

1 **R277. Education, Administration.**

2 **R277-929. State Council on Military Children.**

3 **R277-929-1. Authority^[,] and Purpose^[,] ~~and Oversight Category~~^[.].**

4 (1) This rule is authorized by:

5 (a) Utah Constitution Article X, Section 3, which vests general control and
6 supervision over public education in the Board;

7 (b) Subsection 53E-3-401(4), which allows the Board to make rules to execute
8 the Board's duties and responsibilities under the Utah Constitution and state law; and

9 (c) Section 53E-3-920.1, which requires the Board to create a state council in
10 accordance with the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military
11 Children.

12 (2) The purpose of this rule is to:

13 (a) establish a state council for military children; and

14 (b) establish a purple star schools designation for Utah schools meeting
15 eligibility criteria.

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19 **R277-929-2. Definitions.**

20 (1) "Commissioner" means the compact commissioner appointed by the
21 Governor in accordance with Section 53E-3-921.

22 (2) "Compact" means Title 53E, Chapter 3, Part 9, Interstate Compact on
23 Educational Opportunity for Military Children.

24 (3) "Designated staff point of contact" means a counselor, administrator,
25 teacher, or other staff member who is familiar with the needs of military students and
26 the protections afforded to service members' children under the compact.

27 (4) "State council" means the State Council for Military Children created through
28 this rule.

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30 **R277-929-3. Establishment of State Council.**

31 (1) There is hereby created the State Council for Military Children.

32 (2) The state council shall:

33 (a) coordinate implementation of the compact among:

34 (i) state agencies;

35 (ii) LEAs; and

36 (iii) military installations;

37 (b) safeguard the interests of military impacted students within the state;

38 (c) make recommendations for laws and policies to benefit military impacted
39 students; and

40 (d) promote awareness of compact rights and protections with military families.

41 (3)(a) The Superintendent shall invite the individuals identified in Subsection
42 53E-3-909(1) to participate in the state council.

43 (b) The Superintendent may invite other individuals with interest or expertise in
44 working with military students to participate in the state council.

45 (4) The Superintendent shall coordinate with the Commissioner to schedule
46 meetings of the state council.

47 (5) The state council shall meet on an annual basis or with such other frequency
48 as may be required by compact rules.

49 (6) The Commissioner shall be responsible for filing all required reports with the
50 national compact office.

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52 **R277-929-4. Purple Star Schools.**

53 (1) There is hereby created a purple star schools designation for Utah schools
54 that excel in protecting the educational needs of students from military families.

55 (2) The Commissioner shall establish an application process for Utah schools
56 interested in the purple star schools designation.

57 (3) The Commissioner shall review purple star school applications with the state
58 council created in Section R277-929-3 and make recommendations for the purple star
59 school designation.

60 (4) The Superintendent shall award the purple star school designation to a Utah
61 school that:

62 (a) has a designated staff point of contact for military students and families who
63 acts as the primary link between a military family and the school;

64 (b) has a dedicated page on its school website featuring information and
65 resources for military families;

66 (c) has a student-led transition program to include a student transition team
67 coordinator;

68 (d) provides annual professional development for additional staff on special
69 considerations for military students and families; and

70 (e) meets at least one of the following criteria:

71 (i) the school shall commit to hold a school-wide military recognition event;

72 (ii) the school's governing board shall pass a resolution publicizing support for
73 military students and families; or

74 (iii) the school shall coordinate with the school liaison program from Hill Air
75 Force Base or Dugway Proving Grounds to provide opportunities for active duty parents
76 to volunteer in the school.

77 (5)(a) The Superintendent shall approve a seal for schools with a purple star
78 school designation.

79 (b) A purple star school may use the approved seal on school letterhead, the
80 school's website, and other school publications.

81 (6) The Superintendent shall publish a list of schools receiving the purple star
82 designation on the Board's website.

83 (7) A purple star school recognized under this section shall submit an annual
84 report on a form provided by the Superintendent by March 31 ~~annually~~.

85 (8) The Superintendent may rescind a school's purple star school designation if:

- 86 (a) the school fails to file an annual report under Subsection (7); or
- 87 (b) the school is out of compliance with a requirement in Subsection (4).
