RESOLUTION NO. 25-055

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF CANVASSERS
OF THE CITY OF WEST JORDAN, APPROVING THE CANVASS OF
THE 2025 CITY OF WEST JORDAN MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION**

WHEREAS, the Board of Canvassers of City of West Jordan (“City” and the “Board” or “Board of Canvassers”), consisting of the City’s Mayor and its City Council, met on November 18, 2025, to canvass the returns of the City’s 2025 Municipal General Election held on November 4, 2025 (“General Election”); and

WHEREAS, as required by law, the Board must canvass the returns of the General Election to declare three (3) candidates elected to the three (3) City Council At-Large seats in said General Election; and

WHEREAS, the Salt Lake County Elections Representatives (“SLCE Representatives”) reviewed ballots cast on or before November 4, 2025 during the evening of the General Election; and

WHEREAS, the SLCE Representatives reviewed the timely received mail-in and absentee ballots to determine eligibility; and

WHEREAS, the SLCE Representatives verified the eligible mail-in and absentee ballots and accepted them; and

WHEREAS, the SLCE Representatives verified the eligible provisional ballots and accepted them; and

WHEREAS, the SLCE Representatives merged mail-in, absentee, and provisional ballots with the election night (November 4, 2025) results to produce final results; and

WHEREAS, the City Election Officer presented her report to the Board, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, which contains the final results for the General Election (“Final Results”, “Election Officer’s Certification Report”, or “Certification Report”); and

WHEREAS, the Board is satisfied with the accuracy of the Final Results presented.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Canvassers of City of West Jordan as follows:

Section 1. Certification. The Board certifies the votes as set forth in the Election Officer’s Certification Report for the General Election, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, as the final vote totals for the General Election. All members of the Board (“Board Members”) voting “Yes” to this Resolution shall independently sign the Certification Report attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 2. Declaration of Election. Pursuant to the certified results of the General Election, the Board declares each of the three (3) following candidates, listed in the order set forth on the ballot, to be elected to the office of At-Large City Council Member:

- Kayleen Whitelock
- Jessica Wignall
- Annette Harris

Section 3. Publication. The Board directs the City Election Officer to publish the Certification Report as required by Utah Code § 20A-4-304 and file a copy of the Certification Report with the Utah Lieutenant Governor’s Office, and to otherwise comply with all relevant laws, rules, and regulations.
