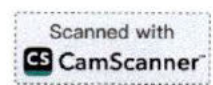

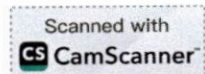



A) Explain how the proposed use of the particular location is necessary or desirable to provide a service or facility which will contribute to the general well-being of the community.

The facility will be leased and operated by a local privately-owned company as a training facility for law enforcement, military, security professionals, and the general public. Training will consist of classroom training and tactical training using airsoft weapons and "simmunition" firearms. This type of facility is not present in Utah or surrounding states - leaving these types of organizations with few training options in the area.

B) Explain how such use will not be detrimental to the health, safety and general welfare of persons nor injurious to property or improvements in the community, but will be compatible with and complementary to the existing surrounding uses.

This type of training fits well with the industrial area where the building is located, as well as the neighboring industrial tenants. Training is conducted indoors under the supervision of trained instructors.

C) Explain how the proposed use will comply with the regulations and conditions specified in this title for such use.

Training is conducted by certified instructors and carried out to meet the curriculum standards, complete with any and all required safety equipment. No live rounds of ammunition are used in this type of training and will never be discharged in or around the building.

D) Explain how the proposed use conforms to the goals, policies and governing principles and land use of the Farr West City General Plan.

The proposed use supports the goal of encouraging mixed use zoning, as well as promoting an attractive, stable, and economically sustainable environment. This business will bring people from all over Utah and other states to Farr West, and those people will prove to be an economic benefit to other businesses in the community.

E) Explain how the proposed use will not lead to the deterioration of the environment, or ecology of the immediate vicinity, the general area, or the community as a whole.

Our training is conducted indoors and does not consist of any environmentally dangerous or hazardous materials. Any noise pollution will be controlled with sound abatement on the interior of the building, and will also be masked by the noise of the I-15 traffic just several yards away from our part of the building.

WHEREAS, the Utah Occupational Safety and Health standards and 29 CFR 1910.1030 require the City to maintain a Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Control Plan; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable laws, standards, and other regulations, the City does hereby desire to adopt a Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Control Plan; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Farr West City that:

1. The Farr West City Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Control Plan attached as **Exhibit A** is hereby adopted and implemented.

Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Control Plan

Effective Date: April 2026

I. Purpose

Farr West City (“the City”) is committed to providing a safe and healthy work environment. This Exposure Control Plan (“ECP”) is established to eliminate or minimize occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens (“BBP”) in accordance with **Utah Occupational Safety and Health** (“UOSH”) standards and 29 CFR 1910.1030.

II. Exposure Determination

UOSH requires the City to identify employees who may have "reasonably anticipated" contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials (OPIM).

Job Classification	Tasks/Procedures with Potential Exposure
Public Works (Sewer/Water)	Clearing sewer blockages, handling wastewater, or repair of lines where sharps may be present.
Parks & Recreation / Custodial	Cleaning public restrooms, emptying park trash bins (potential needle/sharps contact), and cleaning community centers.
Police / First Responders	Providing first aid, managing accident scenes, or conducting searches of persons/property.
Designated First Aiders	Staff specifically assigned to provide medical assistance in city offices.

III. Methods of Implementation & Compliance

1. **Universal Precautions:** All employees will utilize universal precautions. All human blood and certain body fluids will be treated as if known to be infectious for HIV, HBV, HCV, and other bloodborne pathogens.
2. **Controls:** The City will provide and maintain:
 - Puncture-resistant, leakproof, and labeled **Sharps Containers** in relevant departments (Shop, Police, Parks) as applicable.
 - Leakproof bags for contaminated waste.
3. **Work Practice Controls:**

- **Handwashing:** Employees must wash hands immediately after removing gloves or other PPE.
 - **Sharps Safety:** Needles shall not be bent, recapped, or broken.
 - **Prohibitions:** Eating, drinking, or applying cosmetics is prohibited in areas with a reasonable likelihood of exposure.
4. **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):** The City provides PPE at no cost, including nitrile gloves, eye protection (goggles/face shields), and CPR masks.
- PPE must be removed before leaving the work area and disposed of in designated containers.

IV. Hepatitis B Vaccination

Farr West City will make the Hepatitis B vaccination series available to all employees identified in the "Exposure Determination" section above.

1. **Availability:** Offered at no cost within **10 working days** of initial assignment to an at-risk position.
2. **Declination:** Any employee who chooses to decline must sign the **Hepatitis B Vaccination Declination Form** ("Appendix A"). They may opt to receive the vaccine later at no cost if still employed in an at-risk role.

V. Post-Exposure Evaluation and Follow-up

In the event of an exposure incident:

1. **Immediate Care:** Clean the wound with soap and water.
2. **Reporting:** Notify your supervisor immediately.
3. **Medical Evaluation:** See a health care professional as soon as possible for medical counseling, testing for HIV, Hepatitis B & C, possible treatment and follow-up recommendations (e.g., **Work-Med in Ogden**).
4. **Source Testing:** If feasible and permitted by Utah law, the source of the blood or fluid causing exposure should be requested by the exposed person to be tested to determine BBP status. If the source person refuses testing, contact the city attorney for options on court ordered testing.

VI. Communication and Training

1. Each year, it is your responsibility to read and be familiar with the OSHA standard concerning occupational exposure to blood, certain body fluids, and other potentially infectious material (29 CFR part 1910.1030) and this exposure control plan.

APPENDIX A

Hepatitis B Vaccine Declination

Declination Statement

I understand that due to my occupational exposure to blood or other potentially infectious materials I may be at risk of acquiring hepatitis B virus (HBV) infection.

I have been given the opportunity to be vaccinated with hepatitis B vaccine, at no charge to myself. However, I decline hepatitis B vaccination at this time.

I understand that by declining this vaccine, I continue to be at risk of acquiring hepatitis B, a serious disease. If in the future I continue to have occupational exposure to blood or other potentially infectious materials and I want to be vaccinated with hepatitis B vaccine, I can receive the vaccination series at no charge to me.

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing to consider the proposed budget amendments was previously published as required by law; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on April 02, 2026, to allow for public comment regarding the proposed amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. The Farr West City Council does make certain budget adjustments and amendments to the existing Farr West City employee pay scale as presented and motioned before the Farr West City Council on April 02, 2026.
2. Any existing resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.

**AGREEMENT
for
LEGAL SERVICES**

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between **FARR WEST CITY** (“City”), a corporate and politic of the State of Utah and **LONE PINE LAW, PLLC** (“Attorney”), duly registered and licensed within the State of Utah.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, City desires to continue to utilize the legal services of Attorney as its general counsel in civil matters; and

WHEREAS, City is willing to retain Attorney subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, City and Attorney have determined that this Agreement is mutually beneficial;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, it is hereby mutually agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

Pursuant to this Agreement, Attorney shall act as general legal counsel to City in civil matters and shall perform, but is not limited to, the following specific duties and responsibilities:

- a. Serves as civil legal counsel to the Mayor, City Council, Planning Commission, Staff, and various committees.
- b. Attends various official meetings as required; prepares and reviews legal documents; monitors and reviews city-wide activities in general to assure compliance with statutory and other legal requirements.
- c. Advises City about potential legal implications and risks of administrative and legislative actions.
- d. Prepares and reviews legal documents including ordinances, resolutions, contracts, subdivision plats as well as inter-local and development agreements.
- e. Assists in the development of city policies; negotiates contracts; provides legal advice on pertinent matters.
- f. Negotiates settlements of claims filed against City for actions arising out of the course of conducting City business or providing City services.
- g. Promotes timely settlement; coordinates with outside or contracted legal services in the event of needed litigation.
- h. Prepares, reviews and updates city ordinances and in conjunction with recommendations of the Planning Commission and/or City Council to assure compliance with evolving case law and amended state and federal laws.

Attorney further agrees to respond to requests for legal counsel in a timely manner and shall notify City in advance of any conflicts that would prevent Attorney from being available for scheduled meetings or requests for legal counsel in a timely manner.

Additionally, Attorney shall disclose to City any conflict of interest that may prevent Attorney from providing competent legal advice to City.

2. EMPLOYMENT TAXES/BENEFITS

Attorney shall not receive any retirement, leave, or accounting benefits normally provided to City employees. Attorney shall be responsible to pay any and all taxes and fees from compensation paid to Attorney pursuant to this Agreement.

3. COMPENSATION

City shall pay Attorney a monthly amount as established by ordinance for the legal services provided under the terms of this Agreement. Beginning in January 2026, the monthly rate of legal services shall be \$1,800.00 plus compensation adjustments established by the scheduled payroll of the City. The parties may adjust compensation to account for workload increases and/or changes in the Consumer Price Index or as otherwise allowed under the ordinances of City and only as reasonably determined and mutually agreed to be appropriate by the parties.

4. DURATION AND TERMINATION

This Agreement shall be effective as of January 2026 and shall continue year to year with automatic renewals until the Agreement is terminated by either of the parties.

City reserves the right to terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, at any time during the term of this Agreement whenever City determines, in its sole discretion that it is in the City's interest to do so. If City elects to exercise this right, City shall provide written notice to Contractor at least 15 days prior to the date of termination for convenience. Upon such termination, Attorney shall be paid for all services up to the date of termination. Attorney agrees that the City's termination for convenience will not be deemed a termination for default nor will it entitle Attorney to any rights or remedies provided by law or this Agreement for breach of contract by the City or any other claim or cause of action.

Attorney reserves the right to terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, at any time during the term of this Agreement whenever Attorney determines, in its sole discretion that it is in the Attorney's interest to do so. If Attorney elects to exercise this right, Attorney shall provide written notice to City at least 30 days prior to the date of termination for convenience. City agrees that the Attorney's termination under this section will not be deemed a termination for default nor will it entitle City to any rights or remedies provided by law or this Agreement for breach of contract by Attorney or any other claim or cause of action.

5. INDEMNIFICATION

The City shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Attorney, and its agents, officers and employees, from claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney fees arising out of, or resulting from, the gross negligence or wrongful acts of City, its agents, officers, employees, Attorney, or Attorney's representation under this Agreement, whether or not said claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses or other costs arise prior to or after the execution of this Agreement.

6. MISCELLANEOUS

This Agreement may only be changed, modified, or amended by written agreement of the

parties. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute one of the same instrument. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Utah.

This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties and any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the date of this Agreement shall not be binding upon either party except to the extent incorporated in this Agreement.

Notwithstanding the terms of this Agreement, City retains the right to seek and or retain additional legal advice, consultation, and counsel at the City's sole discretion.
