1:40	4. Office of Child Care Updates	Heather Thomas	<p>Preschool Development Grant notice of award received for a systems building grant for one year. Notice of Funding Opportunity received with 11 days notice, good preparation and teamwork and support of executive leadership. Application was submitted, waited until December 30, last day for award, received Notice of Award. About \$7 million in federal funds. Mandi will discuss more later. Working on getting all contracts in place.</p> <p>Utah legislative session, request for 5% budget cuts to all State Departments. DHHS has been carefully going through expenditures to think about where it would hurt the least to lose this funding. All public record and is on legislative website.</p> <p>Governor's budget was released, recommendations to legislature by governor. Funding details on slide. Home Visiting pilot project extended internally. Rural Health Transformation Grant must be approved by legislature to be spent, follow the website for more information.</p> <p>Continuing resolution ends January 30th, hoping that there will not be another shutdown.</p> <p>Bring HB88 to attention about proof of citizenship for anyone receiving social services.</p> <p>New notice of rulemaking accepting public comment through February 4. 4 state requirements will no longer be required, but states are able to still do them: capping co-pays at 7%, paying subsidy services</p>

			<p>prospectively, paying subsidy by enrollment, all already practiced in Utah.</p> <p>CCDF Discretionary Funding in grant year 2025 new data went into the formula which reduced the grant by about 21.75 million dollars from previous year. 14-15% of CCDF grant. Funding will remain at same lower level for grant year 2026 if it remains level funded with continuing resolution. Talking with contractors and partners to see how they could reduce budgets. Discussing potential reductions, and will propose to advisory committee in March.</p> <p>Update to Child Care Quality System: notifying providers of change to rating system, able to apply in March to receive a rating. In July those ratings will be effective. More points for Ages and Stages Questionnaire and participation in Online system among other updates.</p>

Utah State Board of Education Updates	Teresa Judd	<p>All 30 conference sessions for 2025 Utah Preschool Conference are now available on the YouTube channel.</p> <p>Every Day Counts campaign to promote daily school attendance. Anyone is welcome to become an attendance ambassador. Resources are available.</p> <p>21st Century Community Learning Center Grants available for preschool and school-aged afterschool programs Request for Application will open in February. Nutrition program events on slide.</p>

	6. PDG Updates	Mandi Mendenhall	Former grant 3 years ending December 30, 2025. 3 month no-cost extension for care coordination. That will also continue under the new 1 year grant. New work will include Pyramid Model, Sparkler app, and the Early Childhood Utah website, which had a recent facelift. Adding 4 new health departments to care coordination and new partnerships with preschool experiential learning.

Welcome new members Juone Kadiri and Crystal Knippers. Vacancies: Medical provider, family engagement representative has retired, but we have an application and are accepting new applications. Parent representative: unable to provide stipends for a voting members of the advisory council either for their work in the council or the subcommittee. Due to this, parents who had participated in the past will no longer be participating in the advisory council. Will seek change to statute. Requirements for parent representative: parent with child under the age of 8, preferred someone who has had experience with some of the early childhood programming, someone who is willing to make the commitment.
