
Town Council Meeting held at the Clarkston Town Hall, 24 South Main, Clarkston, UT

1. **CALL TO ORDER:**

Mayor Thompson called the Clarkston Town Council to order at 7:00 p.m. Councilmember Noble offered Reverence and led the Pledge of Allegiance to begin the meeting.

2. **BUSINESS:**

Mayor Thompson addressed the minutes of the February 18, 2026 Town Council Meeting.

Councilmember Godfrey made a motion to approve the minutes of February 18, 2026. Councilmember Noble seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Business License Applications:

1 – Woodsmith Construction Inc. – The Mayor read the business license application and asked if there were any objections from the Council Members. There were none. The Woodsmith Construction Inc. business license was approved.

3. **DEPARTMENTS:**

Mayor Thompson:

Pony Express Discussion: The Council thought that additional food trucks would be a good addition to the day. It was also decided to try line dancing on Saturday evening, instead of a band. It was felt that it would change things up and people might enjoy it. Deputy Clerk Petersen had authored a digital survey, which was seeing good response from the community. The survey was delivered via the town website, Facebook page, and physically with a QR code in the utility bills. It was decided, since it had not been out long, to give respondents more time to answer the survey.

Responsibility Changes: Mayor Thompson stated that he was changing the responsibility of Parks/Recreation to Councilmember Noble and Emergency Preparedness to Councilmember Petersen, effective immediately.

Councilmember Petersen will get the two radar signs ordered. Councilmember Godfrey asked about getting a 25-mph sign for Center Street after crossing 200 East. He stated that it was 45 mph coming into town from Trenton and people might not know that after stopping and crossing 200 East it is 25 mph. Councilmember Petersen will add a 25-mph sign to the order.
