4. **Discuss and Vote on ordering 2 engines for future replacement** - District is still playing catch up with apparatus needs. The equipment distributors are three years out on build times for these trucks. The district is working on vehicle replacement for La Verkin and Springdale. We are replacing twenty-year-old front-line fire engines that on average have a life expectancy of approximately fifteen years. Currently we have on order six ambulances, a fire engine, a ladder, two brush trucks, and three wildland brush trucks. This will get us back to current equipment needs. To ensure lower prices the District will sign a contract locking in the current cost and will only be responsible to pay upon delivery of new apparatus.

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5. Update on design of Sation 41 (Sand Hollow)

Board members presented with the newest design and a brief progress report from Chief Decker. The District is moving into engineering plans for the new station 41 administration building, located on the northern side of Sand Hollow. Our goal is to break ground by July or early August. This station design is referred to as a neighborhood design, meaning future builds will have the same basic layout without the administration area. The next upcoming stations planned for the District include 3000 S Hurricane, Silver Cliffs, Virgin, and Kolob. The new stations will give the District majority coverage for our ISO ratings, which reflects our operational readiness. The thought process and idea for this building design is forward thinking and planning for future growth. Everything the District has planned for this building is much needed, with the design to last the District at least fifty years of growth. The District will likely be moving to private bonding and a thirty-year note.

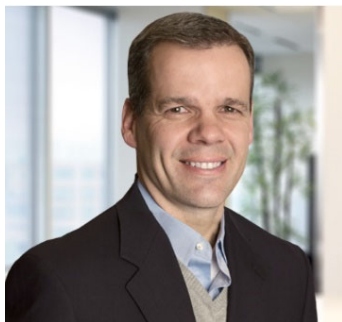

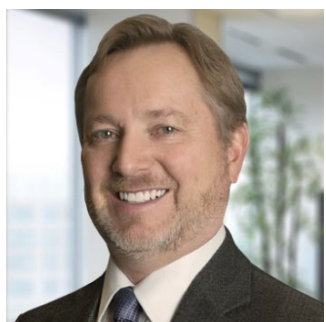

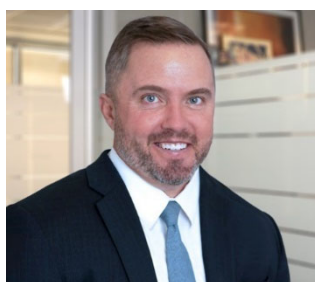
