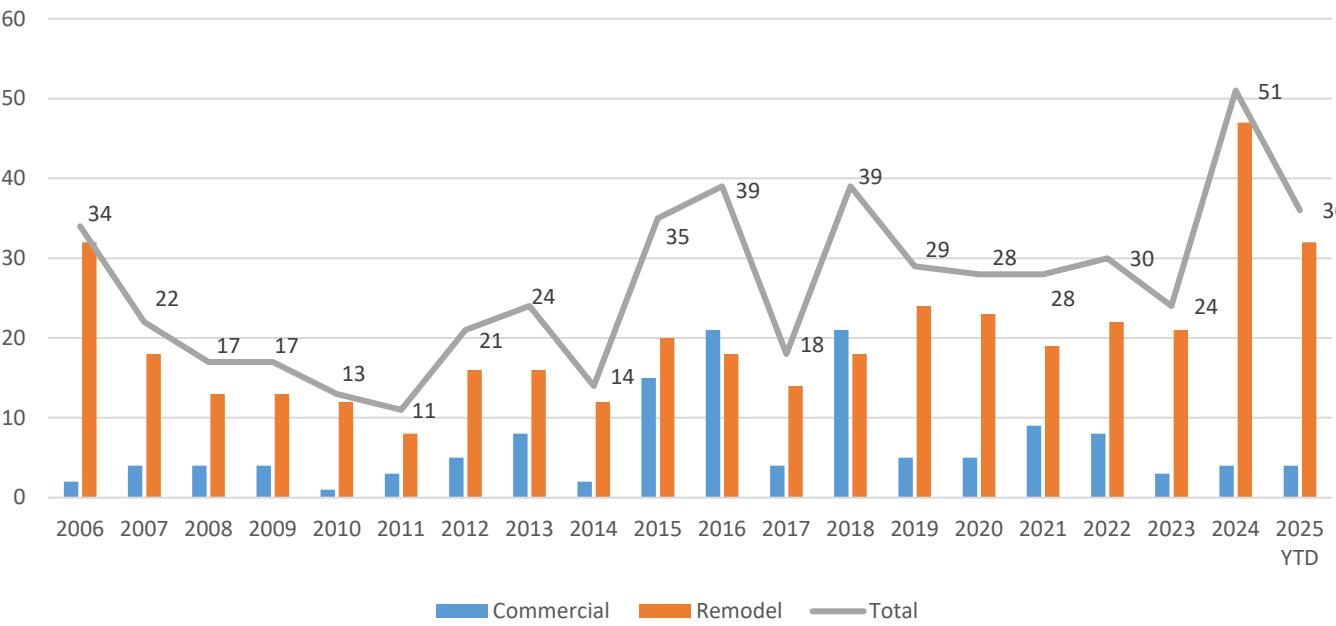

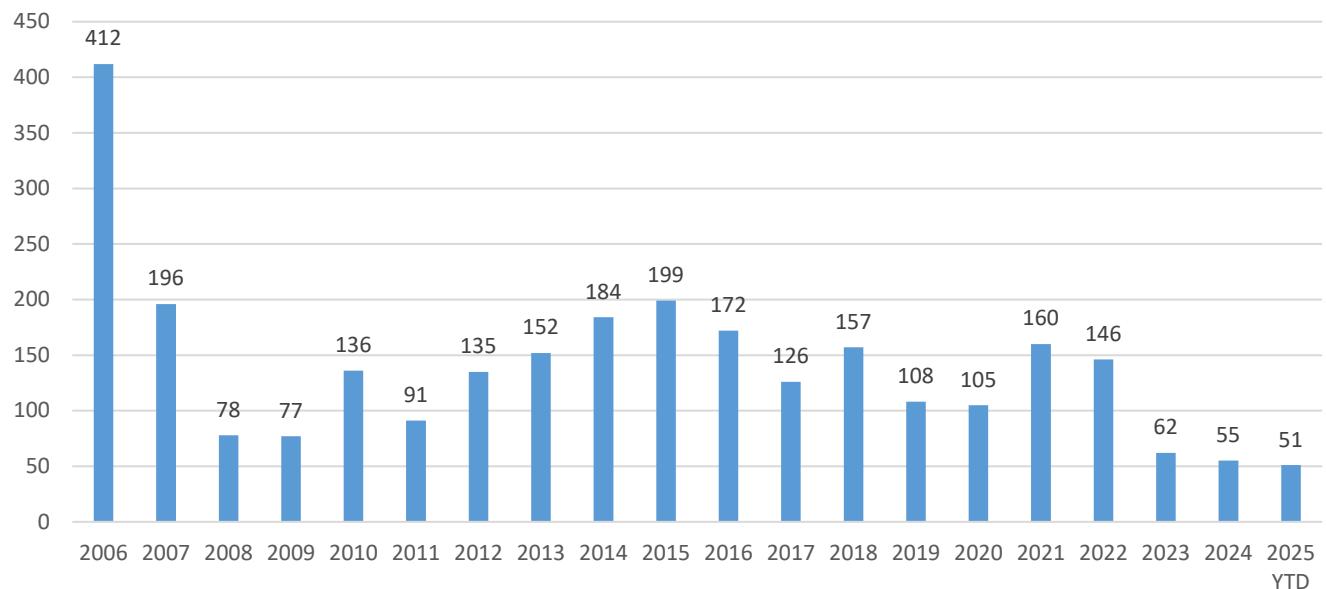

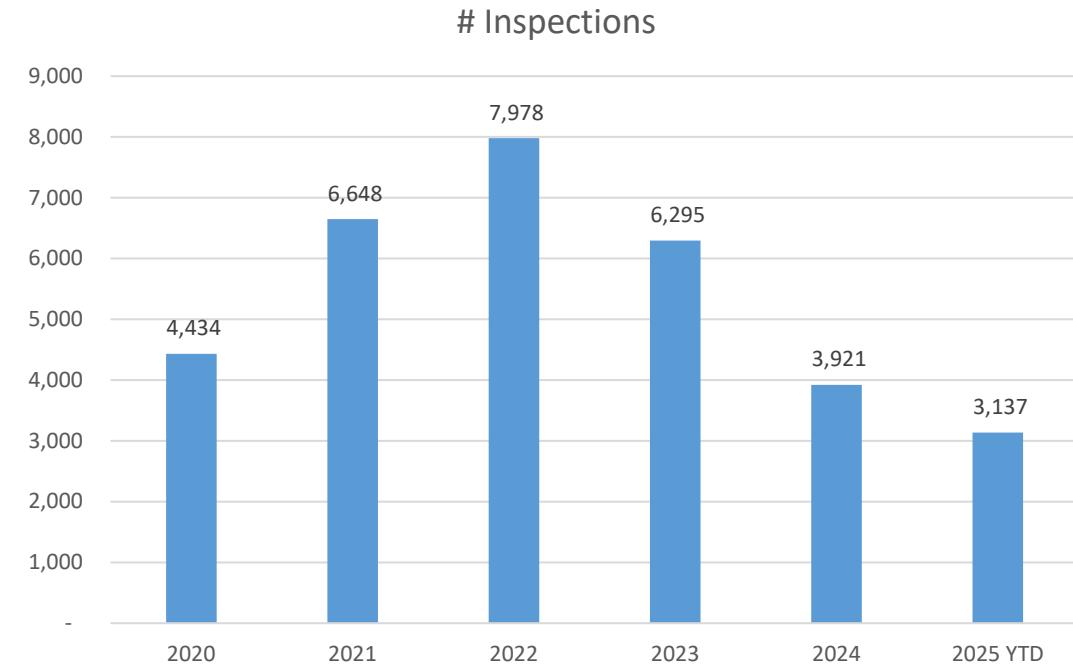


New Home Permits (Single Family/Townhome)

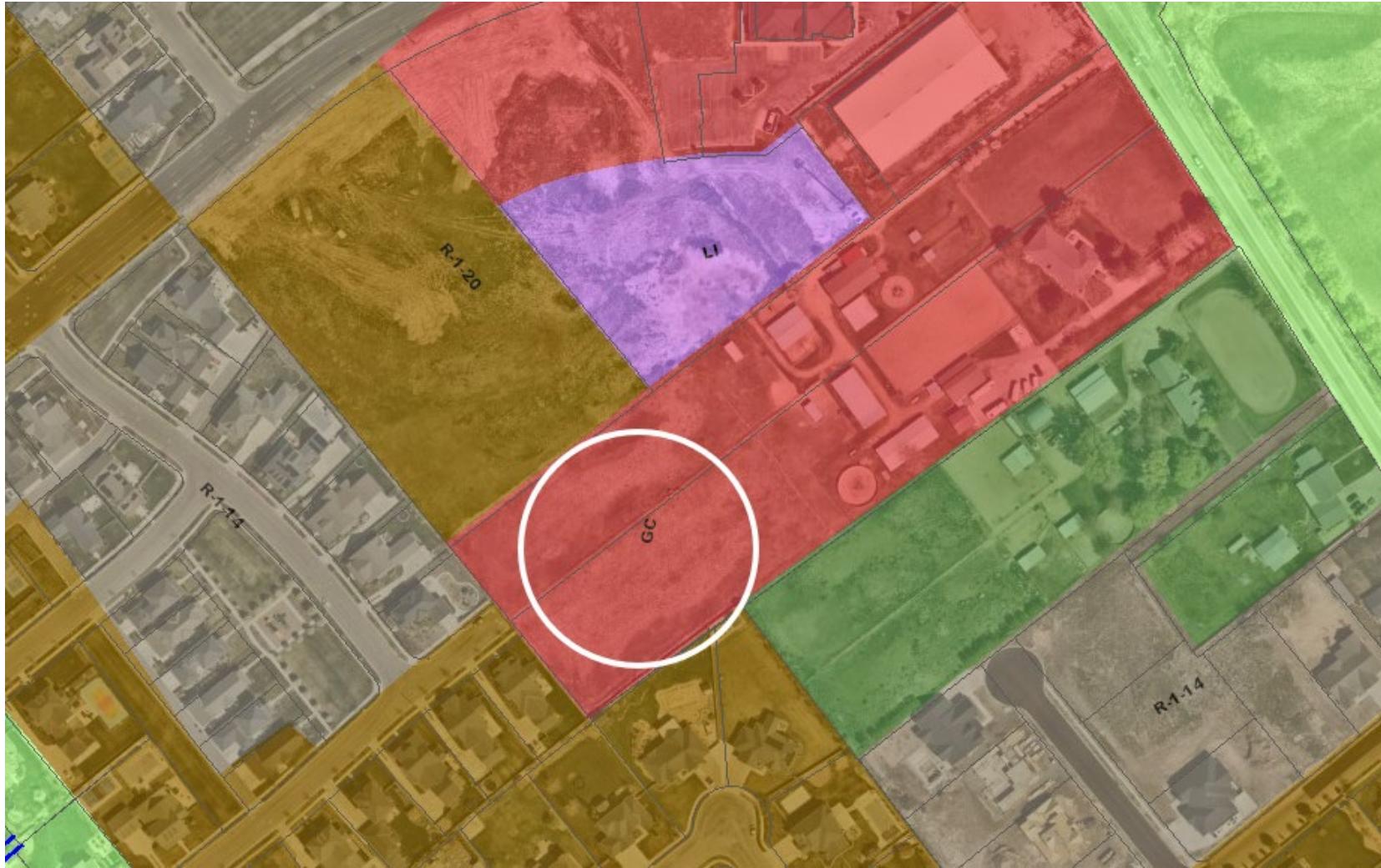

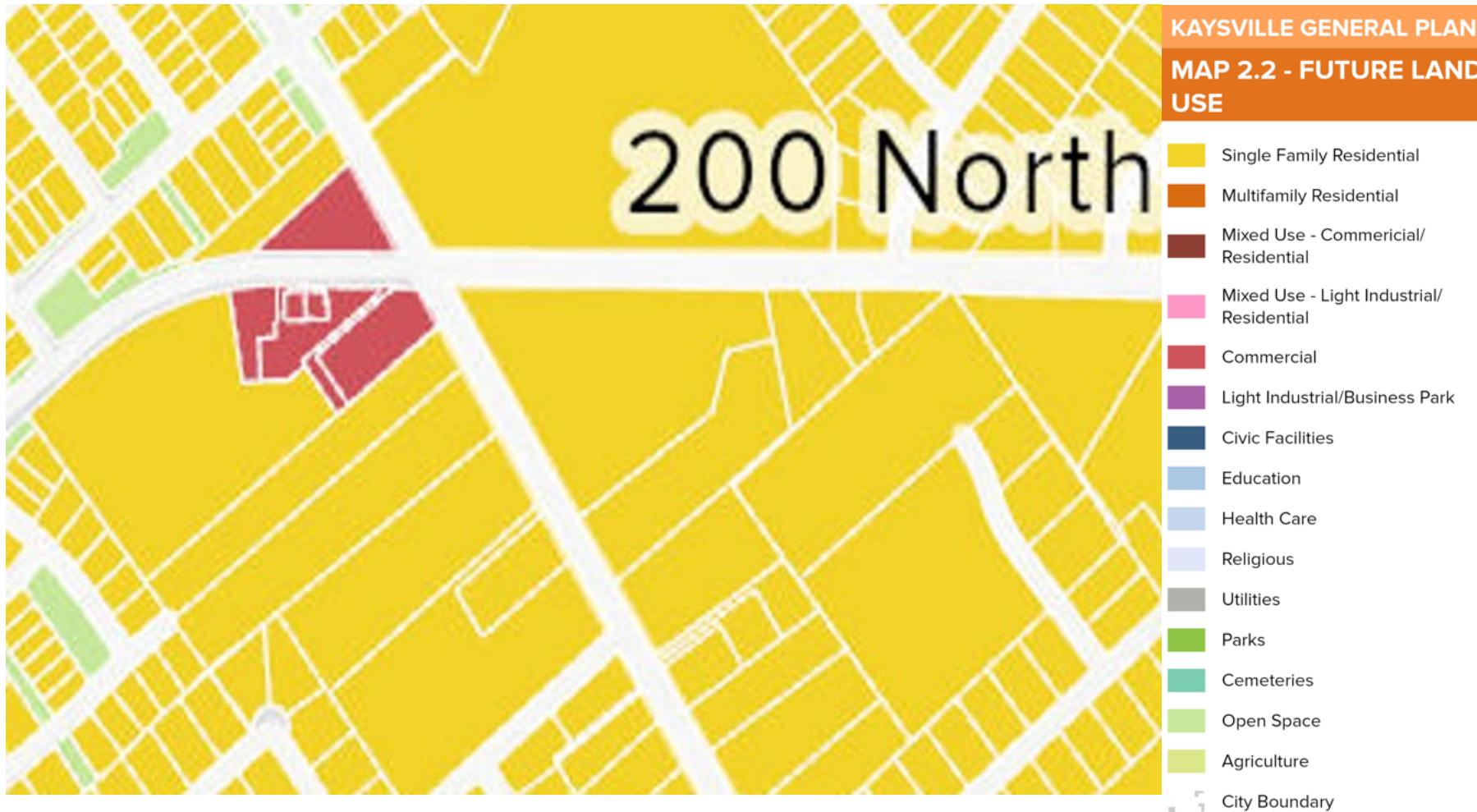

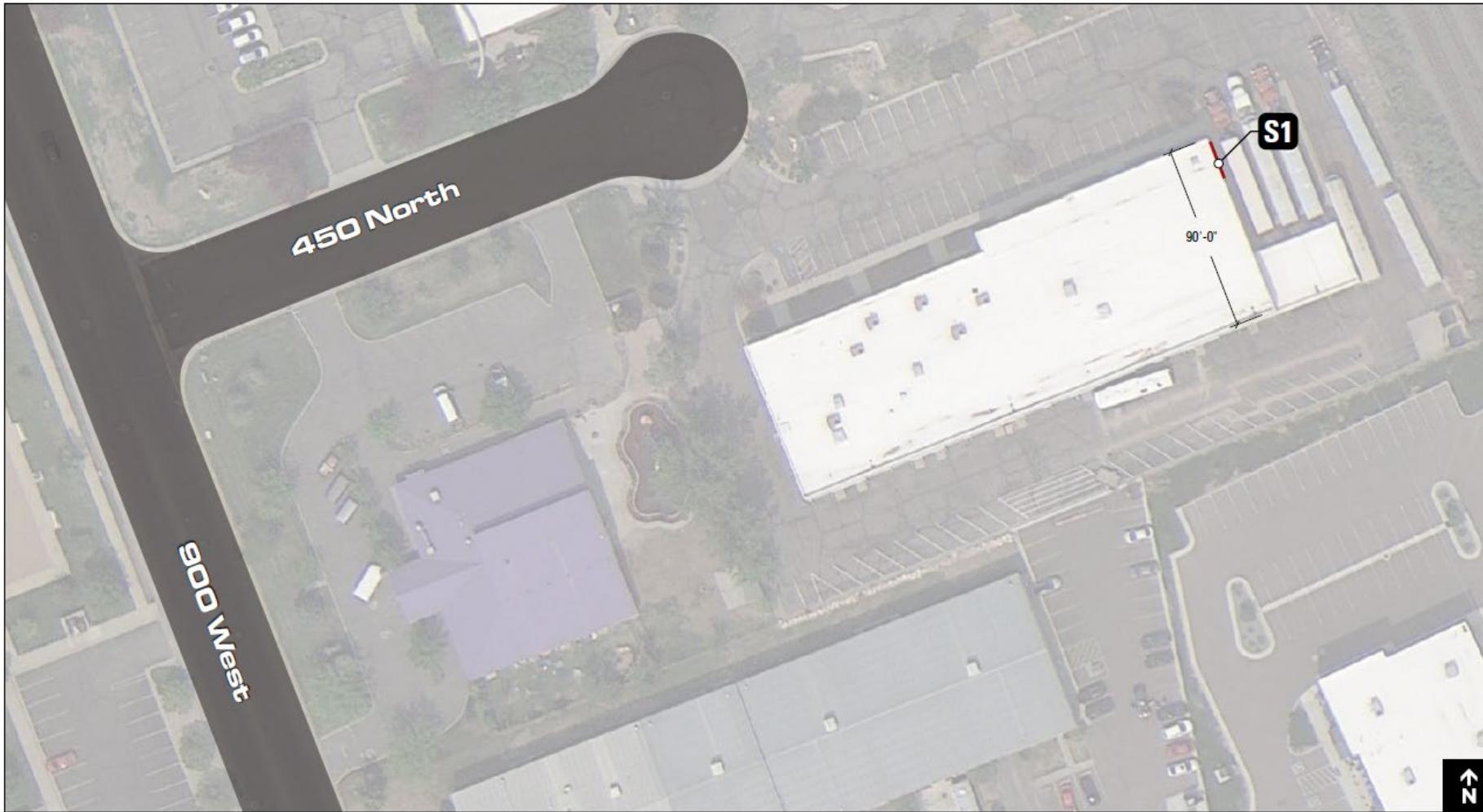
