

# LEGISLATURE WATCH:

## [H.B. 440 -S1, School Lunch Amendments:](#)

**H.B. 440 – S1, School Lunch Amendments** is a Utah legislative bill that updates state law relating to **school meals, lunch scheduling, and recess practices** in public schools. The bill aims to:

- Provide free lunches to students who qualify for reduced-price meals under the federal National School Lunch Program.
- Encourage school practices that improve student nutrition, reduce food waste, and ensure students have sufficient time to eat.
- Bolster local planning through **school community councils** with targeted goals on lunch timing and recess.
- Promote healthier scheduling for **elementary students** by aligning lunch and recess to prioritize seated eating time.

The bill has been introduced and recommended favorably out of the House Education Committee as of early 2026.

### **Key Requirements & Provisions of H.B. 440 – S1**

#### **1. Free Lunch for Eligible Students**

- Public schools (LEAs) participating in the National School Lunch Program must **provide lunch at no charge** to students who qualify for **reduced-price meals** based on income.
- The **Utah State Board of Education** will reimburse LEAs for the cost difference between federal free meal and reduced-price reimbursement rates, subject to legislative appropriations.
- The Board may accept private donations and grants to help fund this program.

### ✓ 2. Anti-Stigmatization & Communication Rules

- LEAs **cannot publicly identify or stigmatize** students who cannot pay for lunch.
- Schools **cannot require chores** as a condition of meal payment unless required of all students equally.
- Communications about meal debt must be directed **only to parents** rather than publicly.

### ✓ 3. Share Table Program

- Every LEA (school district or charter) must **establish and implement a “share table program”** where students can return unopened, uneaten food & beverages for redistribution to others, reducing waste.

### 4. School Lunch Target Goal

- A new statewide **“school lunch target goal”** is established for elementary schools (K–6), requiring:
  - **A minimum of 20 minutes** of *seated eating time* for lunch; and
  - **Recess scheduled immediately before lunch** in the daily schedule.

### 5. Annual School Lunch Planning Meetings

- **School community councils** (or charter trust land councils) must hold an **annual planning meeting** to:
  - Discuss how to meet the lunch target goal;
  - Create and document a plan for lunch and recess scheduling;
  - Include public input and notify parents before the meeting; and
  - Share results of parent surveys and reported plans with the State Board of Education.

### 6. Recess & Student Activity Requirements

- An elementary school **may not withhold recess, PE, or other physical activities** as punishment for poor behavior, incomplete classwork, or remediation.
- Schools also **cannot reduce daily recess time** to meet the lunch target goal, except in cases of immediate health or safety risk or when an individual student's accommodation plan (IEP/504) allows.

### 7. Research & Guidance

- The **State Board of Education** is required to *research best practices* regarding recess scheduling and student eating time and share this information with schools and councils.

### 8. Implementation Effective Date

- The bill is drafted to take effect **July 1, 2026**.
