 - i. We need a new machine. A new machine will cost \$1999.00 that will connect to our bingo board. In the new center, we want to look at a projection setup that is installed in the building. Would like to put up a donation box for bingo players to donate to and ask sponsors to donate. Would like to keep track of how much money we collect on the wooden tracking device. We have a goal to have it collected by the end of this fiscal year.
