5.a Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) - Earthen Dam Project - Remaining Request

\$34,892.50 unfunded from \$250,000 original request for an Earthen Dam Project: to restore the earthen dams in Navajo Mountain in the San Juan County, Utah region. The intention of the earthen dam is to store water for irrigation, create drinking water when water seeps back underground to create aquafer, and hydroelectric power. The are earthen dams are important part of the infrastructure and can help reduce the impacts of floods and droughts. No funding from UNTF has been included in this request. \$215,107.50 funded at 9/25/2025 board meeting.

5.b Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) - Senior Citizen Center - Septic and grease trap cleanout

\$1,000 requested to help cover the costs of septic system clean out, grease trap clean out, floor tile repair, and other similar repairs for the Naatsis'Aan Senior Citizen Center.

5.c Navajo Utah Commission - Naatsis'Aan Senior Center Renovation

\$200,000 requested for the repair and renovation of the Naatsis'Aan Senior Center, including, but not limited to, plumbing repairs, HVAC repair/replacement, floor tile repair/replacement, and upgrade of kitchen facility. The NRF Board has previously allocated \$729,150.17 to this project. No funds are requested of UNTF in this request, but previous requests in this project have included UNTF funds.

5.d Oljato Chapter - Christine Cly Yazzie - New Home (DBB)

\$27,200 requested for a new 717 sqft (2 bed, 1 bath) home. This is being constructed by Design Build Utah @ Bluff. UNTF is requested to match \$27,200.

a) Signed requesting Organization board or Chapter Support Resolution: There is a signed resolution by the pro-tempore for this Earthen Dam. The chapter authorizes the pro-tempore to be signatory of the resolution for this project.

b) Brief description of project:

Briefly this earthen dam project is to restore the earthen dams in Navajo Mountain in the San Juan County, Utah region. The intention of the earthen dam is to store water for irrigation, create drinking water when water seeps back underground to create aquafer, and hydroelectric power. The are earthen dams are important part of the infrastructure and can help reduce the impacts of floods and droughts. Even though dam failures can cause significant damage and loss of life, so we must take steps to ensure their safety but the earthen dams the Navajo Mountain would be small enough to not cause any failure. In this project the high school students can be introduced to learn about earthen dams and how to inspect them so they can be a part of keeping our communities safe.

The Navajo Mountain community has identified a few of the earthen dam in the San Juan County, Utah region that need to be restored to hold water for the purpose of livestock, agricultural purpose. In the last few years, the Navajo Mountain area has dealt with drought and there are not enough funds to cover the cost of water storages for the community. The over roll chapter have about 150 homes that do not have running water and are in dire need water to come into their home.

So, the chapter is merely requesting \$250,000 to address the infrastructure or restoring the existing dams in the San Juan County, Utah of Navajo Mountain. Not only to serve livestock, but also to exercise the water rights by keeping the nation's water, rain, and snow, running off into off-reservation tributaries, in addition, these earth tanks will also serve as major re-charge system to underground aquifer plus to serve as a water source for gardening and water for wildlife in the area. As we have observed over the years two deep wells on Rainbow Plateau in Arizona has depleted underground aquifer and two more windmills on Paiute Mesa are experiencing decrease in water level.

- 3. These earthen dams have been subjected to neglect and never rehabilitated since inception into the NaaTsis'Aan community with numerous requests made to the Navajo Nation Department of Water Resource with no avail; and,
- 4. The Naatsis' Aan Development Association with the help from Brown & Caldwell have studied and located all the earthen Dams with GPS in San Juan County, Utah and therefore the Chapter is ready to move forward with the project; and,
- The Chapter has identified Summit Construction and delegated this Navajo Owned construction Company perform the task of rebuilding selected earthen dams on Piute Mesa and the Rainbow City with assistance from the NaaTsis'Aan Development Association; and,

6. The objective of this task is to rehabilitate 3 (three) Earthen Dams in Paiute Mesa and 3 (three) in the Rainbow City area to minimize adverse impact to livestock owners, farmers, floods and future road developments within NaTsis'Aan San Juan County, Utah.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Naatsis'Aan Chapter requests of the Navajo Revitalization Fund (NRF) to allocate \$250,000.00 for restoration of Earthen Dams, and establish new Earthen Dams in Naatsis'Aan, San Juan County, Utah for the benefit of agricultural developments, and future road developments by controlling floods.

- 8. Scope of Work (attach a description answering the following or attach documents).
 - a. Brief description of project with client names of those that qualify for UNTF Residency Requirements. The Naatsis'Aan Senior Center Program provides services annually to elderly, disabled, and high-risk individuals in the Naatsis'Aan community, which includes areas within San Juan County (Utah), Navajo County (Arizona), and Coconino County (Arizona) for each fiscal year. There are about seventy-eight (78) Utah clients alone who are registered with the senior center program in Navajo Mountain, Utah. Approximately 51 elderly, high-risk clients with disability receive home delivered meals daily. Approximately fifty-six (56) clients from Arizona are served each day, resulting in a combined total of 134 clients from both Utah and Arizona.
 - b. Plan to Execute Project (provide good description on how this project will be completed and who will do the work). The Division of Facilities Construction and Management with the Utah Navajo Trust Fund Administrator provided a walk-through of building assessment of the Naatsis'Aan Senior Center in the summer of 2025. The Senior Center requires moderate improvements. The building has several deficiencies; this spring and summer, septic tank and grease trap overflows caused backups inside. The floor tiles began to come loose, so maintenance staff replaced them with available tiles. There were not enough floor tiles to cover the entire floor, so the chapter asked UNTF about buying ten additional boxes. To date, the floor tile replacement remains incomplete.
 - c. Status of Homesite Lease, Legal Survey, and Archeological Clearance. The Naatsis'Aan Chapter has requested for a legal tract from the Navajo Nation General Land Department on September 8, 2025. The Land Department will provide the legal tract at the earliest opportunity.
 - d. Homesite Lease map with location and distances of waterline/septic tankdrain field identified. The Senior Center's septic tank and grease trap are on the east side of the building, with the leech field 25-30 feet further east. The water line connects directly to the building from the chapter's local waterline extension, which may require upgrades soon.
 - e. Description of nearest waterline (source). The nearest waterline source is the main trunk line located at the chapter house premises and the other waterline source comes in from the old trading post water pump that is established by the Environmental Health Agency Indian Health Services.
 - f. Coordination with Indian Health Services Office of Environmental Health& Engineering, water Mgmt. Branch, NTUA. The Naatsis'Aan Chapter will need to

- meet with the Indian Health Center regards to waterline for the senior center. The Naatsis'Aan Senior Center has not been inspected lately but there may be some findings from previous inspections received.
- g. If joint project, identify other organizations and agencies involved with this project. The Naatsis'Aan Chapter is requesting the Utah Navajo Trust Fund and the Navajo Revitalization Fund Board to reinstate the funds specially allocated for the Naatsis'Aan Senior Center Program in amount of \$1000.00 each but a total of \$2000.00. The Naatsis'Aan Chapter amended a resolution # NMC-07-2025/169 on July 27, 2025. The requested funds are intended to cover the costs of cleaning out the septic tank and grease trap. The Senior Center is still dealing with problematic issues with the grease trap.

Navajo Utah Commission Navajo Mountain Chapter Senior Center Project Request - \$200,000

Project Description and Need

The Navajo Mountain Senior Center has been in existence for many years and is currently experiencing a growing list of deficiencies impacting services. The Navajo Mountain Chapter is often recognized as an isolated and remote community often requiring extensive travel to obtain basic services. The Navajo Mountain Chapter elderly population greatly appreciates the services and benefits of a senior citizen center within their community. The Navajo Mountain Senior Center provides a congregate meal program and home deliveries for house bound elderly citizens. The center also provides health and wellness programs, including health screenings. Most importantly, centers provides an opportunity for socialization and interaction with members of the community. The Navajo Mountain Chapter and the local senior center have identified significant deficiencies and a need to upgrade the current senior center facility. A high priority items include septic tank cleaning for the building, repair or replacement of plumbing apparatus, and improvement or replacement of exterior waterlines. The senior center is currently experiencing inoperable bathroom facilities that requires elderly citizens to walk to the chapter house to utilize restrooms. This is probably a health and sanitation violation and is a major challenge for elderly citizens in frail condition, including those who use wheelchairs on uneven terrain. The facility's HVAC system is also in need of replacement. The floor tiles are separating from the concrete floor and is becoming a safety hazard. The center's kitchen facility is in need of an upgrade, including attention for the grease trap to facilitate the separation of fats, oils, grease (FOG), and food solids from wastewater preventing clogs and pollution. The Navajo Mountain Chapter and the Navajo Mountain Senior Center requested the Utah Navajo Trust Fund and Utah DFCM to conduct a building assessment and cost estimate. The assessment performed by UNTF and Utah DFCM concluded a renovation would be \$1.3 million and a complete new facility would be \$3.9 million (attached). The Navajo Mountain Chapter understands both of these options are major cost challenges to accomplish but is a responsibility that needs to be addressed. The Navajo Mountain Chapter will be working with Navajo Nation Division of Aging and Long-Term Care Support (DALTCS), Utah Navajo Trust Fund, Utah NRF, and the Navajo Utah Commission to establish a collaborative effort, including allocation of matching funds.

Project Funding Request

The Navajo Utah Commission is seeking \$200,000 in FY2026 Non-Chapter NRF appropriations to initiate the Navajo Mountain Senior Center Renovation Project. The Navajo Utah Commission will work with Navajo Mountain Chapter, DALTCS, UNTF, and Utah NRF to seek funding necessary to complete the proposed project.



Overview

The Navajo Mountain Chapter. It is one of the 110 chapters of the Navajo Nation, situated along the central Arizona and Utah border in Navajo County, Coconino (Arizona), and San Juan County (Utah). Its main population center, Rainbow City, is about five miles from the chapter house and forty-two miles north of Arizona State Highway 98.

The region's geomorphology features a mix of deep canyons and high plateaus. Lake Powell is approximately ten miles north of the project area. Navajo Mountain, a dome formed by igneous rock intrusion, has elevations ranging from 5000 to 7500 feet, with the peak reaching 10,338 feet, composed of uplifted Dakota sandstone from the Cretaceous period.

The climate is significantly influenced by the mountain, with an average annual precipitation of twenty-eight inches and lake evaporation of fifty to sixty inches. Vegetation includes sagebrush and juniper at lower elevations, transitioning to ponderosa pine and aspen at higher elevations, characteristic of a high, semi-arid climate.

Chapter families sustain themselves through various means. Some practice traditional Navajo livestock raising and dry farming, while others work in off-reservation communities such as Phoenix, Flagstaff, and Page, Arizona, and others resort to Salt Lake City, St. George, and other parts of the states.

Goals

- 1. The current chapter officials and chapter administration is going forward to reactivate the Naatsis'Aan Chapter building facility renovation project. This project was initially committed to in 2018, but it was delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the resignation of the previous chapter administration. There have already been some payments made to contractors involved in the initial process. The new chapter officials and chapter administration is now eager to move forward with the renovation as the chapter is in dire need of these updates.
- 2. The Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter requested assistance with the renovation of the Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter building facility. Our goals for this renovation are to improve energy efficiency, enhance safety standards, reduce maintenance and repair costs, increase sufficient space, help improve overall operation, make the building more efficient, and address compliance issues and concerns.
- 3. The Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter House Renovation project in Navajo Mountain, Utah. The site is located approximately thirty (30) miles north of Shonto on Highway Navajo Route 16, half (.5) miles west of N-16 Route. The project involves the design renovation of a single-story, 3800 square foot chapter facility. The scope includes engineer/architectural and engineering services through schematic design, design development, construction documentation, and construction administration phases. This also encompasses water main infrastructure design, lead-based paint and asbestos testing/abatement, a 500-800 square foot command center addition, a topographic survey, engineering. geotechnical The design services should cover engineering/architectural, civil, structural, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical design.

- The A/E Firm is expected to provide a full set of construction documents and specifications, ensuring all ADA code compliance.
- 4. The goals and plan for the renovation of the chapter building facility. Our approach involves collaborating closely with the Navajo Nation Project Manager from the Capital Outlay Projects Management Department (CPMD). CPMD will provide guidance throughout the project, from initial planning and design to construction implementation.
- 5. The Navajo Utah Trust Fund, Navajo Revitalization Fund Board, and the Navajo Nation Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter have committed to setting aside funding for its implementation. The Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter may have already compensated for consultation received from the design and engineering for this particular project to begin development at the time when the chapter had an administration available to run with the project.

Specifications

- 1. To provide information regarding the Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter house renovation design project Request for Qualification (RFQ), which was issued in May 2019, along with Addendum #1 dated April 10, 2019, and Addendum #2 dated April 18, 2019. The program for the Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter project was determined through the programming phases/building assessment. The Nasbah Technologies Team met with stakeholders to gather data and other information through questions and interviews to develop this program. The programming phase needs are limited to the scope outlined in the RFQ and will focus on the renovation efforts.
- 2. Jones & DeMille Engineering was identified to retain as the consultant
- 3. The Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter building facility renovation project, which has been awaiting completion since 2019. The renovation project involves several key components, including: Preparing the roof. Modifying the floorplan layout to improve traffic flow and optimize usable spaces. Installing water-saving, energy-efficient, and economical technological components in the restroom and kitchen areas. Updating the electrical, plumbing, and HVAC systems. Building an addition for an emergency command center for community and entity use. Additionally, the chapter is undertaking a major overhaul to tap into the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) trunk water systems to supply potable water for public use, as low water pressure in the interior waterline has been a significant issue in past years.
- 4. The Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter cost estimate for the chapter renovation project prepared by the previous chapter administration established an estimate of \$242-\$275 per square foot, totaling \$849,925 during the preplanning phase. The current chapter administration understands that this cost is subject to change due to uncertainties in the project process. We have also identified earmarked chapter renovation funds along with match funding sources from other entities, including the Navajo Nation Chapter, Utah Navajo Trust Fund, Navajo Revitalization, and Navajo Nation Capital Project.

- 5. The project is located on the Navajo Nation in San Juan County, Utah. The land survey, archaeological clearance, environmental, and other clearance survey permits are all available. Additionally, the floorplan with measurements of the proposed chapter building facility, including rooms, has been completed by the Utah Navajo Trust Fund with the involvement of design and engineering.
- 6. The chapter building facility renovation project is located in the State of Utah (San Juan County, Utah) on the Navajo Nation. The status of the land survey, archeological clearance, environmental and other clearances survey permits are available. The floorplan with measurements of the proposed chapter building facility with rooms are measured. The Utah Navajo Trust Fund completed the floorplan with the involvement of the design and engineering.

Milestones

- 1. The Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter provides an update regarding the Naatsis'Aan (Navajo Mountain) Chapter renovation project, specifically concerning the architectural and engineering (AE) services. The previous Chapter administration initiated a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) through an advertisement. A mandatory site visit was conducted on April 9, 2019, with three firms expressing interest. Two of these firms submitted proposals by the due date. Proposal evaluations took place on May 1, 2019, and the two evaluators planned to interview the AE firms on May 15, 2019.
- 2. Additionally, two addendums have been made to the project:
 - A. April 10, 2019: The scope of work was expanded to include a possible interior and/or exterior addition for a +/- 500 to 800 square foot command center within the existing chapter house building facility. [Date of Second Addendum]:
 - B. The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) infrastructure for a three-phase power line extension was included. This covers the fee or cost, necessary clearances and right-of-way (ROW), and the design and construction of the three-phase electrical line, which will extend from the east of the main road to the existing chapter building facility.
 - C. The current chapter administration provides an update based on the previous chapter administration's chapter renovation information. The topographic survey and building assessment. On April 18, 2019, a topographic survey of a twenty (20') foot radius around the existing chapter facility was completed, including three (3) to five (5) borings to the east, north, and west ends of the building. There are no landscape requirements for this project. There are no as-built draft drawing records, and no study was previously initiated or conducted on the existing building for years. The building measures 67'-3" in length by 63'-3" in width, with approximately 4,221 square feet. Asbestos and lead testing on the entire chapter facility building, including both interior and exterior parts, has been completed.







I am writing to strongly recommend Christine Ann Yazzie for housing support. As the Co-Director of the DesignBuildUTAH program, I became acquainted with her through the Oljato community members.

For the past 20 years, as part of the architectural education program at the University of Utah, our program has provided housing for families facing various housing challenges. Our service area is within 40 miles of Bluff, Utah, due to considerations such as funding, scheduling, and ensuring sufficient communication time. To date we have collaborated with chapters in this area on over 20 housing projects.

Based on my understanding, Christine Ann Yazzie's situation falls within our service area, and her need for housing is very high. About a year ago, she lost her safe living situation, vehicle and income when she was abandoned by her partner along with her child. She owns a small, old trailer, but it is not habitable due to structural problems. She is currently living with other family members in a traditional hogan, which has no electricity or running water. In the winter, it is extremely cold due to drafts from the ceiling, making it an unsafe living environment for a mother and her children.

Furthermore, in the Navajo Nation, supporting women and children to become independent from men and rebuild their lives with dignity is a critical priority. Securing safe housing is, I believe, the first step in re-establishing that new life. Therefore, as Co-Director of the DesignBuildUTAH@Bluff program, I pledge our utmost effort to support this mission.

For these reasons, we respectfully request your understanding and cooperation in approving and supporting a project to provide housing for Christine Ann Yazzie, in collaboration with our DesignBuildUTAH@Bluff program.
