1. Welcome & Business
Chairman Larry Skinner welcomed and called the meeting to order.
2. Public Comment
Chairman Skinner offered members of the public an opportunity to make comments. No public comment was offered.
3. Minutes

4. Case Updates

Ms. Beck discussed and highlighted new cases that are underway including: A letter that was written by the Governor, Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate to the Office of Energy Development asking to work out an agreement with Rocky Mountain Power to pursue the governor's initiative on Operation Gigawatt. She also gave a brief update on other cases being monitored including the PacifiCorp MSP, Enbridge Gas Utah General Rate Case, and the Community Renewable Energy Program.

5. Briefing: Enbridge Gas Utah General Rate Case

Ms. Beck gave an overview of the EGU General Rate Case settlement on Phase I (revenue requirement) and positions in depth, she also discussed Phase II Cost of Service, and Rate Design recommendations.

6. Briefing and Discussion: Community Renewable Energy Program

Ms. Beck gave a brief history on the Community Renewable Energy Program and discussed the core principles, elements agreed upon and in dispute. She discussed OCS initial position, primary policy concerns and answered questions from the committee members.

8. Other Business & Adjourn

Ms. Beck suggested that the next meeting be scheduled for January 2026. A Doodle Poll will be sent out to the committee members to determine the exact date.
