CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES - Utility Advisory Board – December 10, 2025

MEETING SUMMARY:

The meeting, chaired by Rollin Hotchkiss, approved the minutes from December 10, 2025, and introduced new Councilman Mike Snelson. Jason Miller explained the Utah Municipal Power Association (UMPA) and Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems (UAMPS), highlighting their roles and the upcoming pooling agreement changes due to the Energy Day-Ahead Market (EDAM). The Artistic Circle pipe replacement project was discussed, focusing on upgrading water infrastructure. The Public Works division reported on stormwater and sewer improvements, and the water division on maintenance and safety efforts. Financial reports showed flat revenue growth and a slight decrease in energy usage due to mild weather.

Outline

Approval of Minutes and Introduction of New Councilman

- Rollin Hotchkiss calls the meeting to order at 6:31 AM and welcomes everyone.
- Motion to approve the minutes from December 10, 2025, is made and seconded.
- Mike Snelson introduces himself as the new Councilman, mentioning his previous experience with the Parks and Rec board.
- Rollin Hotchkiss and Mike Snelson discuss the utility board's responsibilities and the excitement of working together.



Overview of UAMPS and UMPA

- Jason Miller provides an overview of UAMPS and UMPA, explaining their roles and differences.
- UAMPS is described as a larger geographic area with more diverse member cities, while UMPA is more focused on requirements.
- Jason explains the process of power procurement and project participation within UAMPS.
- Mike Snelson asks about the composition of the UAMPS board, and Jason explains the roles of power directors and city administrators.

Impact of EDAM and Pooling Agreement

- Jason Miller discusses the impact of the Energy Day-Ahead Market (EDAM) and the new pooling agreement within UAMPS.
- The old pooling agreement was bilateral, but the new agreement is more centralized and complex.
- Jason explains the role of Pacific Corp and the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) in the new marketplace.
- Mike Snelson seeks clarification of the new agreement's implications for Springville City's power distribution.

Challenges and Opportunities in the New Marketplace

- Jason Miller discusses the potential benefits and challenges of the new marketplace.
- The new marketplace allows for more efficient power procurement but also reduces local control over internal generation (MIGs).
- The uncertainty of the new rules and the impact on power rates are highlighted as key concerns.

Artistic Circle Pipe Replacement Project

- Brad Stapley introduces the Artistic Circle pipe replacement project, located in the south side of the community.
- The project involves replacing four-inch lines with an eight-inch main and adding fire hydrants.
- Mike Snelson asks about the criteria for selecting areas for pipe replacement, and Brad explains the process of prioritizing projects based on need and budget.
- The project is part of a larger 20-year plan for water system repairs and replacements.

Public Works Division Reports

- Jake Nostrom and Terrance Harris provide updates on the stormwater and sewer divisions, highlighting recent projects and achievements.
- The stormwater team has been focusing on cleaning culverts, improving asset management, and preparing for future storm events.
- The sewer team has been addressing root intrusions, improving lines, and working on betterments with UDOT.
- Brad Stapley provides an update on street frontage improvements in progress for the future Public Works facility.



Water Division Report

- Brad Stapley provides an overview of the water division's activities, including staffing, cross-training, and safety improvements.
- The division has been working on routine water samples and maintaining compliance with state and federal requirements.
- Recent projects include fence and landscaping improvements at the second north well.
- The division is also working on a rate analysis to ensure accurate utility rates and address revenue tracking issues with the state auditor.

Resource and Financial Reports

- Mike Pool provides a financial report, noting flat revenue growth and a slight decrease in energy usage due to mild weather.
- The power price on the market is currently favorable, around \$35 a megawatt.
- Jason Miller explains the impact of the Nebo power station's reduced capacity on resource costs and the anticipated repair timeline.
- The division has purchased interim power to cover shortfalls and is insured for the \$6 million in damages at the Nebo facility.

Conclusion and Adjournment

- Rollin Hotchkiss suggests a deeper dive into one division's activities in future meetings for better understanding.
- The meeting concludes with a motion to close the meeting, which is seconded and approved.
