Report from Planning Commission

Rob Ortega stated the Planning Commission held two public hearings. A rezone of property at 3056 N 3900 W from A-1 to RE-30 for Jerry and Teddy Anderson and to amend Chapter 6 Commercial Zones 10-6-1 Uses. Discussed the three sections of the commercial zones for amending to add shooting range that will be coming to the City Council to review. Also, the final approval on the Jed DeVries Subdivision.

Presentation: Western Weber CTC Award - Ryan & Julie Evans

Nichol Blanch from Western Weber CTC stated a big part of their grants right now is to increase protective factors of community and family bonding by recognizing people and youth that do a great job in our community. We are very privileged to be able to go into both Fremont and West Field High Schools, Mountain View and Rocky Mountain Junior Highs and present students each month in that school with a Grit Award. Plain City has been amazing recognizing your community in their efforts to do good for the community and so we are here tonight to present a Community Champion Award to Ryan and Julie Evans. Councilmember Beal read a letter. 'In the beginning of the summer, Ryan, a life skills teacher at Fremont High School, and Julie, a life skills teacher at Wahlquist Junior High, reached out to the community with a wonderful idea of having a pool party for the special needs youth, their caregivers, and their families that they and their co-workers serve. Through the generous support of the community, they were able to host a pool party in late July that was attended by over 300 individuals. Not only were these sweet children able to enjoy an activity in a safe, fun, and welcoming environment. The caregivers were also able to enjoy an event surrounded by others who understood their struggles, accepted their children as they are, and gave support during medical events. Everyone enjoyed good food, swimming, and gifts. Fun, joy, and smiles were had by all. A lot of time and effort went into putting this event together, and through the efforts of Julie, Ryan, the community, and volunteers, it was a great success. This was the first year the special needs pool party was organized, but Ryan, Julie, and the community are hopeful that it will become an annual event. It is because of these extraordinary efforts that Ryan and Julie Evans have been nominated to receive the Western Weber Communities That Care CTC Community Champion Award."

ORDINANCE NO.	
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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10-6-1 OF THE PLAIN CITY CODE

WHEREAS, Section 10-6-1 addresses certain uses in commercial zones; and

WHEREAS, the Plain City Council, in coordination with the Plain City Planning Commission, wishes to modify the use of archery shops and ranges within commercial zones and address the use of shooting ranges within said zones.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of Plain City, Utah:

- 1. Section 10-6-1.A. of the Plain City Code is hereby amended as shown in Exhibit A, which is attached below and is incorporated into this ordinance.
- 2. The codifier is hereby directed to ensure that this ordinance is codified in a manner that is consistent with the numbering conventions of the Plain City Code, including making any necessary changes to the numbering of sections and subsections.
