BICENTENNIAL PARK AMPHITHEATER DEMOLITION**

**A. OVERVIEW OF SOLICITATION**

1. The purpose of this RFP is to enter into a contract with a qualified firm to demolish the existing amphitheater building, seating, and sound booth at Bicentennial Park (600 S. 800 E., Clearfield, UT). This will include capping and marking all existing utilities for the building (water, sewer, and electricity), including all materials and labor required to complete the project. It is anticipated that this RFP will result in a contract award to a single vendor that furnishes materials for the demolition of said amphitheater at Bicentennial Park.
2. This RFP is designed to provide interested vendors with sufficient basic information to submit proposals meeting minimum requirements but is not intended to limit a proposal's content or exclude any relevant or essential data. Vendors are at liberty and are encouraged to expand upon the specifications so long as minimum requirements are met.
3. Clearfield City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, or to waive any formality or technicality in any proposal, in the best interests of the City. While it is the intent of the City to proceed with this solicitation, nothing herein shall obligate the City to enter into a contract. The City reserves the right to cancel this RFP in whole or in part at any time if it is in the best interest of the City.

**B. GENERAL INFORMATION**

1. Proposals will only be accepted through <https://vendor.bonfirehub.com/>. Electronic submissions of proposals must be received no later than Thursday, April 23, 2026, at 3:00 p.m. No proposals will be accepted after 3:00 p.m. on the above-mentioned date.
2. Electronic proposals may require uploading of electronic attachments. Each attachment will have a 50 MB limit, or a link can be uploaded that will direct Clearfield City to the document. The Bonfire site will accept a wide variety of document types as attachments. However, the submission of documents containing embedded documents (zip files), .mov, .wmp, and .mp3 files are prohibited. All documents should be attached as separate files.
3. When submitting a proposal electronically through Bonfire, allow sufficient time to complete the online forms and to upload documents. The solicitation will end

precisely at the closing time listed. If you are in the middle of uploading your proposal at the closing time, Bonfire will stop the process, and your proposal will not be received.

- a. Vendor is responsible for verifying that all required documents have been successfully uploaded with proposal.
- b. Clearfield City is not responsible for vendor access with Bonfire.
- c. All questions must be submitted through Bonfire and all answers will be given via the Bonfire website.
- d. A MANDATORY Pre-Proposal meeting will be held on location at Bicentennial Park (600 S. 800 E., Clearfield, UT 84015) beginning at 9:30 am on Tuesday, April 14, 2026.
- e. Questions may be submitted through Bonfire until Thursday, April 16, 2026, at 3:00 p.m.
- f. Clearfield City will select the proposal determined to be in its best interest according to the criteria outlined in the RFP.

### **C. PROPOSAL DESCRIPTION**

1. Work of the Project consists of the following items and as shown in the picture and contained in the specifications.
  - a. The work includes furnishing all labor, tools, materials, equipment, transportation, and services required for demolishing the existing amphitheater and rough grading the demolition site after removal of the amphitheater, seating and sound booth. Work shall also include: mobilization; obtaining all bonds and insurance, removal and disposal of the materials, and miscellaneous other construction work required per the Contract Documents.
  - b. Provide and maintain a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) to control erosion around the site perimeter as required.
  - c. Maintain public access on adjacent public streets during construction.
2. Perform work of the contract per the “General Conditions” and “Supplementary Conditions”.

#### **D. SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

1. Staging of equipment, materials and supplies shall be as determined by Clearfield City. The staging area must be maintained in a clean and orderly fashion.
2. All trenches and excavations must be backfilled as soon as possible. Trenches left open must be barricaded with safety cones, signs, and construction caution tape nightly.
3. All water for the project will be made available by the City at no cost to the Contractor. Water is available from the City at no cost to the Contractor from nearby fire hydrants. The Contractor shall provide an approved backflow prevention device and gate valve for the fire hydrant connection.
4. The Contractor shall provide to Clearfield City:
  - a. Field supervision, inspection, and reporting practices for all work.
  - b. Quality control inspection over subcontractors, suppliers and other services engaged in the project.
  - c. Methods for protecting finished work prior to the Contract completion.
  - d. Monitoring and documenting of the Storm Water Pollution and Prevention Plans (SWPPP), for the site and surrounding properties per the requirements of the State of Utah.

#### **E. CONTRACTOR'S USE OF THE PREMISES**

1. The Contractor will be required to work on the site during regular working hours, which are defined as 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., local time, except Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays. No work shall be done before 7:00 a.m. or after 7:00 p.m., except as necessary for the proper care and protection of work already performed, or during emergencies. Exceptions will be considered by the Community Services Department and may be granted under certain conditions and project site locations.
2. The Contractor shall make every effort to minimize noise caused by operations. Equipment shall be equipped with silencers or mufflers designed to operate with the least possible noise.

3. The Contractor shall restrict operations as nearly as possible to the immediate site. Unnecessary removal of concrete improvements, asphalt surfacing, cutting of vegetation or removal of property adjacent to the site, which is not under the ownership of Clearfield City, is prohibited. Every effort shall be made to minimize erosion during and after construction.
4. The Contractor shall conform to all requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration Regulations for trenching, shoring and excavation, confined spaces, and all other activities where such regulations apply. The Contractor and all subcontractors shall conduct all activities in conformance with federal and state laws and regulations relating to occupational health and safety. Authorized inspectors from Occupational Health and Safety Administration or the State of Utah agencies shall have unobstructed access to the project site and shall not be impeded in any way from performance of their duties.

#### **F. REFERENCE STANDARDS**

1. As noted in Document – General Conditions, the Contractor shall conform to all requirements set forth in the latest edition of the Clearfield City Public Works Development Standards, Technical Specification, and Drawings.
2. Where reference is to an industry standard, all labor, products and / or equipment must conform to the current standards.

#### **G. PRODUCT STANDARDIZATION AND INSTALLATION**

Like items of products furnished and installed throughout the project shall be end products of one manufacturer to achieve standardization for appearance, operation and maintenance, spare parts and replacement, and manufacturer's services.

1. Installation of materials and equipment shall be in conformance with the manufacturer's written instructions.

#### **H. CLEANING DURING CONSTRUCTION**

1. During execution of work, the Contractor shall maintain a clean site and daily dispose of waste materials, debris, and rubbish properly to assure that roads and public properties are maintained free from accumulations of waste materials.

2. The Contractor shall provide appropriate containment of dust and debris.
3. The Contractor shall handle materials in a controlled manner with as few handlings as possible.
4. The Contractor shall schedule cleaning operations so that dust and other contaminants resulting from cleaning process will not fall on wet concrete or painted surfaces.
5. Daily, brush/sweep the trail and all hard surface areas affected by or where adjacent to Work.

## **INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSERS**

### **A. Proposal Document**

A complete set of official proposal documents may be obtained as noted in the Advertisement for Proposal. The original, on-line proposal documents are required to be used in preparing a proposal; the project owner and the landscape architect will not assume any responsibility for errors or misinterpretations resulting from the use of unofficial and/or incomplete proposal documents.

### **B. Project Familiarity**

Prior to submitting a project proposal, each proposer should make a complete examination of the proposal documents and plans and complete a site visit. Items of additional concern may include but are not limited to:

1. Examination of the specifications, photos, and other RFP documents.
2. Site visit to become familiar with proposed project conditions that may affect costs, progress, performance, or furnishing of the proposed work.
  - a. A mandatory site visit will be conducted on location at Bicentennial Park (600 S. 800 E., Clearfield, UT 84015) beginning at 9:30 am on Tuesday, April 14, 2026. Any proposers not present will have their proposal rejected.
3. Any questions or concerns with discrepancies of the proposal documents must be submitted electronically through the Bonfire website. All answers will be provided via Bonfire or in the form of an addendum. Any questions or submittal for clarification must be made by Thursday, April 16, 2026, at 3:00 p.m., which is the deadline. Interpretation and/or correction of the proposal documents shall be made only by official project addendum. Project addenda shall be made available for all prospective proposers and receipt thereof must be acknowledged with the proposal submitted.

4. Give consideration to federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations that may affect the costs, progress timetable, the performance, or completion of the work. Should the proposer fail to do any of the suggested foregoing standard research procedures, that omission shall not relieve the proposer from any proposal requirements with respect to his submitted proposal.

**C. Proposer's Responsibility**

The proposer is fully responsible to examine and understand all conditions of the RFP documents and elements associated with performing the work and the condition at the site.

1. The proposer shall review the accuracy of the site information.
2. A submittal of proposal will constitute an express representation by the proposer that the proposer understands the proposed work requirements and has complied with every requirement of the RFP documents.
3. Upon submittal of the electronic proposal through Bonfire, the proposer shall not claim that there was a misunderstanding concerning the scope of work or the quantities of work items.
4. The submitted proposal upon the premise of furnishing all the materials, equipment, tools, labor and services and performing the work as required by the RFP documents.
5. Proposers must hold an appropriate valid Utah Business License and be properly qualified to do business in the State of Utah.

**D. Proposal Security – Proposal Bond**

All proposed proposals must be accompanied by an electronic proposal security – proposal bond, which must be made payable to the project owner.

1. The proposal security – proposal bond must be in an amount of five (5) percent of the proposer's maximum proposal price.
2. A surety company acceptable to the owner must issue the submitted proposal bond.
3. The proposal security may be a certified check or a cashier's check made payable to the project Owner.

4. The project owner shall retain the proposal security – proposal bonds of all proposers that submit proposals, until a successful proposer has been selected and has executed a contractual agreement with the project owner. Following an executed contractual agreement with the successful proposer all retained proposal security documents – proposal bonds, shall be returned to all proposers’ who submitted proposals.
5. If the selected successful proposer fails to execute the contractual agreement, performance bonds, material and payment bonds and produce evidence of insurance within ten (10) days after notice of award, the owner may annul the notice of award, and the proposal security of the selected proposer will be forfeited.
6. The owner may retain the proposal security – proposal bonds of all proposers an additional three (3) days after the contractual date of the executed agreement.
7. Proposal security – proposal bonds submitted by proposers which the owner or landscape architect determine are not competitive may be returned within ten (10) days after the date of the proposal opening.

**E. Form of the Proposal**

All proposals shall be made on the original RFP documents. Except as allowed and noted in these proposal documents, proposals shall be submitted via Bonfire web site, using the online RFP documents.

1. The proposal must be prepared and submitted via Bonfire online RFP documents.
2. The proposal must contain:
  - a. No additions, deletions, or alterations to the proposal form or proposal document.
  - b. No unauthorized conditions, limitations, qualifications, or provisions may be included or attached to the proposal schedule.
  - c. No telegraphic proposals or telegraphic modifications of a proposal will be considered.
  - d. Violation of the above conditions may render the proposal unresponsive and may cause its rejection.
3. All proposals submitted by corporations must be executed in the corporate name of the company by the president or vice-president or other authorized corporate

officer. Proposals must include evidence of authority to sign, and the corporate seal affixed thereto.

4. All proposals submitted by partnerships shall be executed in the partnership's name and signed by a partner having authority on behalf of the partnership.
5. All proposals submitted must be signed by the proposer or the proposer's authorized representative.
6. All proposals submitted must have all names typed or printed below the signature and must be completed with an electronic signature.
7. All proposals submitted must contain an acknowledgment of receipt of all addenda (the number of addenda must be noted on the proposal documents).
8. All proposals submitted must include name/company name, address, phone number and email address of the proposer. This information must be shown for communications regarding the proposal.

**F. Delivery of the Proposal**

Proposals shall be submitted at the time and place indicated in the RFP documents.

1. The proposal documents shall be submitted via Bonfire web site online proposal documents, to Clearfield City.
2. Any proposal received after the scheduled closing date and time will not be accepted or considered.

**G. Withdrawal of the Proposal**

Any proposal may be modified or withdrawn by the proposer with a formal written request. The withdrawal or modification request must be signed by the proposer or his duly authorized representative. Such written requests must be delivered to Clearfield City's location stipulated in the request for proposal, prior to the proposal opening.

1. Should a prospective proposer wish to withdraw his proposal after the appointed proposal opening the following conditions must be demonstrated.
  - a. Withdrawal of a proposal must be within 24 hours of the proposal opening.
  - b. The withdrawal of a proposal must be properly signed and a written statement as to the reasons for the withdrawal.
  - c. Reasons for the proposal withdrawal may be as follows:
    - i. Material mistake with proposal schedule items,
    - ii. Legal conditions,

- iii. Other.
2. Only as provided above, the proposer may withdraw a proposal. No proposals may be withdrawn after the 24-hour withdrawal period which is immediately after the date and time of the proposal opening. Should there be reasons why the project cannot be awarded within the specified period, the time may be extended by mutual agreement between Clearfield City, and the proposer.

## **H. Proposal Opening**

All proposals will be electronically opened and read aloud publicly. All proposals shall be subject to acceptance by Clearfield City for a period of sixty (60) days after the day and time specified for the opening of the proposals.

## **I. Proposal Evaluation**

An individual review of each proposal will be completed following the opening. Each proposal will be evaluated by an evaluation committee composed of Clearfield City employees. The evaluation and selection committee has the option of requesting additional information to clarify any responses. Clearfield City reserves the right to negotiate changes in any proposal submitted.

Proposals will be evaluated in accordance with the following criteria, listed in descending order of importance:

1. Experience and expertise of Contractor for services (company profile).
2. References / Site visits.
3. Cost / Fees.
4. Management experience.

The City will evaluate each proposal submitted based on the responsiveness to the City's overall needs. The award of contract, if made, will be the vendor(s) who is (are) responsive and responsible to all administrative and technical requirements of the RFP; who have demonstrated competence and qualifications in regard to providing the services required; the cost and price for the services, and who receives the highest rating based upon all of the criteria set forth in the RFP.

1. 20% Responsiveness to the proposal
2. 20% Experience and expertise
3. 30% Warranty
4. 30% Total Cost

### **A. Required Proposal Specifications, each proposal must include (Failure to include ALL of these items may disqualify a proposer's proposal):**

1. Provide at least three references from current customers. References from comparable facilities on size and function would be preferable. Clearfield City reserves the right to visit each site.
2. Company profile including history, size of company, staffing and other relevant information. Include work experience and background information on the supervisors who will be directly responsible for the work crews.
  - a. Include related information on other principle management team members who will have responsibility for the contract.
  - b. Identify the supervisor to workforce ratio.
  - c. Identify any and all training that crew members receive prior to and during contract period.
  - d. Identify approximate size of crews involved in performing the services.
3. Copy of current registration with the State of Utah, Division of Corporation showing named organization.
4. Cost Summary Sheet.
5. Please identify equipment that vendor will provide in the scope of the contract services.

**J. Award of the Proposal Contract**

Clearfield City reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to waive any and all informalities not involving proposal price, time, or changes in the required work, and to negotiate contract terms with the successful proposer.

1. Clearfield City further reserves the right to disregard any and all nonconforming, nonresponsive, unbalanced, or conditional proposals.
2. Clearfield City further reserves the right to reject the proposal of any proposer, should Clearfield City believe it would not be in the best interest of Clearfield City to make an award to the proposer, whether because that proposal is non-responsive, or the proposer is unqualified or of doubtful financial ability, or fails to meet any other pertinent standards or criteria established by Clearfield City.
3. Clearfield City may consider the qualifications and experience of the proposer, the subcontractors, suppliers and other organizations or persons proposed for portions of the required work.
  - a. The apparent low proposer, if required, shall supply the names and addresses of suppliers, subcontractors and other persons performing portions of the required work.
  - b. Clearfield City may also consider the potential project costs, the proposer's projected operating costs, project maintenance requirements, and guarantees

of major items of the materials and equipment proposed for incorporation into the proposed project.

- c. Clearfield City shall have the right to require the proposal to prepare and submit within 10 days additional evidence, such as financial statements, previous work experience, present workload commitments, and other similar information.
4. Clearfield City may investigate the abilities and standings of the proposal as deemed necessary in the evaluation of any proposal.
5. The proposed project, if awarded, may be awarded to the most responsible proposer. The submitted proposal may or may not be awarded to the financially lowest price proposer. The project award will be considered, granted or rejected in the best interest of Clearfield City.
6. If the proposed project is to be awarded, Clearfield City will give the successful proposer a "Notice of Award" within 45 days from the date of the proposal opening, unless a longer waiting period before project award is expressly provided in a written addendum.

**K. Contractual Agreement**

A contractual agreement between Clearfield City and the successful proposer will be required.

1. The successful proposer shall secure and furnish to Clearfield City all Certificates of Insurance, as required by the proposal documents. Certificates of Insurance shall be submitted to the Community Services Department and approved by Clearfield City prior to entering into the contractual agreement.
2. Failure or refusal of the proposer to enter into and deliver the contractual agreement as required in the proposal documents or to comply with any of the requirements connected thereto shall be just cause for annulment of the award. If the proposer fails or refuses to execute the contractual agreement, Clearfield City may award the project to the next lowest and/or responsible proposer.

**L. Execution of the Contract by Clearfield City**

Upon completion and submittal of all notices and certificates of insurance, Clearfield City shall authorize the designated representative to execute the contractual agreement documents with the successful proposer. All contractual documentation required in the proposal documents will be prepared in duplicate. Distribution of the original document copies shall be to 1) Clearfield City, 2) and the successful proposer.

**M. Notice to Proceed**

Notice to proceed shall be issued upon the execution of the contractual agreement by Clearfield City following the project planning meeting.

**L. Insurance**

When a proposal agreement is awarded, an insurance certificate must be submitted. Insurance shall: (1) name the Clearfield City as an additional insured; (2) be cancelable; provided, that no cancellation thereof may be made without first giving Clearfield City at least ten (10) days' prior written notice; and (3) be in sums sufficient to fully protect Clearfield City and its interests. All corporate guarantors or sureties shall be licensed to do business in the state and shall be sound and reputable firms.

1. Certification of insurance must be submitted by the successful proposer to Clearfield City which meets the minimum insurance requirements (see attached Insurance Requirements).

## PROPOSAL SCOPE OF WORK

### 1. Scope of the Proposal

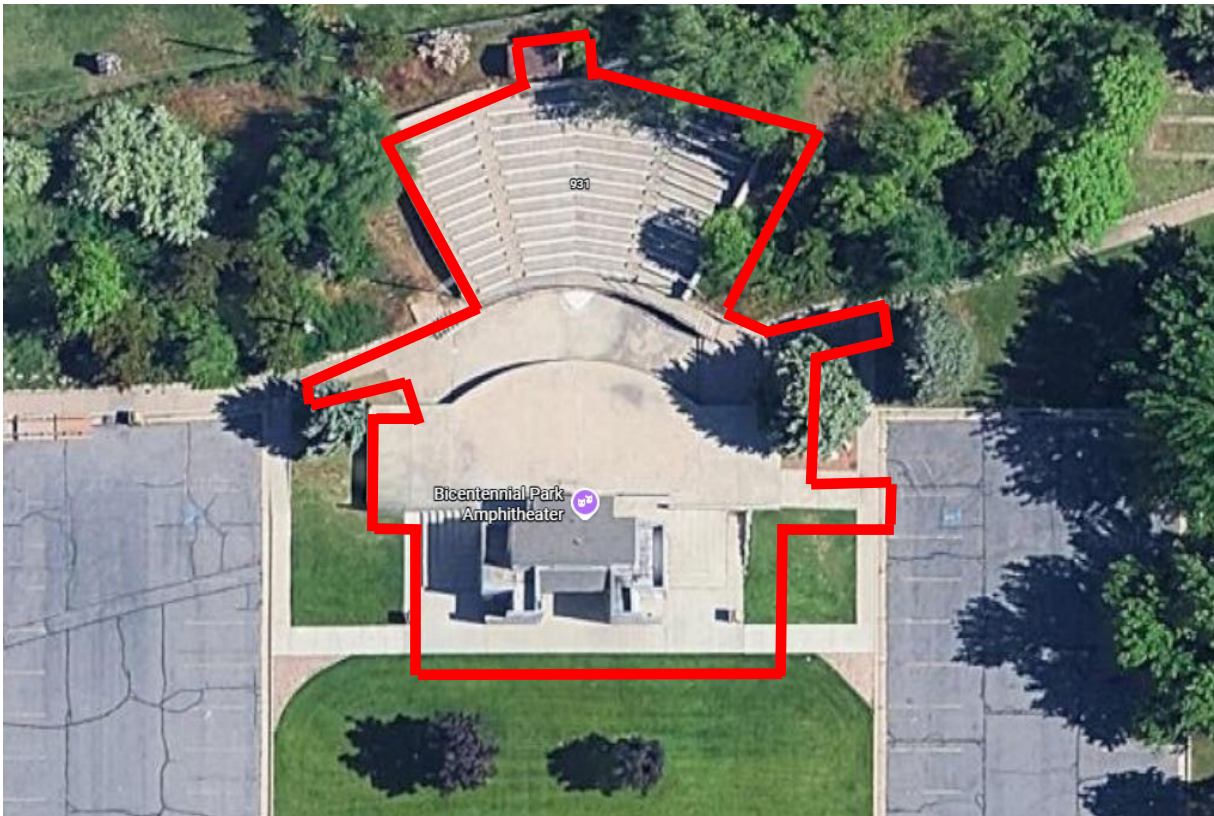
The scope of the project has been defined in general terms and conditions in the Request for Proposals. A short synopsis of the proposed work, labor required, and materials proposed has also been given there. The proposer must fully investigate the contract documents, drawings and make investigation at the site in order to fully understand the proposed project.

Furnish all necessary labor, materials, and equipment to provide demolition services for the following facility in accordance with the following and the attached instructions, requirements, and specifications. The City may be able to provide up to 3 drivers and vehicles to assist with the disposal of the demolished materials. The City has spot checked a few walls and have found no asbestos in the CMU.

**Please include a separate proposal amount for each of the following items.**

#### 1. Technical Specifications and Scope of Work

- a. Demolition of site
- b. Disposal of demolition materials
- c. Fill and rough grade of demolition area
- d. Disconnect, mark and cap existing site utilities (water, sewer, electricity)



## **2. Measurements**

Proposers will be responsible for their own measurements and must submit a firm price accordingly. There will be no adjustments, for increase or decrease of footage required for the job; therefore, the total offer must be based on the accurate measurements by proposers during the inspection. Failure to do so will be at the proposer's risk.

## **3. Taxes/Licenses**

Retail taxes and rental taxes and licensing are the responsibility of the Proposer and shall be handled in accordance with Utah State Statutes.

The successful Proposer shall be responsible for and, at its own expense, in obtaining all necessary permits, pay all licenses, fees and taxes required to comply with all local laws and ordinances; county, state and federal laws, rules and regulations which are applicable to the business to be carried on under this contract.

### **B. Firm Price Clause**

The prices submitted shall be the maximum allowed during the contract period.

### **C. Proposal Response Format**

**All proposals MUST include:**

1. **Experience/Expertise:** This includes qualification and work experience of at least three (3) and no more than five (5) comparable facilities that are currently using your company's services. Please include location of facility, company name, contact name, phone, and current contract dates. Actual photos of completed projects will score higher on the evaluation.
2. **Cost Proposal.** Cost will be evaluated independently from the technical proposal. Please enumerate all costs associated with the proposal, including design and engineering.

### **D. Contract Price Adjustment.**

The scope of the work may be increased or decreased at the discretion of the Owner after the contract is awarded. During the execution of the contract, the scope of the contract may be further adjusted at the option of the Owner. The contractual proposer shall be allowed no additional claims other than those stated in the contract documents.

## PROPOSER'S EXPERIENCE CERTIFICATION

The award of the proposed contract, if awarded, will not be based upon the submitted proposed proposal price alone. The award will also be based upon the experience and the ability of the proposer to begin and carry out the proposed work. The project proposal must complete this mandatory "Proposer's Experience Certification" online at Bonfire. Should the proposer fail to complete in full and submit the "Proposer's Experience Certification" with the tendered online proposal documents, the proposal may be rejected and considered a non-responsive proposal.
