

COMMISSION WORKSESSION

December 8, 2025

Minutes of a scheduled worksession of the Sevier County Commission held this eighth day of December 2025. Meeting commenced at 10:30 a.m. with Commissioners Scott Johnson, Greg Jensen, and Ralph Brown in the Conference Room, Room 116, of the Sevier County Administration Building, 250 North Main, Richfield, Utah. Clerk/Auditor Steven Wall, Executive Director Malcolm Nash, and Brodie Bagley from the Road Department were also present. There were also representatives from Utah Department of Transportation, Jones & DeMille Engineering, Redmond Minerals, Aurora Mayor Quarnberg, and Mayor Election Sprague.

Discussion followed concerning the intersection east of Aurora on Center Street where it connects to Highway 24. Concerns were expressed for safety in that area, accidents that have happened in that area with semi-trucks slowing down to enter Western Clay and surrounding businesses. The UDOT representative reviewed the cost of widening the road and putting in turn-lanes, and the traffic counts do not warrant additional safety factors at this time. Further discussion followed concerning adding more signage to warn traffic of the possibility of slower traffic in that area. The UDOT representative noted that they will draft some of the possibilities to help the traffic in that area, as well as funding for the proposed actions. The Commission thanked them for the information.

The Commission then discussed the activities with the Aurora to Salina bike path. It was noted that it would most likely be late in 2026 before the funding for the project was in place, and the right-of-ways are in place and completed.

There being no further business to come before the Board, meeting adjourned at 12:14 p.m.
