2	R277-216. Surrender of License with UPPAC Investigation Pending.
3	R277-216-1. Authority, [and] Purpose, and Oversight Category.
4	(1) This rule is authorized by:
5	(a) Utah Constitution Article X, Section 3, which vests general control and
6	supervision over public education in the Board;
7	(b) Section 53E-6-506, which directs the Board to adopt rules regarding UPPAC
8	duties and procedures; and
9	(c) Subsection 53E-3-401(4), which allows the Board to make rules to execute
0	the Board's duties and responsibilities under the Utah Constitution and state law.
11	(2) The purpose of this rule is to establish procedures for Board consideration of
12	an educator request to surrender a license in the face of a UPPAC investigation.
13	(3) The standards and procedures of the Utah Administrative Procedures Act do
14	not apply to this rule under the exemption of Subsection 63G-4-102(2)(d).
15	(4)(a) With regards to Section R277-216-2, this rule is categorized as Category 4
16	as described in Rule R277-111.
17	(b) With regards to Section R277-216-3, this rule is categorized as exempt as
18	described in Rule R277-111.
19	
20	R277-216-2. Petition to Surrender.
21	(1) An educator may surrender an educator license at any point prior to final
22	Board action on the recommendation from a UPPAC investigation.
23	(2) An educator who requests to surrender an educator license under
4	Subsection (1) shall submit a petition to UPPAC for submission to the Board, which

(a) a brief statement of the procedural history of the investigation leading up to

shall include:

the voluntary surrender;

20	(b) a statement that the educator is entitled to due process in OPPAC's
29	investigation and that the educator freely and voluntarily waives the educator's due
30	process rights, including:
31	(i) a right to a hearing;
32	(ii) a right to confront and cross examine witnesses;
33	(iii) a right to present witnesses;
34	(iv) a right to an impartial decision based upon evidence presented at the
35	hearing; and
36	(v) a right to subpoena witnesses; and
37	(c) a statement that the educator surrenders the educator's license freely and
38	voluntarily and without coercion or duress;
39	(d) a statement that the educator:
40	(i) is represented by counsel; or
41	(ii) understands the educator's right to be represented by counsel and knowingly
42	and voluntarily waives the assistance of counsel in UPPAC's investigation;
43	(e) a statement that the educator is fully aware of the implications of
44	surrendering the educator's license with an investigation pending, including:
45	(i) that the educator may not work, consult, or volunteer in any K-12 public
46	school in the state of Utah in any capacity;
47	(ii) that the educator is not eligible for a reinstatement hearing at any time;
48	(iii) that UPPAC [files] case file and case resolution are subject to public
49	disclosure in accordance with state and federal law;
50	(iv) that notification of the educator's license surrender will be shared with all
51	states through NASDTEC; and
52	(v) except as provided in Subsection (3), that notification of the educator's
53	license surrender will be:
54	(A) classified and reported as a voluntary surrender (UPPAC investigation); and
55	(B) shared with LEAs throughout the state.

56	(3) If an educator surrenders a license during an investigation of allegations
57	described in Subsection 53E-6-604(5)(b), the surrender will be:
58	(a) classified and reported as a revocation; and
59	(b) shared with LEAs through the state.
60	(4)(a) Voluntary surrender of a license as set forth in this section is permanent.
61	(b) An educator who surrenders a license as set forth in this section is not
62	eligible for a reinstatement hearing at any time.
63	
64	R277-216-3. Review of Petition to Surrender.
65	(1)(a) Upon receiving a petition as provided in Subsection R277-216-2(2), the
66	Executive Secretary shall review the request for surrender to determine if it meets the
67	requirements set forth in the rule.
68	(b) If the requirements of Subsection R277-216-2(2) are not met, the Executive
69	Secretary shall notify the educator that the request is insufficient and the reasons why
70	the request is insufficient.
71	(c) If the requirements of Subsection R277-216-2(2) are met, the Executive
72	Secretary shall notify the Board of the voluntary surrender and request direction on
73	whether to continue the investigation.
74	(2) Upon receipt of a voluntary surrender of an educator license, the Executive
75	Secretary shall:
76	(a) notify the educator:
77	(i) that the voluntary surrender was received;
78	(ii) whether the Board required UPPAC to continue the investigation;
79	(iii) that the voluntary surrender will be reported in the public record as a
80	voluntary surrender with pending UPPAC investigation except as provided in
81	Subsection R277-216-2(3);
82	(iv) that the voluntary surrender will be reported to NASDTEC and to LEAs

(v) that the educator's license cannot be reinstated at any time.

85	(b) update the educator's licensing file in CACTUS or USIMS to reflect the
86	disposition;
87	(c) report the disposition to NASDTEC;
88	(d) notify the educator's last employer of record;
89	(e) report the disposition to LEAs through the state; and
90	(f) provide the educator a copy of the report to LEAs described in Subsection
91	(2)(e).
92	
93	R277-216-4. Applicability of Rule.
94	This Rule R277-216 does not apply to an educator's voluntary surrender of the
95	educator's license if the educator is not under investigation by UPPAC.
