Sheriff Anderson – Discussion on Agreement with Sheriff’s Office.

He gave an update on some funding opportunities in the County. He said he will be doing a cost survey for the RSO and explained about Interlocal Agreements. Council Member Atherley reiterated that you currently provide emergency services, and the contracted services would be for a specified number of hours/days where an officer would be here and perform patrol duties. Sheriff Anderson said they currently have a contract with Tintic District to provide an SRO. The SRO is the one who will respond to any emergency here in Eureka. The new law restricts his time off campus. If the city contracts with the Sheriff’s department, it must determine the type and cost of services needed.

Rocky Mountain Power Street Lights LED Program.

Council Member Atherley contacted Tyson at Rocky Mountain Power regarding the city’s current lighting infrastructure. Of the total 91 lights, 48 are high pressure sodium, which would be converted to LED. The projected monthly savings is approximately \$300. The initial investment is just under \$11,000, with an estimated payback period of three years. Council

Member Atherley stated that this project presents substantial long-term benefits after the recoupment period, including enhanced brightness, reduced maintenance requirements, and improved utility for all residents.

Richard Brinkworth – Camera System.

A few months ago, Mr. Brinkworth was contracted to install cameras; though the equipment was delayed, it has now arrived and he wants to schedule installation. Mayor Jenkins questioned if the camera locations could be changed, as only a quote had been received. Mr. Brinkworth clarified that former Mayor Dever signed a contract and an initial County grant payment was made. The Council discussed camera specs, recording devices, and access. Recorder Bigler requested a copy of the contract.

Boyce Sanderson Request to purchase City Property adjacent to Gas Hole.

Boyce was unable to attend the meeting. Mayor Jenkins said he had some concerns about the property. After researching the property, he found it had been a road at one time. Now it has stairs, a drainage ditch, which is part of our floodplain/water management system, and it is used by pedestrians to access main street. Council Member Davis felt more information was needed before a decision is made. He would like to reach out to Boyce to get that information and bring it back to the Council.

Job Opening for Maintenance Technician.

Mayor Jenkins said with Joe resigning we need to get his position filled.

Update on Drainage project.

Council Member Clements said she received an email today concerning phase 1 of the project. The price has gone up to \$8,000 and she recommends paying it as it benefits the entire town.

Review of bids for Fire Hydrant repair.

Council Member Clements said she just received another bid today from Newman Construction. She is waiting for one more bid and should be ready to discuss it at the next Council Meeting.

City Communications.

Mayor Jenkins stated Council Member Clements has reached out to him several times saying she is not getting information from City Hall. During a meeting with Rural Water, he had them check on who the city's contact is. They have down Council Member Clements as the main contact for our water link. He has done a lot of research and has not found any other city where a city councilor is listed a contact person. He requests all city accounts be reset to have all email notices sent to the city office. It was stated that all communications should be flowing up to the Mayor and emails can be sent with a CC. Mayor Jenkins has reached out to the city attorney and he recommended we handle this through a policy. He will reach out to Shay to help draft a policy.

SCADA System.

Mayor Jenkin said the SCADA system was removed from the city office last year. The system is part of our emergency water plan and should be brought back to the city office so it can be

monitored throughout the day. He also wants to make sure previous users who are no longer with the city are removed. The Council agreed it was a good idea to move it back to the city office.

Review of Auditor's Report for FY Ending June 30, 2025.

Recorder Bigler passed out the report for the Council to review. Council Member Nedreberg felt more review was needed before being voted on.
