Annual Donation to the American Legion

Dave Allen of the American Legion reported that the Legion has provided 671 volunteer hours to the community so far this year. They also set up flags on Memorial Day in the cemeteries on the east side of the county. They also oversaw the Boy's State program this year. The flag presentations were also performed by the Legion during high school sporting events. Mayor Holt suggested that the council pay for their power bill in the months of November and December because the city hooks up to their building for the Christmas lights display in the Territorial Statehouse Park.

Resolution 25-14 Amending the Fillmore City Fee & Rate Schedule (Miscellaneous Amendments)

Resolution 25-15 Amending the Fillmore City Fee & Rate Schedule (Enact Animal Adoption Fee)

A \$25.00 adoption fee would discourage adoption of dogs that are repeatedly adopted and then returned back to the city. Councilmember Stevens suggested that providing proof of a permanent address in Fillmore be a requirement for adopting a dog. The council also suggested that it be required that all adopted dogs be spayed or neutered.

MOTION: To adopt Resolution 25-15 to enact an animal adoption fee and add requirements of providing proof of a permanent address in Fillmore and that the dog be spayed or neutered.

Proposed Interlocal Agreement Regarding Transfer of the Fillmore Class IVb Landfill from Millard County to Fillmore City

MOTION: To table until all information needed to make an informed decision is obtained by the city.

Repeal Water Acquisition Fee

Councilmember Hare shared a report of city water usage data to show that the city may not be in as dire a situation in terms of water that was originally suggested. Even if the State were to take away 2,000 acre-feet of the city's water shares (which he believes would not be allowed to happen) the city would still have almost three times the amount of water that the city is currently using in water reserves. With this information, Councilmember Hare believes that the city no longer needs to implement the current water acquisition fee. Doing away with the fee would encourage needed residential development in Fillmore. This recommendation would need to go back to the planning commission for their review because it went to them during the adoption process when it was originally adopted.

MOTION: To send this item to the planning commission for their review with a recommendation from the city council that the commission provide a recommendation that the water acquisition fee be repealed.

Airport

- The emergency shut-off valves for the airport fuel tanks will be installed next week.

- UDOT communicated to Councilmember Winget that they would like the city to remove two of the existing crosswalks on Main Street if UDOT installs a pedestrian

143 activated crossing light so that all pedestrian traffic be funneled to the proposed
144 pedestrian crossing light. The city does not want to give up any of its crosswalks.

147 **Water**

148 • There is a local water well owner who is replacing one of his wells on his property. It
149 is in the best interest of the city to be involved with this especially if the city were to
150 take over ownership of the well in the future. It was determined that the city has no
151 obligation to help pay for any expenses associated with replacing the well.

154 **Celebrations**

155 • Amber Rausch has accepted the invitation to be the new celebrations committee
156 chairperson. Councilmember Stevens stated that the committee is looking into doing
157 some sort of celebration between Christmas and Easter to cheer people up during the
158 winter months.

162 • Councilmember Hare asked for clarification on the annexation noticing process and
163 procedures. Attorney Harris clarified that once the city receives final plans from an
164 annexation developer, then the city may re-publish the annexation notice at that time.

166 Both data centers that will be built in Millard County will begin construction in January of
167 2026. There will need to be housing provided for 500+ employees that will be working at the
168 new centers.
