Misc. Road Treatments

(Chip seal, AP4, slurry, striping, etc.)

- Selected based on current road conditions
- Generally performed 5 years after a mill & overlay or paving project.

Storm Drain Projects

- **Pipe Open Ditch (County Shops to Mountain Road)** – Install new storm drainpipe for safer, controlled flow
- **Hidden Valley Storm Drain Relocation** – Move line from backyards into roadway corridor
- **Concrete Sediment Basin at Dump Yard** – Improve containment of soiled materials and prevent runoff

- **Pavilion Replacement & New Locations** – Remove old structures and install upgraded pavilions
- **Ellison Farms Playground Replacement** – Replace outdated equipment, upgrade safety surfacing
