**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Council approves the 2014 Water Conservation Plan Update.

**BACKGROUND:**

In conjunction with the Water Conservation Plan Act, Eagle Mountain City is required to implement a Water Conservation & Management Plan. This plan is required to be updated every five years, and Eagle Mountain last updated its plan in 2009 and it was adopted in 2010.

This update does not modify any existing City policy as it relates to water conservation. Updates to the existing Water Conservation Plan pursuant to current water usage within the City have been made to this document.

The overall goal of the legislation requiring this plan is to reduce overall water usage in the state of Utah. The average water usage over the Rocky Mountain State Region is 245 gpcd (gallons per capita per day). However, in 2004, when this legislation was passed, Utah's average water usage was 321 gpcd. The overall goal was to reduce the regional average to 240 by the year 2050. Eagle Mountain City's average annual water usage has consistently been well below this number and is currently 186 gpcd.
