4) PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION ITEMS

A. Public Hearing on the Planning Commission's recommendation to approve a proposed Concurrent Map Amendment from a land use of MDR (Medium-Density Residential) and Neighborhood Commercial to HDR (High-Density Residential) and a Zone Amendment from RA-1 (Residential Agriculture, minimum lot size 1 acre) to R-1-5 (Residential Single-Family minimum lot size 5,000 square feet) on approximately 13.02 acres located at approximately 290 South 100 West. Carroll Winsor and Donald Alva Best Family Protective Trust-Sherrie Jean Best Jones Successor-Trustee-Owner. The Lofts Development LLC-Applicant

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: This is a proposed zoning map amendment for the property located at approximately 290 South and 100 West. The owner, Carroll Winsor and

Donald Alva Best Family Protective Trust-Sherrie Jean Jones Successor-Trustee, and the applicant, The Lofts Development, LLC seeks to rezone the parcel(s) from RA-I (Residential Agriculture, minimum lot size 1 acre) zone to R-1-5 (Residential Single Family, minimum lot size 5,000 sq ft) on approximately 13.02 acres. The land use is currently a MDR (Medium-Density Residential) and Neighborhood Commercial use. The applicant is seeking a HDR (High-Density Residential) use. The Building Official reviewed this application and found it to be a complete application and in compliance with City Code, as well as the land use plan. The applicant proposes this zone change to accommodate a specific development type. The zone request is consistent with the following land use designations: This land use is currently an MDR and Neighborhood Commercial use, which holds the RE-12.5, R-1-10 and R-1-7.5 density and commercial uses. The applicant is seeking an HDR use, which holds the R-1-5, R-2-6, R-2-10, RM and R-TH density uses. They are requesting the R-1-5 zone. **Mayor Chris Hart opened the Public Hearing.** Residents who live adjacent to the area had questions and concerns regarding the location for this proposed high-density because of its proximity to UNITY Park, traffic, nuisance, public safety, water availability, inadequate parking, the lots being too small, construction traffic, the proposal goes against the General Plan and their preference that the property remain as Medium-Density Residential. Some residents submitted Public Comments and those are available as attachments to this agenda. **There was a young couple** who have been saving to buy a house and spoke in favor of this amendment to High-Density Residential.

The developer spoke in favor of this amendment and clarified that it was the intent for this development is for single family homes that are approximately 1500 to 1700 square feet for sale and not for rent. He supported water conservation, desert landscape and earth tone colors. Medium-Density on this site would be 69 units but they started with 74 units with the intent to blend on the north side. It would be difficult to blend in Medium-Density throughout the project due to attainable housing price points. He was passionate about building for the missing middle. He pointed out that each of the other parks in the City have High-Density Residential next to the park. One audience member inquired if a couple of the lots could be sacrificed for parking.
