SUMMARY:

Clinton City has about \$1.2 million in our parks project fund and \$352,000 in our RAP tax Fund for a total of around \$1.5 million set aside for improvements and additions to our parks. The City Council has received helpful feedback from the community, as presented during the Feb. 24 council meeting. The Council has made clear they want to take action sooner rather than later. Prior to expending funds, the Council needs to look at the big picture and decide some goals and vision. Here are some questions to consider:

1. We have existing parks with unfinished areas, and we have entirely undeveloped land contemplated for new park space. Should one type be prioritized over the other, or should they be addressed equally?
2. Going forward, should all parks have a little bit of everything, or should we focus on themes to accomplish certain goals, such as nature park, sports park, athletic complex, dog park, community park, pocket parks, adventure park, destination park, linear parks, trail parks, etc.?
3. Do we want our parks to become regional attractions, or is our focus more on the local community?
4. What type of amenities would you want to see in the parks: playgrounds, benches, shade trees, small picnic tables, pavilions/bowery's, outdoor challenge areas, water play areas/splash pad, skate amenities, pump track, trails, fitness stations, shade structures, ADA-accessible equipment, solid surface areas, open turf, pickleball courts, tennis courts, etc.
5. How do our decisions regarding parks relate to the Council's three whys: identity, opportunity, stability?
