

trade secrets as defined in Utah Code Section [13-24-2](#) ("Trade secret" means information, including a formula, pattern, compilation, program, device, method, technique, or process, that: (a) derives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use; and (b) is the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy.)

commercial information or non-individual financial information obtained from a person if: (a) disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to result in unfair competitive injury to the person submitting the information or would impair the ability of the governmental entity to obtain necessary information in the future; [and] (b) the person submitting the information has a greater interest in prohibiting access than the public in obtaining access.

GRAMA Claim of Business Confidentiality

The following is a concise statement supporting the claim of business confidentiality related to Dancing Bees Apothecary, LLC's ("Applicant") submission for medical cannabis processing establishment application: The information contained on the Application contain nonpublic individual and business information that is protected as trade secret. Applicant derives independent economic value from its business location, ownership structure, and operational hours. Our competitors can derive economic value from this disclosure. Processing Establishment Property Information and other parts of the standard operating procedures contain non-public property and facility information that is protected as trade secret. Applicant derives independent economic value from our facility layout and facility blueprint. We have hired experts and expended considerable resources to design a state-of-the-art facility. Our competitors can derive economic value from such disclosure and competitive advantages from the disclosure of such information that is not publicly available. Applicant has taken efforts to maintain the secrecy of such information. Additionally, keeping Applicant's facility blueprint confidential is vital for ensuring a secure facility. Disclosure could compromise the safety of the facility, the contents, and the employees working within the facility. methods, transportation strategies, and the formulas patterns, compilations, programs, devices, methods, techniques, and processes associated with the operating plan. Descriptions and summaries are kept confidential and are only available to internal personnel that need to know the information. Any such disclosure may be used in a highly competitive application submissions by competitors not only in Utah but other jurisdictions. Applicant has hired experts and expended considerable resources to develop this operating plan and applicant has taken reasonably efforts to maintain the secrecy of such information. In addition, keeping Applicant's security information confidential is required for ensuring a secure facility. Disclosure could compromise the safety of the facility, the contents, and the employees working within the facility. Extraction SOPs constitute trade secret information. Applicant derives economic benefit from these statements. If disclosed, competitors could bypass the time and training expended and expertise necessary to detail trade secret and confidential information by copying these descriptions or processes. Applicant does not want them readily available to the public.
