

Minutes of the special meeting of the Ogden City Board of Canvass held on Tuesday, November 18, 2025, at 5:50 p.m., in the Council Chambers, and via electronic meeting, on the third floor of the Municipal Building, 2549 Washington Boulevard, Ogden City, Weber County, Utah.

At the request of the Chair, all present stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance led by Vice Chair Hyer.

A moment of silence was observed.

Acknowledgements: Board member Myers noted he moved his gym membership from EOS to Marshall White Center recently and has been very impressed with the quality of the facility.

Board member Choberka highlighted her attendance at the recent Mayor's Award Ceremony and commented on the quality of the event. She congratulated everyone who received an award.

Board member Graf commented on his attendance at a recent funeral and memorial service for a firefighter who lost his life to cancer; he was touched by the gathering of respect and honor of many local public safety officials in the community. The funeral procession drove through Ogden City on Intersate-15, and the Fire Department had stationed three engines and a ladder truck and approximately 30 Ogden City firefighters stood on the 36th Street bridge as the procession drove under it. He was impressed by the gathering of so many to honor the life of one of their own; it had an immense impact on him, and he thanked the Ogden City Fire Department for their participation.

Consideration of certifying the November 4, 2025, Municipal General Election Results

A memo from the City Recorder came before the Council to consider certifying the November 4, 2025, Municipal General Election results. The memo stated Section 20A, Chapter 4 of the Utah State Code sets forth the election review process, designates the legislative body – the City Council – and the Mayor as the Board of Canvassers and outlines the Board's duties for municipal elections. The City Recorder acts as the election official. The Board of Canvassers is responsible for certifying the official election results of municipal elections. Canvassing of returns for a General Election must occur no sooner than seven (7) days after the election and no later than fourteen (14) days after the election. After reviewing the returns, the Board must certify the results of the election and file a report that includes the following information:

1. The total number of votes cast in the Board's jurisdiction;
2. The names of each candidate whose name appeared on the ballot;
3. The title of each ballot proposition that appeared on the ballot;
4. Each office that appears on the ballot;

5. From each voting precinct:
 - a. The number of votes for each candidate;
 - b. The number of votes for and against each ballot proposition;
6. The total number of votes given in the Board's jurisdiction to each candidate;
7. The number of ballots that were rejected; and
8. A statement certifying that the information contained in the report is accurate.

City Recorder Hansen summarized the memo and used the aid of a PowerPoint presentation to provide the following General Election statistics:

- 33,000 active voters in Ogden across 41 precincts
- 11,502 ballots counted citywide (34.55% turnout)
- 34,000 ballots sent (including replacements and those for walk-in voters)
- 1,158 ballots returned as undeliverable
- 50 provisional ballots cast (44 counted, 6 not counted)
- 556 people voted in person county-wide

Ms. Hansen then reviewed the report of unofficial election results dated November 12, 2025. She summarized the election results for the races listed on the ballot as follows:

- Ogden City Council Seat 1:
 - Jase Reyneveld – 735
 - Flor Lopez – 1,106
- Ogden city Council Seat 3:
 - Ken R. Richey – 1,794
 - Heath Satow – 1,645
- Ogden City Council At-Large Seat A:
 - Alicia Washington – 6,495
 - Marcia White – 4,929
- Ogden City Council At-Large Seat B:
 - Bart E. Blair – 4,541
 - Kevin Lundell – 6,872

Ms. Hansen noted Flor Lopez, Ken Richey, Alicia Washington, and Kevin Lundell have been duly elected to the Ogden City Council. She summarized the report detailing the reasons that ballots were not counted. She concluded by requesting that the Council certify the election results and mentioned that signatures from Council members would be required before submission of the Canvass Report to the Lieutenant Governor's office. Chair White inquired as to election audits that are conducted by Weber County. Ms. Hansen explained multiple audits were conducted before and after the election to ensure accuracy; she described pre-election audits where ballots with known outcomes were run through machines to verify counts, and post-election audits where the State selects specific ballots to verify they were recorded correctly.

BOARD MEMBER RICHEY MOVED TO CERTIFY THE RESULTS OF THE NOVEMBER 4, 2025, MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY VICE CHAIR HYER, ALL VOTING AYE.
