### **Approval of Minutes:**

- Afu made a motion to approve the October Golf Advisory Board Meeting. Carol seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as written.

### **Financial Report:**

- Dawn handed out this month's financial report.
- YTD fiscal year report- on far right 2 columns is where you will find Year to Date and previous year info.
- Pink highlighted number is the current year to date number
- Approx. \$200k ahead of last year
- \$63k in revenue so far, highest is \$79k
- Fiscal Year ends in June, auditors come around October to adjust. Dawn then must adjust numbers based on discrepancies found.
- Additional City funds are in Misc line in October 2025 report
- Last year PTIF account generated \$90k in interest- goes into reserves.

### **Driving Range Site Plan:**

- Board reviewed latest version of the proposed plan

### **No.1 Cart Path Update:**

- All done- looks beautiful

### **Cart Lease Expiration:**

- Current lease expires in April
- EZgo Cart has not been as aggressive this year
- Yamaha cart was a great cart negatives are that gas cart is better, seat is lower, console is not ideal. Has several different colors available.
- Current lease has 60 carts. Would like to increase to 66 or 72.
- Lowest quote so far is Club Car includes Geofencing and snack bar integration. Has great features that can help track golfers and carts for efficient business.
- Will help with vandalism/damage. Tag marshal comes with 2 extra tablets.
- Jeff prefers Club Car for pricing and quality

- Yamaha has longest battery life. 115amp. The others have 95amp
- Every cart should have the ability to go 54 holes. Or 16 ½ hours in the summertime
- Would prefer lithium battery on carts over lead acid.
- Geofencing would also allow the carts to go a lower speed limit in the parking lot and prevent them from crossing the road.
- Major price difference between battery types.

#### **Discussion of Current Fees:**

- Jeff handed out proposed fees for 2026
- Season pass and punch passes on the list for this round
- Course is always busy- board members agree increases shouldn't affect golf play.
- Youth on course program generated approximately \$30k this year.

**\*\*Action Item:** Konrad Lee made a motion to approve the proposed increases. Dan Johnson has seconded the motion. The proposed increases will be reviewed by Russ to take to the Mayor, and then to Council.

#### **Women's Association Report:**

- Nothing to report.
- Funds leftover more than expected.

#### **Men's Association Report:**

- Had a great year this year. Has some funds leftover.
- Has invited 3 more members to join the committee. Will create a rotating committee.
- Thank you to Randy for all his hard work on keeping the course looking beautiful.
- Thank you to Jeff and his staff in the pro shop for all their assistance with the association.
- Konrad also commented that the staff is amazing

#### **Golf Superintendent Report:**

- Course has been winterized
- Fungicides and sealants on the greens
- Had a good crew this fall, more than usual- will work on cart path and trimmed on #1.
- Upgraded 2 new mowers for next year with 80% life in them. (Toro) Typically \$95k mowers got them for \$40k Same with the sprayer.
- Justin has been awarded The Youth player development award at the 2025 Utah Section PGA Award Winners.

- LRGC has the best Jr Golf program in the state.
- Youth on Course, PGA Junior League
- Justin has been awarded
