The application/budget was approved to move forward.</p>	<p>Purpose: This funding will be used to promote targeted, intensive evidence-based home visiting services to at-risk families with children up to the age of 5. Families must reside in high-need counties, as identified by the 2020 needs assessment. This funding is not intended to be used for universal home visiting in each state, but rather is for targeted, intensive home visiting services in specific areas of the state.</p>

This will fund recipients to work with state and local partners to improve nutrition and access to safe physical activity, including breastfeeding, early care and education, and family healthy weight programs.</p>

The funding allows VIPP to continue surveillance strategies and to provide evidence-based and evidence-informed interventions that have an immediate impact on reducing overdose morbidity and mortality, with a focus on opioids, stimulants, and polysubstance use.</p>
