- Will use for an ML aide that will help ML students as well as helping with skill-based instruction during WIN time.

- Mostly a wash, just getting school boundaries aligned with city boundaries.
- PCSD will get 4 parcels from Nebo and they will get 1 parcel – with geographical size and populations of homes and businesses, the change is mostly a wash.

B.7. Possible Boundary Adjustment Timeline Discussion (*Audio Timestamp 00:08:51*)

Summary:

- Timeline for possible boundary changes discussed

- These two items were recommendations that transportation suggested, there is no significant issue but these changes would better align bus routes. The board asked transportation to identify problem areas when reviewing the boundary study, these were two suggestions that would help with efficiency.

1. Westridge and Rock Canyon, currently the boundary splits a street so that a few houses go to different high school and elementary schools than kids on the other side of the street. The recommendation is to move them so that all go to Westridge and PHS

2. Edgemont and Rock Canyon, suggestion to move 30 some students to Rock Canyon, population might change might impact demographics at both schools, could impact Blue Ribbon School eligibility for Edgemont, and also might be better fit for students

- The board wants to gather more information from parents and the community on both changes, but particularly on the second change involving Rock Canyon and Edgemont.
- The vote tonight will be whether or not to start the process, it isn't a vote to change anything.
- Assurance that the board should and will work to do what is best for students, not just for Blue Ribbon eligibility.

- Most popular calendar is Calendar C, which has an earlier start, a full fall and Christmas break, and ends before Memorial Day.

- Teachers concerned about even length of terms, that can be adjusted later (leave out terms on future calendar surveys suggested to avoid confusion).

- Suggestion to try shortening breaks to lengthen summer break during a year when school will start earlier in August, just to see if people actually prefer that.

- Still just discussing, gathering data, no decisions are being made at this time, no programs are ending.

- 3rd grade is the year students usually drop DLI

- Students with disabilities in DLI also decrease that year (not sure if this correlates, speech IEPs phase out, other factors could influence this 3rd grade change)

- Jamie Leite, Principal at Lakeview, spoke regarding multi-lingual students DLI programs, parents often want children to learn even more languages when they already are comfortable with more than one

- Timpanogos doesn't follow the state model, has interesting differences in data
- High school test rates, bridge courses, have high completion rate
- Jamie Leite, Principal at Lakeview, adds kids at multiple entry points (all grades), State doesn't recommend this, but it has helped Lakeview with attrition
- Lakeview Elementary emphasizes that DLI is not a gifted program, the only requirement is long term commitment to language learning - working to help teachers, students and parents know that all students can learn language.
- Research shows that it doesn't help students improve in other subjects when removed from DLI programs.
- Big schools (100 students in a class level and about 25 kids per class) are much more equipped, do better with DLI.
- Specials at Lakeview are mixed, not separated by DLI/non-DLI, all teachers participate in PLCs, help every student.
- Concerns expressed regarding availability of language classes at secondary schools for non DLI students. It can be harder to have multiple robust language programs in secondary along with DLI, but there are other factors, such as: schedule availability, and certified teacher availability.

Jamie Leite, Principal at Lakeview Elementary; Sara Parrish, DLI Curriculum Specialist; and Darrell Jensen, Assistant Superintendent Secondary Education contributed to this conversation

Next steps: Send out survey to all parents; Parent Advisory Council, Community Connections Council discussions; try to find ways to support DLI in a more effective way; after survey, small focus groups to find solutions
