H.B. 152	Educational Vaccine Exemption Amendments	Trevor Lee	This bill amends provisions regarding a vaccination exemption form for required immunizations in the public education system.	This bill: repeals a requirement to complete an online education module to access a vaccination exemption form; requires the Department of Health and Human Services to: provide an online vaccination exemption form; and ensure the transmission of a completed online vaccination exemption form to the relevant school or LEA; and makes technical changes.

H.B. 179	Milk Amendments	Kristen Chevrier	This bill addresses the regulation of milk or milk products.	This bill: removes the requirement to obtain a permit for raw milk or raw milk products; modifies an exemption from certain dairy regulations; defines terms; requires notification to the Department of Agriculture and Food; outlines general requirements related to raw milk or raw milk products; addresses prohibited counts and drug residue in raw milk; prescribes labeling; addresses foodborne illness outbreaks and related cease and desist orders; provides for testing and inspections; imposes penalties; allows for sales on premises; provides for no severability; and makes technical and conforming changes.
H.B. 265	Non-nicotine Inhalation Product Amendments	Jason E. Thompson	This bill addresses non-nicotine inhalation products.	This bill: requires a non-nicotine inhalation product and a non-nicotine inhalation substance to be registered; establishes civil penalties for selling an unregistered non-nicotine inhalation product or non-nicotine inhalation substance; creates the criminal offense of illegal distribution of a cannabinoid inhalation product; clarifies that a cannabinoid product does not include an electronic cigarette; and defines terms.

H.B. 283	Raw Milk Amendments	Mike L. Kohler	This bill addresses the regulation of raw milk.	This bill: defines terms; requires registration; provides for general operational requirements; addresses signage, labeling, and marketing material; imposes requirements specific to markets; addresses foodborne illness outbreaks; addresses testing and inspections; provides for enforcement and penalties; and makes technical and conforming changes.
H.B. 379	Child Care Provider Food Preparation Amendments	Tracy Miller	This bill amends provisions related to food safety and sanitation for child care providers.	This bill: exempts licensed child care providers from food service establishment regulations; authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to make rules for licensed child care providers for food safety and sanitation; defines terms; and makes technical and conforming changes.

H.B. 385	Nicotine Sales Amendments	Jennifer Dailey-Provost	This bill amends provisions related to products containing nicotine.	<p>This bill:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>defines terms;</li> <li>creates a license for retail tobacco specialty businesses administered by the Department of Agriculture and Food (department);</li> <li>requires retail tobacco specialty businesses to provide a list of consumable products offered for sale to the department;</li> <li>requires applicants for a retail tobacco specialty business license to provide ownership information;</li> <li>prohibits issuing a license if certain individuals involved in the retail tobacco specialty business have violated certain criminal laws;</li> <li>prohibits advertising of electronic cigarette products and nicotine products in certain locations;</li> <li>creates fees and penalties related to the license; and</li> <li>criminalizes the criminally negligent sale of tobacco, electronic cigarettes, and nicotine to minors.</li> </ul>
H.B. 388	Public Health Hazard Amendments	Lisa Shepherd	This bill amends provisions related to public health hazards.	<p>This bill:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>amends provisions related to when law enforcement must inform a local health department of a potentially contaminated property;</li> <li>requires a local health department to determine if a property is contaminated after receiving a report from law enforcement under certain circumstances; and</li> <li>makes technical and conforming changes.</li> </ul>

H.B. 399	Primary and Secondary Education Amendments	Trevor Lee	This bill defines character education and creates restraints on a local education agency regarding the use of character education.	This bill: defines terms; repeals certain requirements related to: civics education; and character education; prohibits certain local education agency personnel from providing character education to a student in most instances; provides that this bill does not affect certain individual rights; requires the state auditor to: receive certain reports; conduct certain investigations; and enforce the provisions of the section; creates a private right of action; prohibits the State Board of Education from creating certain rules related to character education; and makes technical and conforming changes.
S.B. 210	Nicotine Amendments	Jen Plumb	This bill amends provisions related to products that contain nicotine.	This bill: repeals provisions related to local health department inspections of electronic cigarette retailers; amends provisions related to fees to be collected by the State Tax Commission for the sale of tobacco products, nicotine products, and electronic cigarette products; directs that certain fee money be used to dispose of confiscated electronic cigarette products and additional enforcement; amends provisions related to fines and license suspensions for selling products not listed on the electronic cigarette product registry; and amends criminal penalties for crimes related to products that contain nicotine.

S.B. 217	Local Food Amendments	Kirk A. Cullimore	This bill addresses provisions related to locally-produced foods.	<p>This bill:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>defines and modifies terms;</li><li>provides that raw milk and a raw milk product are a homemade food product under Title 4, Chapter 5a, Home Consumption and Homemade Food Act;</li><li>removes a signage requirement for a direct-to-sale farmers market;</li><li>clarifies when a producer or producer's designated representative may sell a homemade food product at a direct-to-sale location;</li><li>provides that a producer retains ownership of a homemade food product distributed, sold, delivered, held, stored, or offered for sale by a designated representative unless otherwise agreed upon by the producer and designated representative;</li><li>exempts a homemade food product sold at a direct-to-sale farmers market or direct-to-sale location from state sales tax;</li><li>repeals provisions related to the regulation of raw milk by the Department of Agriculture and Food; and</li><li>makes technical and conforming changes.</li></ul>
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
