

Tooele County Trails

Meeting Minutes

September 4, 2025

1. Roll Call: Leland Roberts, Ray Dixon, Jimmy Thomas, Darwin Cook, Francesco Esqibar, Corey Child, Troy Johansen, Kendall Thomas. Staff: Corey Bullock, Fred Killpack, Milenna Russell, and Amy Rice.
2. Meeting Minutes: Troy motioned to approve the meeting minutes of July 2026. Ray seconded. All in favor. Minutes approved.
3. Committee Member Reports:
Ray Dixon: Ride for Life is September 26 and September 27
Jimmy Thomas: There is a broken fence on
Darwin Cook: Corey and Darwin are working on the proposal for the Jaguar trail. He would like to present it to the city council soon.
Corey Child: The barrier on the Dark Trail has greatly reduced the number of people parking where they aren't allowed to. There is still a group of people camping in the middle of the trail.
Troy: The new walking path at the Peak is getting a lot of use.
4. Director Update: We are waiting to move forward on the NICA trail. There is currently a government freeze, and we are unable to move forward. The Middle Canyon trail has progressed to Rio Tinto for review. The High Deseret Trail will be officially adopted in October 2025. The state of Utah plans to complete one NEPA study for the entire trail system. Corey requested that the Trails Committee present ideas for places that we can add trails in Tooele County. Corey will present a comprehensive Trails map for the committee's review. All the trails need to be identified, and future trails can be added too. Corey will send an invitation for its review when it is ready.
5. Public concerns and comments: Jay Brawn asked if there is a policy on electric bikes on the trails system. There is currently no registration process for most E-Bikes.
