Matters for Discussion

1. Wastewater Master Plan Presentation

Capital Improvement Plan Accreditation Manager, Corby Talbot, presented Kai Krieger from Hansen, Allen & Luce to present the Master Plan update for the City's Wastewater Collection System.

The key goals are to assess the existing system, determine maintenance and replacement requirements, forecast growth over the next 20 years, and plan for the projects necessary to support the forecasted growth.

The City's existing system includes point repairs, the liner areas, and the replacement areas.

The City's growth includes acknowledging the Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) areas and the anticipated number of equivalent residential connections (ERC) that will require.

The recommendations that came from the update include:

- a. Implement the capital facility plan
- b. Continue to clean system periodically
- c. Continue to video inspect system periodically
- d. Take actions to address inflow and infiltration

Council Member deWolfe asked what the immediate issues are, if any.

Mr. Krieger said that any immediate issues are already being handled by the current projects that are being paid for by the PID (Public Infrastructure District).

Council Member Mitchell asked if the replacement pipes are smaller or bigger than the current ones.

Mr. Krieger answered that typically the pipe sizes remain the same since they meet the minimum size requirements and will only be replaced by larger ones as dictated by any other requirement it may fall under.

Council Member deWolfe asked if there were any concerns over the projected growth in the next 10, 20, 30 years.

Mr. Krieger said that when they first looked at this four years ago they knew about the development that would be coming to the City's Downtown area and identified around 3-4 projects to relieve the issues like a new sewer pump station and rerouted some sewage that was previously coming from the East direction and into other pipelines that had additional capacity.


There were no further questions or comments from the Council Members.



4. Determine projects necessary to support growth




