



- Resources/referrals (23)





Immunization — Clinics

- All clinics — YTD 2025 (Jan–August): **187**
(not a subset of the 137 outreach events noted earlier calendar)
- Most clinics held in April and May
- Concentrated in Salt Lake City, West Valley City, Midvale, and other west-side communities

Immunizations — Doses/Throughput

Jan-Aug, 2025

Total Outreach Clinics: 187

Total Vaccinations Provided: 5,960 to 2,801 clients

- Refugee: 21 clinics (11%) / 724 vaccines (12%)
- Unsheltered: 46 clinics (25%) / 1,081 vaccines (18%)
- Inmate: 12 clinics (6%) / 1,173 vaccines (20%)
- Harm Reduction: 19 clinics (10%) / 717 vaccines (12%)
- Schools: 31 clinics (17%) / 1,106 vaccines (19%)
- Workplaces: 10 clinics (5%) / 55 vaccines (1%)

\$9,825 in fees waived for vaccinations for uninsured minors with cost barriers.

Total Tb Tests Provided: 177

Immunizations — Measles Preventative Response

Jan-Aug, 2025

520 Measles vaccines were administered across 119 locations in the community including **84 vaccines at 28 schools** and **426 vaccines at 87 partner facilities**.

Immunizations — Partner Feedback

Highlight: Pride 2025 Festivals

- Thanks to collaboration across teams, we provided vital services to the community during the Utah & SLC Pride 2025 festivals:
 - 208 HIV tests conducted by the HIV Testing Team
 - 238 total vaccinations given by the Immunizations Team (including 37 Mpox and 31 Measles vaccines)
 - 115 individuals vaccinated, 43 of whom were uninsured
 - 565 Naloxone kits distributed by the Community Health, Immunizations, and OD2A teams
