

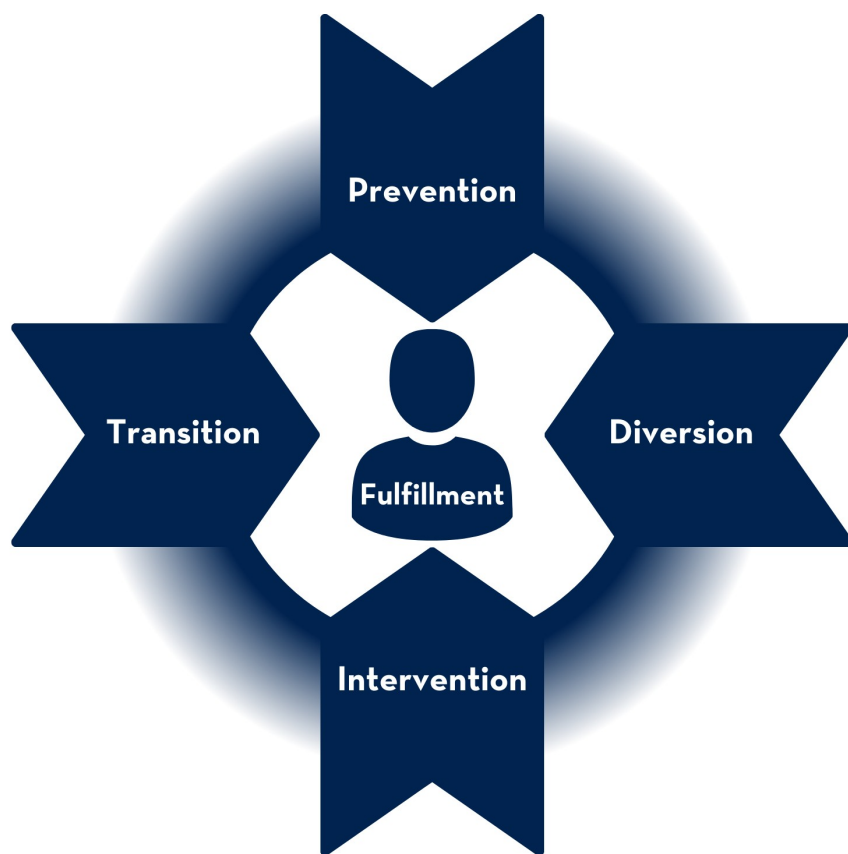

2026 Grant Program

- Similar process to previous years
- \$193,959.11 to distribute (\$181,479.11 FFY24 Delinquency Prevention + \$12,480 FFY23 Expungement)
- Response
 - * 32 applications
 - * Over \$1.2 million requested
- Applications reviewed and evaluated by 16 working group members
- March 13: Working group developed recommendation list to forward to UBJJ
- March 19: UBJJ reviewed and approved



UBJJ allocates Title II Federal funding, through a competitive grant process, to eligible entities across Utah to support programs and services for juveniles involved with the juvenile justice system and juveniles at -risk of such involvement, as well as their parents/guardians and families.
