Call to order

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm.

I. Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the May 5, 2025 meeting were reviewed.

Following the review Steve Thygerson made a motion to approve the minutes and Seth Wallace seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

II. Public Hearing: proposed ropeway registration fee increase

Brian Allen introduced the proposed 15% fee increase for ropeway registration fees. The additional surcharge for summer operation will remain at 15%. The hearing was opened for questions or comments. Nick Dana, Park City Resort, asked what was driving the need for a fee increase. Brian Allen indicated that it was primarily the costs associated with the Ropeway Safety Engineer position. The budget, fees collected, gradually increases as the number of lifts grow from new installations. The program costs grow as the ropeway safety engineer position costs more from pay increases for state employees. There were no additional questions or comments.

Following the opportunity for comments Seth Wallace made a motion of support for the proposed fee increase, Steve Thygerson seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously. The proposed fee increase will be forwarded to the governor's office to be included for discussion in the next general session of the state legislature.

III. Qualified Engineer application: Jeremiah Frazier

The qualified engineer application of Jeremiah Frazier was reviewed. Following the discussion Seth Wallace made a motion to approve the application and Patrick Cowley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

IV. Forest Service, Area, and Manufacturer Updates

Those present gave a brief update on the recent activities at the resort.

V. Open Discussion / Questions

The open discussion included a preliminary review of the air space exception request for the Park City Resort Cabriolet Gondola replacement. The request identified 7 points for discussion. Following the presentation and discussion of those 7 points the UPRSC had additional requests for 2 of those. More information is requested about the power line crossing, particularly a confirmation that the clearances met ANSI and Rocky Mountain Power clearance requirements. Also identified as a concern was the potential of a fire hazard created by the location of dumpsters located underneath the lift line. Relocation of the dumpsters or mitigation of the fire hazard was requested. Verification of clearances when the dumpsters were being emptied was also requested.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:10 pm.

Subject: Exception requests: direct drive lifts

Background:

Three direct drive lifts are being installed this year and need exceptions for the brakes all acting on the same surface, the bullwheel. Two lifts are at Deer Valley, the lower and upper sections of the Deer Valley East Village Gondola. The other lift is the Sunrise gondola at Park City Resort.

The other direct drive lifts in Utah have exceptions granted and have operated without incident. I would recommend approval of these exceptions upon the completion of the paperwork.

The exception request for the Park City Resort Sunrise gondola is being finalized. I will send it when it has been completed.

DESCRIPTION (Original Requests: complete items 1-4, Review Requests: complete item 1 only)	
1.	ANSI B77 sections or R920-50 rules to which the ropeway does not conform: 3.1.2.6-Brakes and rollback devices
2.	Why does it not conform? The Deer Valley East Village Gondola uses Direct Drive motors. This precludes the use of a gearbox and a service brake acting on the gearbox highspeed input shaft.
3.	Procedures that would be required to bring the lift into conformance with standards: The Direct Drive technology is well proven in the USA and worldwide. The use of this technology eliminates the use of service brakes in the traditional sense.
4.	Reasons for requesting an exception: Redundant surfaces exist for the emergency brakes and service brakes to react against. Probability of braking surface contamination has been reduced by protecting the Drive bullwheel flanges from spills. Redundant braking philosophy assures the failure of the Emergency brake to stop and hold will invoke a separate, independant braking system to stop and hold the lift (Service Brake)

Background:

Due to construction sequencing near the bottom station of the Deer Valley East Village Gondola, pedestrians with ski equipment in-arms will be routed between towers 2 and 3 for the 2025/2026 ski season.

The use of a shipping container as a passageway will prevent contact between the cabins and the ski equipment being carried by customers.

1.	ANSI B77 sections or R920-50 rules to which the ropeway does not conform: 3.1.1.5.1 - Vertical Clearances
2.	Why does it not conform? A shipping container has been located between towers 2 and 3 to prevent pedestrian and skier contact with gondola cabins. If the shipping container were removed, pedestrians and skiers could contact moving gondola cabins with their equipment.
3.	Procedures that would be required to bring the lift into conformance with standards: This situation is a result of large scale construction project that will be completed by the 2026/2027 operating season. This is a temporary exception request that will not be needed by the fall of 2026.
4.	Reasons for requesting an exception: Please see attached photos and reasoning justifying this request.

RE: Exception Request to ANSI B77.1-2022 Section 3.1.1.5.1 – Vertical Clearance for Deer Valley East Village Gondola (Section 1)

This is a 1 season temporary exception request to the vertical clearance requirements set forth in ANSI B77.1-2022 Section 3.1.1.5.1 – Vertical Clearances; specifically between towers 2 and 3. All other spans will be compliant.

Due to construction sequencing near the bottom station of the Deer Valley East Village Gondola, pedestrians with ski equipment in-arms will be routed between towers 2 and 3 for the 2025/2026 ski season. This poses a concern between the minimum vertical clearance standard put forth by ANSI B77.1-2022 Section 3.1.1.5.1 where the minimum vertical clearance between cabin and ground is 8ft. (the gondola would meet the minimum standards but, it is deer valley's belief that a hazard to passengers and pedestrians carrying ski gear still exists while meeting the 8 foot minimum clearance requirements.)

It is Deer Valley's opinion, that a minimum vertical clearance of 8 feet is insufficient to prevent skiers and pedestrians from contacting cabins with ski equipment while passing under the ropeway between towers 2 and 3. Deer Valley has placed a shipping container with open-ends beneath the gondola to create a passage for pedestrians to walk through on their way to the bottom station of the Gondola. The shipping container will prevent the pedestrians' ski equipment from contacting the gondola while it is in operation. Ropes will corral the pedestrians and skiers into and out of the container so they cannot go around it.



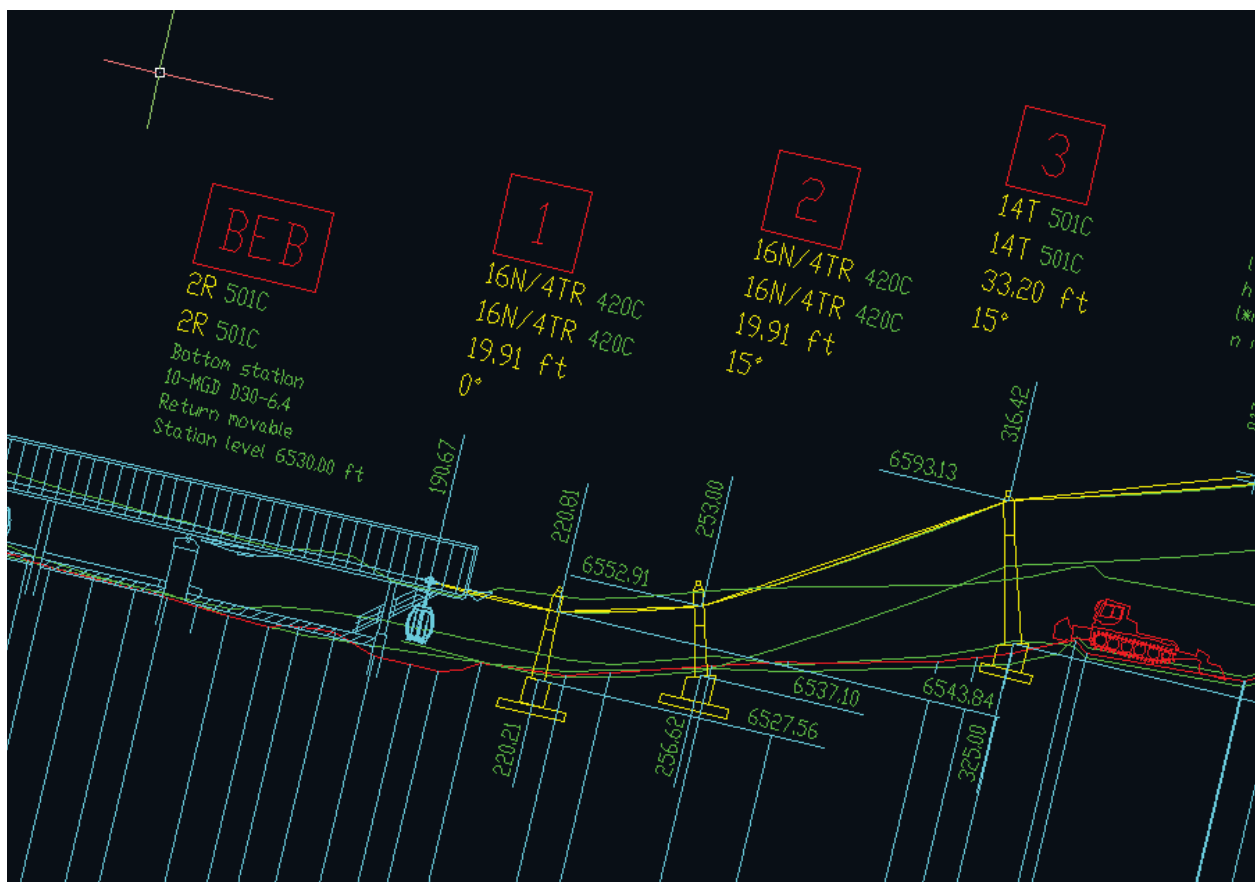

The Distance from top of the container to the bottom of the cabin is just under 4 feet of clearance. This 4 feet of clearance does not meet the ANSI standard but, we believe sufficient mitigation measures prevent any contact between cabins and the container. These mitigations are noted below.

The designed ropeway profile provided by Doppelmayr USA, Inc. expects a deviation of .2 feet (approx. 2.5") from fully empty cabins to fully loaded cabins. This deflection is notable but, is relatively small. The area between the cabin and top of the cabin will not be accessible while the gondola is moving.



Snow will be removed from the top of the container manually (shovels) while the gondola is not in operation.

There will be NO snowcats between towers 2 and 3. Any snow removal equipment, at ground level adjacent to the container, such as snowblowers and shovels are not expected to cause harm to the ropeway.

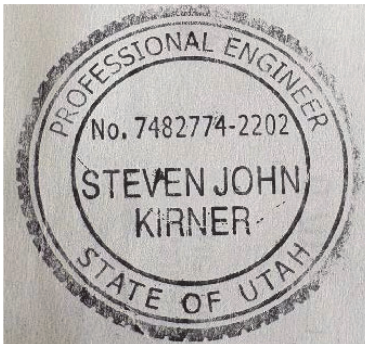


The only flammable material in the container is the wood floor and there will be no other materials stored in the container making the fire risk low.

The minimum vertical clearance requirement of 8 feet should be waived temporarily for Section 1 of the Deer Valley East Village Gondola between towers 2 and 3 because the ropeway will deflect minimally (approx. 2.5") and by using a container we create separation between passengers and pedestrians. Furthermore, to ensure pedestrians do not go around the shipping container (passage way) ropes will guide pedestrians in and out of the container.
