24	R15	Research supported social health instruction	\$1,300,000			Continues funding for the We Are Friends and We Are Winners social health programs to support social skill development for students in grades K-6 (Sen. Fillmore).
25	R36	Special Needs Educational Assemblies		\$20,000		Interactive school assemblies that promote empathy, inclusion, and disability awareness for elementary students statewide (Rep. Cutler).
26	R19	Science of Learning Family Literacy Packs		\$1,500,000		Provides intensive K-2 literacy interventions for students in federally designated CSI and TSI schools to improve early reading outcomes (Rep. Welton).
27	R9	Comprehensive School Improvement Pilot		\$3,000,000		For USBE to administer a pilot grant to a single LEA to implement a comprehensive school improvement program for chronically underperforming schools (Sen. Fillmore).
28	R8	Local Food for Schools		\$2,000,000		Funds a formerly federally supported program through USBE to create reliable markets for local producers while improving student access to fresh, healthy, and culturally appropriate food (Sen. Cullimore).
29	R22	Education & Leadership Matching Grants		\$1,000,000		Supports education and school leadership programs in economically distressed communities through a fully matched, evidence-based grant focused on improving school climate and student engagement (Rep. Whyte).
