D. PETITIONS, REMONSTRANCES & COMMUNICATIONS

1. Payson City Victim Advocate Program Presentation (6:10 p.m.)

Ruthie Pedregon, the Payson City Victim Advocate, addressed the City Council and members of the public. Ruthie went over what the Payson City Victim Services Program offers to crime victims within the community. She also discussed the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding program which covers approximately 40% of the city's crime victim program. Ruthie went over the program's victim-centered approach and core principles such as safety, empowerment, and collaboration as well as local resources for crime victims. The victim advocate program provides many key services to victims to help them through the criminal justice process. Ruthie thanked the city council and community for their support of the victim advocacy program.

Councilmember Hulet and Ruthie discussed the funding for the program which comes from both federal and state resources. Councilmember Rowley asked how Ruthie comes into contact with victims after calls. Ruthie discussed the police department's process for response to victims. Councilmember Rowley thanked Ruthie for her service to the department to and to victims in the community. Councilmember Provstgaard asked about Ruthie's workload and the possibility of support from volunteerism.

2. Public Forum (6:18 p.m.)

Raymond Patrolski, on behalf of Pioneer Valley Little League, addressed the council in the public forum. He promoted the little league program and stated that in 2026 the league will be more developed and will offer extensions to current city leagues.

Scott (no last name offered) attended the meeting to express concern about the skate park. He thanked the police for drug enforcement at the skate park. He expressed concern about families leaving the park because of other kids fighting. He also expressed concern about the garbage cans being full. He's grateful that kids pick up the trash and put it in the cans, but the cans need to be emptied more regularly.
