### **Fee Hearing, First Consideration of Fee Schedule, School Year 2026-27**

The Administration has provided a recommended fee schedule for school year 2026-27. As part of the legally required process for adoption of a fee schedule and spend plan, the Board of Directors must also consider the schedule in a second hearing in a public meeting in order to provide stakeholders with a chance to comment and give feedback. The Administration recommends discussion of the fee schedule for the 2026-27 school year with approval to be determined in the board's April 2026 meeting.

### **Required State Data Review for LEA Boards Regarding Health Instruction**

As part of the annual Human Sexuality Assurance to the Utah State Board of Education (USBE), the Administration must assure that CCID's Board of Directors has reviewed data on the following:

- Teen Pregnancy: data regarding pregnancy rates within the state and LEA boundaries;
- Child Sexual Abuse: reported cases or data related to youth;
- STDs and STIs: reported instances within the jurisdiction;
- Adolescent birth rates;
- Pornography Complaints: records of pornography complaints or incidents reported within the LEA.

### **Employee Appeal Processes Related to Harassment and Bullying**

The Board recently revised its Bullying, Cyberbullying, and Harassment Policy to include a thorough Action Plan in the event of a confirmed incidence of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or retaliation in accordance with the requirements of state law. In addition, the section titled, "Employee Grievance Policy related to Bullying, Cyberbullying, Hazing, and Retaliation" has been moved to the *Employee Handbook* where it more properly belongs.

### **Policy Review**

#### **Animals and Service Animals on School Property (Revised)**

This revised policy better reflects ADA requirements and allowance for service animals including what the school may or may not require from a staff member or student in order to have a service animal on campus. The policy's links and formatting have also been updated.

#### **Safe Schools, Discipline, and Behavior Policy (Revised)**

This policy has been revised in the following ways:

- The Emergency Safety Interventions sections of the policy have been removed in light of the new stand-alone board policy governing Emergency Safety Interventions.
- The definition of “expulsion” has been updated to reflect updated USBE Admin. Rule: Expulsion: as defined in Utah Admin. Rule R277-609, a disciplinary removal from school for more than ten school days without an offer of alternative educational service. While this removal is defined as exceeding 10 days, it may function as a permanent removal or long-term exclusion from school. Although an expulsion may be recommended by administration, it must be imposed by a school board or a designated board committee. Parents of expelled students are responsible to comply with compulsory education laws of the State of Utah by providing other educational services for the student and paying all associated costs thereof.
- All links in the policy have been updated and areas of awkward formatting have been improved.

#### Website Privacy Policy and Terms of Use (New)

The Administration collaborated with experts in the field of website privacy disclosures and composed a Website Privacy Policy which will be linked at the bottom of each page of the school’s website. This policy is intended to allow the school to comply with Utah’s Government Data Privacy Act, including [Utah Code §63A-19-402.5](#), which requires websites of governmental entities to post privacy notices, disclose data usage, and take reasonable measures to protect personally identifiable information from unauthorized disclosure. The policy gives notice to community members that the school strives to ensure transparency, security, and respect for data while providing the school community with necessary resources and information.

#### **Board Training: Public Hotline Training**

The Utah State Board of Education, subsequent to rule changes in [Utah Admin. Code R277-123](#), requires local governing boards of directors of public schools to receive training about the processes for members of the public to report violations of statute and rule.
