2. Welcome:

3. Review minutes from previous meetings:

4. City Council Meeting Reports:

- a. Committee report for City Council Meeting
 - i. May Meeting: *(By Billie)*
 - 1. Was able to attend the first portion of the meeting. The council addressed a flood on 3200 W. During open comments, there was some family members speak about their loved one who was killed, they were upset with the police department. There is a new pickleball court going in over by the freeway
 - ii. Review schedule for future meeting attendance
 - 1. LeeAnne is unable to attend the Aug 5 meeting where we were going to present to the council. It was agreed to move the presentation to Aug 19, Janell will check the agenda for that day and let us know if that will work.
- b. City Council report: *(By Councilman Shelton)*
 - i. The senior center announcement will still be a few months away. The housing associated with the senior center will have a portion for low income people. The criteria to qualify for low income changes every year based on several factors. Based on the last census, the median income for Salt Lake County was \$94,658. The council approved the tentative budget, it is on the website available for review. It will be approved in one of the meetings in June. It was noted that recreation is only 4% of the total budget.

 - i. Summerfest is coming up and the information is on the website. The leisure guide should go out next week.

- d. Salmon Supper discussion continued (*By Jamie*)
 - i. Payson City will allow us to purchase tickets the week before so we are confident we will get tickets. Therefore, I did not pursue finding the LeBus cancellation policy. The ticket prices have gone up to \$25+tax (\$27.11). This is more of an increase than anticipated. So that would mean that ticket prices would be \$40 per person with the committee's support, otherwise it will be \$50 without the committee support. Midge suggested we have the cost be \$40 for residents and \$50 for non-residents, the rest of the committee agreed. It was not possible for the committee to give more than \$600 due to not enough in the budget.

6. New Business:

- a. Asked Senior Programs staff about items needed for the center. the items below are what they came up with.
 - i. replacement chargers and vases for special events
 - 1. decorative plate chargers \$70
 - 2. vases: \$25
 - ii. kitchen aide whisk \$25
 - iii. replacement donation bins \$30 for a 4 pack
 - iv. bingo machine \$2000 (to replace the machine we currently have)
 - v. plates/bowls/cups \$100-200
 - vi. picnic tables for patio (we have 2 patios) \$200 each
 - vii. Plastic display holders for front desk \$30 for a 6 pack
 - 1. Based on the remaining amount in the budget and committee discussion, Erie moved that the committee purchase \$25 for vases, \$25 kitchen aide

whisk, \$100 for plates/cups, \$30 for plastic display holders. It was seconded by Midge and all the committee agreed. Councilman Shelton also will be donating decorative chargers for special events.

- b. New committee member applicant is meeting with the council on June 3. Kay Wadley applied and we are excited that she may join the committee.
