Public Works

Weber Fire

- The next board meeting will swear in new members and conduct mandatory state training.
- A significant agenda item could be the TIF project out in Farr West. Chief Clark believes it is still a good investment for the district even though a lot of other partners have pulled out.

Building Inspector

- There was a question about a building permit for a home in a subdivision that has CC&Rs in place. The discussion highlighted a concern about ensuring that new construction complies with established standards and whose responsibility it was to ensure that CC&Rs were obeyed. The building inspector was not in attendance but will be forwarded the information.

Administration

- Mayor Cutler expressed his gratitude for the support received over the past years and voiced hope that this support will continue for the new administration.
- City Recorder confirmed that progress is being made on the audit and everything they have asked for has been submitted. Hopefully, this should be completed soon.
