Regular Meeting  
Rockville Town Hall  
January 14, 2026 – 6:00 pm**

1. **CALL TO ORDER-ROLL CALL:** Mayor Leach called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The following Town Council members were present: Andy Efstratis, Robin Smith, Megan Honer-Orton, Jeff Ballard and Mayor Pam Leach. Clerk Cox was recording the meeting.
2. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Mayor Leach led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. **APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA:** Jeff Ballard **MOVED** to approve the agenda. Robin Smith **SECONDED** the motion.

4. **DECLARATION OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST WITH AN AGENDA ITEM.** No conflicts were declared.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Mayor Leach asked if there were any public comments. None were made.

**DISCUSSION/INFORMATION/NON-ACTION ITEMS**

5. **REPORT ON HURRICANE VALLEY FIRE SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT – CHIEF TYLER AMES** Chief Ames reported last month there were seven (7) incidents in Springdale, three (3) in Rockville and two (2) in Zion National Park that the Fire Crew/ambulance Crew responded to. He said overall, last year the Fire District ended the year with just a little over 6,300 calls total for the whole district, which is about 7% to 8% call volume increase from last year. A little bit less than typical, which is usually 10 to 12%. He said in 2024 there was even a bigger jump, as it was a 25% increase in the call volume. He said roughly 70% of all calls the teams responded to within the District are from local residents living in the District, leaving 30% of our patients from outside of the District. He said obviously this area was a little bit different. He said in this area 70% of our patients were from outside the district.

Chief Ames reported that the Fire District is still working on the architectural design for the new station going in at Sand Hollow. They are trying to break ground in April. This new station will also hold the Administrative Offices currently at the Main Station at 202 East Main.

Chief Ames said currently the crews do all the inter-facility transfers from the Hurricane Emergency Room to the IHC hospital in St. George. But sometimes they extend transfers to Provo, Las Vegas or different places, but as he has said before, there will be two more options becoming available soon. One will be a standalone ER (Emergency Room) and the another is a hospital coming in.

Chief Ames reported with the EMS (Emergency Medical Services) 10 individuals have started in the critical care paramedic program. The District is trying to get that program up and going. This would allow a little bit more critical stuff as far as pumps and ventilators and medications. The intent is to make sure they have enough critical care paramedics that we'll be able to handle the more intense needs.

Chief Ames said right now, West Valley City Fire Department is doing a trial run with whole blood which allows ambulances to carry whole blood within the ambulance. They are the first ones in the State to conduct this trial run with the Utah Bureau of EMS. They are figuring out how it works and other possible issues. This trial will be going until the end of February. The goal is hopefully to start carrying whole blood on the District's ambulance next. There

are a lot of calls dealing with blood loss, hemorrhagic shock, trauma, stuff like that. It would really help out in this District area. He said this would be a big deal in our world to start carrying whole blood.

Mayor Leach asked if Chief Ames had any idea about a timeline for the new hospitals? Chief Ames said in speaking with John Postert, the Fire Marshal, the site plan for the standalone ER, it's called Exceptional Healthcare, and they're out by exit 16 off the freeway and by Fire Station #46 was submitted. The plan is to break ground this month or next month. Chief Ames said the Zion Medical Center, the bigger hospital, is still working through the permitting process. The Fire Marshal has the site plan but since both of those are hospitals, the construction plans actually go through the State Fire Marshal's Office. He said the larger facility is located across the road from Hurricane Walmart to the South.

Chief Ames said he had been contacted by the Town of Rockville requesting help later this Spring to burn the weeds at the Cemetery. He has contacted Captain Hirschfeld to reach out to the Town to coordinate this project. Captain Hirschfeld is over the wildland crew, and they are the personnel that do that kind of project. He said Chief Harmon may also be involved with that.

6. **REPORT ON WILDLAND URBAN FIRE-DAVID HARMON:** Mayor Leach asked Chief David Harmon to explain to the Town Council a little more about this program. Chief Harmon introduced himself to the Council. He has recently been hired by the Fire District to oversee House Bill #48 regarding Wildland Urban Interface (WUI). He said he wanted to update the Council on HB #48 addressing the Wildland Urban Interface (WUI). This bill went into effect January 1 of this year (2026) and is dealing with all the high-risk Wildland Urban Interface (WUI). The map the State has produced is live on the website. He said he is willing to educate the Council on the map at a later date. He said the polygons shown on that map are what have been deemed as the high-risk areas. Those living in those areas will be assessed a fee in the future to help cover associated costs. Starting in 2026 and 2027, based on the square footage of the structure, is how they will be assessed a fee. In 2028, the State is working on a training, but right now that has not been solidified where residents can get the training, like himself and his staff and other Fire Department personnel or whomever it may be, to get the training to then be able to go do the assessments for these homes for the 2028 year and moving forward. At the current time the homeowner does have to request the assessment via the website through the Forestry Fire and State Lands website to have their property reviewed. There's a link on the website where you can request that assessment. However, at this time it will just be queued up. He said there is a long list of names requesting this assessment but until personnel get the training and can actually go out to the homes and do the assessments it may take a while. The question was asked how much of Rockville is affected? Chief Harmon said he had just pulled up the map, and it appears there is not a whole lot. There are some areas on the South side. Some of the areas listed are not actually in the municipality. He said he had reviewed the municipality boundary and was able to determine that maybe 60% of the high-risk area is outside the Town into the unincorporated area.

Chief Harmon said he would be happy to work with the Town and educate the Council or do whatever he could to help out. If this information is presented to the Council it could then be passed on to the residents. Andy Efstratis asked about the 60% high risk. Chief Harmon said on the map it shows some red polygons indicating a high-risk fire area, but those polygons are outside of the municipal boundary. Andy Efstratis asked if this red polygon would indicate some quality based information, like the height of the mountain or is it just the amount of brush? Chief Harmon said there are three factors in determining what is considered Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) high risk. There's the structure density, there's the fire likelihood, and there's the ember load that may be produced from that fire. He said the State sorts all of the geospatial data and satellite imagery is how they built this map. But to be a high-risk WUI, there have to be multiple structures within a range from zero to 250 meters to be deemed high risk. Mayor Leach thanked Chief Harmon and welcomed him to the District.

7. **REPORT ON RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION VICE CHAIR BRENNAN** Mayor Leach stated Vice Chair Brennan will be reporting. Vice Chair Brennans said at last night's meeting a Chair and Vice Chair were to be elected for the new year. The Planning Commission decided to postpone this until next month

when the new Planning Commissioners are on board, just to be more inclusive and welcoming. The other item on the agenda was to acknowledge an application being rescinded by the applicant. She said the rest of the evening was spent with a work meeting, where some good ideas were presented for future possible revision of the Land Use Code.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION ITEMS**

8. **APPOINTMENT OF TWO (2) ROCKVILLE RESIDENTS TO THE ROCKVILLE PLANNING COMMISSION:** Mayor Leach stated the applicants for the two (2) open Planning Commission seats have been asked to attend and explain why they feel they would like to serve on the Planning Commission. Mayor Leach said for information purposes, one of our applicants withdrew his name, as he decided he was too busy, which was Phil Barnage. Mayor Leach said another applicant has not returned any notifications to attend tonight's meeting. Mayor Leach said there are three residents present who are interested in filling these positions. There is Angie Frabasilio and Laney Delange and Skylar Davis. Mayor Leach said it appears Tyler Phillips is not in attendance either. Mayor Leach said the Council would like to ask the candidates some questions before making the appointments. Mayor Leach said Angie Frabasilio and Laney DeLange have been serving as alternates on the Planning Commission and are familiar with our Land Use Code. She asked Skylar Davis if he had a chance to look over the Land Use Code and feel that he would be able to apply it in all situations. Skylar Davis replied he would follow the Code and apply it to everyone across the board. Mayor Leach said she wanted to make sure that they were all aware that if you're appointed into this position, it is something that takes up more time than just the meeting once a month. Commissioners need to review any applications that come into Town, reviewing the Land Use Code Book, to make sure the applicants follow what they are applying for, which is very important. Andy Efstratis said he wanted to remind the residents that one of the things you should be aware of is three (3) absences in a row would dismiss you from Planning Commission and five (5) in the year. However, if something comes up and you need to attend via Zoom, that's available. Jeff Ballard said he wanted to thank the candidates for showing interest in participating in the Planning Commission. He said it's a lot of work, and a lot of time involved, and he appreciated them for taking interest in it and are willing to commit to doing it. He said the Land Use Code is a large document that needs to be followed. Robin Smith reminded the residents that the Land Use Code is a constantly evolving document. It provides a lot of guidelines on how to make decisions for the Town. Jeff Ballard asked why these three (3) were interested in serving on the Planning Commission. Angie Frabasilio replied she had been an alternate and really enjoyed it and working with the others on the Commission. She likes working with people and working things out. She has liked learning about the Code and to help keep our community strong. She said she has lived here for 36 years. Layney DeLange said she doesn't like people that sit back and complain about things but never try to do something different to make it better. She stated she was one of those people when she moved here but then attended meetings to see why decisions were made. She started to see another side of why these decisions were made. She said it became interesting to her, and she wanted to bring her voice into Rockville. She said she cares deeply about what happens to Rockville in the future and the community and the people that live here. Layney DeLange said she also has been serving as an alternate on the Planning Commission. She said she has learned a lot and has a lot more to learn and is appreciative of the opportunity to do that. Skylar Davis said he is also very committed to service. He has coached football for many years and likes to give back to his community. He said being here in Rockville is a place where he plans on dying. He said he feels it's time to get involved. He said he believes in a better place and is committed to service. He said he wants to see people in this Town treated fairly. He wants to be a part of the solution and hopes he gets the opportunity to serve.

Mayor Leach said in addition to the appointments to the Planning Commission, depending on who gets appointed, the Council is also looking at appointing at least one, maybe 2 alternates to fill that position also. Jeff Ballard asked the candidates, especially those that had served as alternates on the Planning Commission, do they feel like the Planning Commission works together as a group, together with everybody? Or do they feel like there are any

issues that need to be addressed? Layney DeLange said she thinks for the most part, there are definitely a few people that have different opinions, but. Jeff Ballard said that's what it should be with input from all angles. Skyler Davis asked is it expected that if you were on the Planning and Zoning Commission, you follow the Code to a T?" Jeff Ballard said yes. Andy Efstratis said it may not just apply to Planning Commission, but Rockville has really strict rules about not using short-term rentals, nor allowing bed and breakfasts unless you're grandfathered in. Also another rule is not having water in a building that's not connected to your house yet it's going on. He asked if the Town should continue to turn a blind eye or should start to enforce this better. Skyler Davis said he felt if it is in the Code it should be addressed whether that is the Planning Commission and/or the Town Council's job to change. If people are on those Boards that are not following the Code, that's a big problem. Everybody should be held to follow the Code. If the Code changes and allows those things in the future then that would be then not now. Andy Efstratis said he heard during the elections someone said their house was built there were these rules, but our neighbors just got approved and then can do what they want. He said he feels that is something the Town needs to work on. Skyler Davis said as someone who tries to follow the rules the best he can, and he is a firm believer in our police, our Councils, our Commissions should all be held to a higher standard. If someone is going to put themselves in the public representing the Town, they should be held to a higher standard than just the average citizen. Andy Efstratis said he had learned some of the new rules he was unaware of concerning dogs on leashes. Mayor Leach said these type of issues should all be addressed at another time and should be reviewed. Mayor Leach asked the Council to vote on the candidates individually. She said it was her decision by our Land Use Code to make the final appointment to the Planning Commission Board with the advice and consent of the Council. So it isn't actually a vote. It's just your opinion/recommendation. Andy Efstratis said he feels the two (2) candidates that did not show up tonight should be taken out of the running, to be fair. Mayor Leach indicated she felt the same, as did the other Council members. She said not showing up is not a good way to start. She said the alternate member will also be appointed since we have three potential candidates. She said another alternate member could be appointed at a later date, should it be needed.

Mayor Leach began with Angie Frabasilio asking if she should serve as a full-time Commission member or alternate member. Andy Efstratis said alternate member. Robin Smith said fulltime member. Megan Honer-Orton said fulltime member. Mayor Leach said fulltime member. Jeff Ballard said fulltime member.

Mayor Leach asked if Layney DeLange should serve as a full-time Commission member or alternate member. Andy Efstratis said fulltime member. Robin Smith said full-time Commission member. Megan Honer-Orton said fulltime member. Mayor Leach said fulltime member. Jeff Ballard said alternate member.

Mayor Leach asked if Skyler Davis should serve as a full-time Commission member of alternate member. Andy Efstratis said fulltime member. Robin Smith said alternate member. Megan Honer-Orton alternate member. Mayor Leach said alternate member. Jeff Ballard said fulltime member.

Mayor Leach said based on that recommendation, she is appointing Angie Fabrisilio and Laney DeLange as fulltime Planning Commission members and Skyler Davis as an alternate member. Mayor Leach said the Oath of Office would be administered at next month's Planning Commission meeting. Mayor Leach informed Skyler Davis he should attend all the meetings in case someone is absent and it will also help keep him informed. He would be able to participate in the discussions but not vote unless he is filling in to make a quorum for a vote. He would get the same information as the fulltime members.

**9. CONSIDERATION AND ACTION ON AN INCREASE IN SOLID WASTE SERVICES AS PER THE AGREEMENT WITH WASHINGTON COUNTY SOLID WASTE-( ORDINANCE WAS ADOPTED IN 2025 TO ALLOW INCREASES AS PER THE ASSESSED RATE FROM WASHINGTON COUNTY SOLID WASTE:**

Mayor Leach reminded the Council they had adopted an ordinance in 2025 that allowed the Town Council to do these annual increases to the garbage billing because Solid Waste had indicated there would be increases each year for the next few years. The increase this year is \$.50 a month between Solid Waste and BluCan and since we bill

quarterly, it would be \$1.50 more on the garbage billing. The increase for the regular garbage service is \$13.48 to \$13.82. The BluCan service is increasing from \$6.41 to \$6.25 which makes it a 2.5% increase across the board. There are also increases in regard to larger loads.

Megan Honer-Orton **MOVED** to approve the increase of \$0.50 a month increase in our garbage billing. Andy Efstratis **SECONDED** the motion.

12. **APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURES FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER 2025.** Mayor Leach asked if there were any questions regarding the expenditures for December 2025. Andy Efstratis asked what the current approval for

expenditures process was. He said he understood whoever's going to request the expense would approve and he knows the checks require two (2) signatures, but he wanted to understand the process. Mayor Leach said all checks are attached to the invoice and reviewed before signing. Mayor Leach said she can approve any amount up to \$5,000. If the amount exceeds this then the Council must give approval. She said most are regular expenses paid monthly. Andy Efstratis asked if when the Council must give approval it is only one other Council member or two?. Mayor Leach said she would review the policy to find out the exact number. She said most of the time, if it's been a big expense, something that's thousands of dollars, it has usually been discussed in a Council meeting and approved in the Council meeting. Andy Efstratis asked how other approval is obtained, verbally or written? He asked that in the future when an approval for an expenditure is requested that a written email be sent to the Office showing the other Council members' approval. He said that it will show a paper trail and be more transparent for the public if questions are raised. Mayor Leach said there is nothing wrong with that. Andy Efstratis apologized for being difficult. Mayor Leach said Andy Efstratis had experience in business procedures and keeping records and showing paper trails. Mayor Leach thanked him for his input. Jeff Ballard said two people are required to approve expenses when checks are being signed. That is usually the Mayor and another Council member.

**ADMINISTRATIVE NON-ACTION ITEMS**

**REPORTS OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS**

**MAYOR PAM LEACH** stated the Town of Rockville did not have an appreciation breakfast last year, and she thinks it's time to do one. She said those are usually held at the beginning or sometime during the first part of February. She said a possible date would be Saturday, February 14<sup>th</sup>, which is a holiday weekend with Presidents Day and

Valentine's Day. The next Saturday would be Saturday, February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2026. She said it usually starts at 9.30 or 10:00 am. The Council agreed on Saturday, February 21<sup>st</sup> for the Appreciation Breakfast. Mayor Leach said she will make the usual assignments.

Mayor Leach reported Chris Hall, our representative from UDOT, had informed her there was a grant possibly available that does not require matching funds that might work for starting on or doing our connector corridor. She said she had spoken with somebody at UDOT that handles those applications. The grant is called the Build Grants for small rural communities our size with potentially up to \$25 million, which hopefully our connector corridor will not run that. She said previously the Town got cost estimates from both Lochner Engineering that worked with us on our bridge renovation, and from Washington County's Road Department gave an estimate, one in 2021, one in 2022, and since they were a few years old may need updated. Washington County's also included all of the Smithsonian Butte Backcountry Byway and along with the new proposed connector corridor which is about 7/10 of a mile. She said she had tried to contact Lochner Engineering, who's no longer located in southern Utah and no longer have contracts for the State. She said she was referred to HPG (Hansen Planning Group), who does a lot of work with UDOT. She spoke to a lady there today and sent her the information along with the survey maps of the connector corridor, where it lies, and all of that, and the estimates. The application deadline is February 24th, which is coming up pretty fast. More than likely what we would try to put in for with this grant would be funds to cover all of the pre-engineering, which is what they estimate up to 30% of the cost of the entire job. This would include all of the environmental studies required for the project. If approved for that funding, it would give us all the appropriate time to get all of the design and everything else put in place. And then hopefully have a road that can handle more traffic, heavier loads, and move some of the additional traffic that we're seeing coming through Town, who are going out to recreate at Grafton or up to Gooseberry Mesa and so on. She said there is no definite amount at this time, but the Company is checking into it and thought possibly the cost for doing the grant application and the estimation of, or their guess of what the cost would be for the pre-planning would be about \$25,000. And those are funds that could come from the B&C road funds budget, as it's a road project. She said she will keep the Council updated on this matter. She said this is the first chance we've had at some funding that could be affordable for the Town of Rockville and would be good for the project. Andy Efstratis asked a question about this road going right past the sewage area. Mayor Leach said the road is East of the sewage ponds. Andy Efstratis and it's proposed to connect into Grafton Road and also access Gooseberry Mesa by way of Smithsonian Butte. Mayor Leach said it could be extended that direction later, but it does become a County Road. Andy Efstratis asked if this would be a good time to see if they would also be willing to pay for sewage connections in this area as all those houses on Grafton Road are on septic tank systems and the Town is trying to discourage septic tanks, and it would help make it more sanitary. Mayor Leach said it is her belief these are funds only for roads, as the funding is coming through UDOT. She said she could ask HPG if they're aware of any types of grants for sewer connects. The company the Town would be using has handled a lot of different types of grants, and we could review it to see if there's something else available. Andy Efstratis said it would be cost effective to make connections while the road construction is ongoing. Mayor Leach reminded him the sewer treatment plant is Springdale's. Andy Efstratis said he had heard in the Spring in a Planning Commission meeting that Springdale was amenable to allowing more connections to the system. Mayor Leach said she would be unsure how the sewer line would cross the river to the lagoons. Mayor Leach said the Town of Springdale just changed and upgraded a bunch of equipment in the last couple of years to enlarge their capacity.

Mayor Leach went over the various Council assignments. She said with the reassignment of responsibility and representation we will keep Jeff Ballard over Roads and Cemetery. Megan Honer-Orton is over Air Quality and CERT emergency services. Robin Smith will continue to serve on the Fire District Board and will begin serving as Mayor Pro-Tempore. Andy Efstratis will serve on the Mosquito Abatement Board and the Washington County Solid Waste Board.

Mayor Leach said the construction for the fiber optic main line is starting Monday and they indicated they would start on Grafton Road. They will then start offering connections to homes. Jeff Ballard asked if they would be tying

onto the line that's already on Grafton Road. Mayor Leach said yes and South Central has indicated they need all the construction completed by April. The current fiber optic plan will only extend to 425 West Main and not service the other residents further down. The remaining area will require a UDOT permit.

Andy Efstratis asked about the upcoming public officials training on February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Mayor Leach reminded everyone that this training will be held at the Fairfield Inn in Virgin from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. It is the required annual training.

**ANDY EFSTRATIS** said he is willing to accept the assignments to both the Mosquito Abatement Board and the Washington County Solid Waste Board. He said he had been approached by the Mosquito Abatement Board asking him to be the Rockville representative.

**ROBIN SMITH** said she represents Rockville on the Solid Waste Board and the Fire District Board. Mayor Leach said Andy Efstratis has volunteered to replace Michael Evenson on the Mosquito Abatement Board and others if requested. Robin Smith said she would love Andy Efstratis to replace her on the Solid Waste Board. Mayor Leach made that reassignment.

**MEGAN HONER-ORTON:** reported currently she represents Rockville on the Southern Utah Air Quality Task Force. She said today's meeting was on Zoom and she was unable to attend. She said the discussion centered on the number of uncovered loads being done by trucks hauling things, which is very difficult to enforce because many trucks aren't licensed in Utah, but are licensed somewhere, but not in Utah. She said just coming through Rockville, with a couple of projects, there were 50 loads a day and all uncovered. She said the only option we have is to ask the police to cite them, which can be done anytime we want, when or if the Council decides. Megan Honer-Orton said the Purple Air Monitor is working at the Town Office and anyone can log on and see the current air quality.

**JEFF BALLARD** reported he had been up to the Cemetery and repaired the road again. He said it keeps washing out every time it rains, so he put some more gravel on it and straightened it up again. Maybe at some point the Town should put money into paving that portion off the Highway. Clerk Cox said in speaking with UDOT for that area they were concerned about drainage in the area before paving it. Jeff Ballard said this project is included in the Town's Capital Improvement Projects, he said we may get the money or not, but at some point we need to try and address the issue. He said he would get Allan Lee to haul a couple of loads of gravel to put in the dip and also on the Cemetery road, as it washed out pretty bad. He said that pull off is Utah or UDOT's right away, but we use it a lot but will get some gravel in there.

Jeff Ballard reported he had spoken with Brad Quinn briefly about covering the ditch in front of the Post Office with flagstone. It is a hazard for people that step over the small ditch to go get the mail or come to the Town Office. He said he will meet with Brad Quinn to get a price to do that.

Jeff Ballard publicly thanked Ken Rybkiewicz for his years of service on the Planning Commission. Ken has resigned due to the time factor.

Robin Smith **MOVED** to adjourn the meeting at 7:05 pm. Mayor Leach **SECONDED** the motion.


