C. Continued discussion of an Ordinance regarding adoption of the 2006 Utah Wildland-Urban Interface Code

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Mayor and City Council expressed concern regarding the map used by the State of Utah that identifies high-risk zones. Under the 2006 Utah Wildland-Urban Interface Code, the City is required to adopt a map; however, it does not necessarily have to be the State's map. Washington County plans to use the State's map for its annual inspections. The Ivins City Manager and Fire Chief presented an alternative map that they created, identifying the areas Ivins City feels are areas in high risk zones. The Utah Wildland-Urban Interface Code requires that properties located within designated high risk zones be built to a higher construction standard. It was suggested that representatives from the Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands be included in a future "Talk About" discussion. The City Manager recommended first speaking with State of Utah officials before holding a "Talk About". The Mayor and City Council supported holding a work meeting but suggested that a small group meet first to work through the details. The City Manager and Council Member Pennington will coordinate to determine a date for a work meeting regarding the Utah Wildland-Urban Interface Code and map. BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: Approve expenditure of \$26,877.55 to reimburse developer Cole West for Ivins City's 50% share of costs to relocate and upsize the existing sewer trunk line from 10 inch to 15 inch within the public right-of-way located north of Harmons between Rachel Drive and Red Mountain Drive.

C. Discussion regarding potential remodel and expansion of the Center Street Fire Station Fire Station Expansion-Issues for Council Discussion

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: The Mayor and City Council recognized the tremendous opportunity the City has with the donation that has been pledged and agreed that before committing to moving forward, they need to address donor expectations and role of community fundraising; project costs for renovation vs expansion vs enhancements; decision on proceeding before full funding is secured vs contingent funding approach; financial, timing and grant alternatives; availability from property tax increase; impact from potential EMS sales tax; 5-10 year Fire/EMS cost outlook that looks at new cost sharing split, staffing, operations and capital; public safety impact fee capacity and timing of available funds and future estimates; ladder truck obligation cost and timing and impact fee level of service limits on eligible facility size and funding. The Mayor and City Council agreed to continue this to the next City Council meeting. The discussion may be accessed at time stamp 01:54:42. D. Discuss and consider expenditure for architectural services for the Center Street Fire Station remodel and expansion

BACKGROUND and RECOMMENDATION: One Council Member expressed concern about the recommended architectural firm, noting that the firm has not previously designed any fire stations. The Council Member pointed out that there are six architectural firms in Utah with proven experience in designing a new fire station or remodeling fire stations and suggested the City consider exploring other options. The Mayor commented that using a formal Request for Proposal (RFP) process could significantly increase costs, potentially doubling or tripling the fee. The City Manager added that the proposed firm is aware of its limited fire station experience, which is reflected in the lower fee, and explained that the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) process will be used. He also noted that issuing an RFP would slow down the timeline. One Council Member suggested using a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process. Regardless of which firm is chosen, the Mayor and City Council emphasized the importance of securing a commitment from the architect to work closely with the Fire Chief to ensure the project requirements are properly addressed.
