The most common definition of a drugstore (though often used synonymously with pharmacy) is: "a **retail** store that sells medicines and various other items such as cosmetics and snacks." Though many drugstores do, indeed, include a pharmacy where prescription medications are provided, there is no such requirement for a drugstore. A drugstore is, in essence, a convenience store. Therefore, it should not be included as an allowable entity on PU land. A drugstore could logically be allowed on any commercial property but never on PU land. Besides which, for anything you might be considering for PU land, just allowing a pharmacy without including a drugstore is more than sufficient. Because some definitions of pharmacy do not mandate it sells prescription drugs, you may want to include that wording when allowing it on PU lands.
