BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: This Public Hearing is a requirement and is something Ivins City addresses every year. The salary data is provided by third party vendor TechNet and the data is for a population of 30,000 or less. There is a proposed COLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) and a proposed increase based on merit. **Mayor Chris Hart** opened the Public Hearing. B. Discuss and consider approval of Ordinance No. 2025-20, an Ordinance of Ivins City, Utah, approving FY26 Salaries and/or Salary Ranges for Elected Officials, Statutory Officers and Department Heads

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: Council Member Sharon Gillespie shared some data points for residents for some of the things that transpired in City Hall. A resident sent her an email recommending that the City employees wear multiple hats to save money as part of Ivins ongoing service. She let the residents know that Ivins City is already doing that and provided the following examples: Director of Finance Cade Visser also runs Administrative Services, IT, AV, Building Security and currently writing a data privacy program. Prior to becoming City Manager, Chuck Gillette served in dual roles for an extended period of time as the City Engineer and Public Works Director and is continuing to serve as the Public Works Director and City Manager until the Public Works Director position can be filled. Rob Dalley is the Building Official, Zoning Administrator, as well as handling Code Enforcement. If the City were to split those roles out, the costs involved would be significant. The City of St. George spends \$1.8 million on their IT Department, which includes a staff of 13. Obviously Ivins City would not need that but Ivins would be looking at a cost of \$30,000 to \$45,000 per year for one IT person to do what Cade Visser currently does with IT for the City and it would likely be difficult to find a qualified person that would want to do that job part-time. The City has incurred savings with the former City Manager Dale Coulam retiring and going through the transition. Wearing two hats can be a great way to save money but it can also provide for one area to be fed, while another area is starved. She referred to the value of a merit increase on a regular basis. The biggest value for Ivins with that is retention and expertise. The loss of expertise is huge when that turn-over happens. There is a significant cost to replace a tenured employee with time and labor intensity. According to salary.com, the cost to replace an employee conservatively ranges from one-half to two times an employee's regular salary. The City also needs to consider the labor market. The average cost to hire these days is \$15,000, 94 days, 14 calls and interviews and then there's the cost of a wrong hire. There is a huge reason for providing a merit increase on a regular basis and not only due to the cost of hiring and training new employees but providing a merit increase on a regular basis provides sustainability for the City in the long-term. It keeps the City fair and competitive in the market and recognizes excellence and protects the City's morale, community spirit and level of service. **Mayor Chris Hart** commented that Ivins staff is the most valuable resource in the City. D. Discuss and consider approval of a Development Agreement for Red Mountain Resort

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: There are three things this agreement locks in on their behalf and also preserves the status quo on the City's behalf. Those three things are the overall density of 500 units; the ability to cluster that density throughout the project; and locking in the Table of Uses. This is in the RC zone and the Table of Uses is already defined by code.

Many uses in the Table of Uses are Class 4 and Class 5 uses so those will come before the Planning Commission and/or City Council depending on the Class. **One City Council Member** was not in favor of anymore short-term rentals but understood that the developers had the right to do that based on the zoning. **That City Council Member** had concerns about blasting and the ability to let the residents know the exact dates and times of when blasting would occur. She was also concerned about construction traffic in that area. **Another City Council Member** did not have adequate time to review this or provide a response to the other Council Members, of which included a list of 36 items to be addressed. The **Mayor and City Council** agreed that this agenda item would be continued to a future City Council agenda.

F. Discuss and consider approval of expenditure to prepare the Master Plan, Impact Fee Facilities Plan and Impact Fee Analysis for Water

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: Since Ivins City last updated these plans in 2019, the Washington County Water Conservancy District has come up with a new 20-year plan and has identified a capital facilities plan that involves scaling back the secondary water system and boosting the importance of the culinary water system especially on the west side by building a water treatment plant somewhere on the west side of Ivins City. Bowen Collins & Associates prepared Ivins last culinary and secondary water master plans and have offered a scope of work and fee estimate that is in line with Ivins budget. Staff is recommending to contract with Bowen Collins & Associates as a sole source provider under Ivins purchasing policy based on justifications identified in the staff report that is available as an attachment to this agenda. This expense is impact fee eligible and impact fees will be used to pay for this study and is budgeted.
