Background

The subject parcel, W-BVTM-4, consists of approximately 0.17 acres and is currently zoned C-2 with a general plan designation for commercial use. The property is located at the easternmost portion of a larger approximately 8-acre area to the west, which is also City-owned. This smaller parcel was created through a minor subdivision to separate it from the larger parcel due to the existing structure on site. A disposition of surplus property was already completed for the parent parcel, the small parcel was not included at that time.

Washington City Ordinance 6-2-2, Disposal of Excess City Property, Section 6-2-2(H), requires that the public be given an opportunity to comment on the proposed disposal of a significant parcel of City-owned real property.

What is an impact fee?

An impact fee is a one-time payment that helps pay for the water facilities needed to serve new homes—such as pipelines, storage and treatment infrastructure. These facilities ensure your home has a safe and reliable water supply, now and in the future.

How are fees established?

Impact fees are calculated using a detailed analysis required by the Utah Impact Fees Act. This analysis estimates the cost of new water infrastructure needed to serve growth. The district's current Impact Fee Facilities Plan and Analysis is available at wcwcd.gov.

When are fees due?

Impact fees are due when a building permit is applied for and before it is issued.

What is an ultra-water efficient residential connection?

Single-family connections that meet the district's Ultra Water Efficiency Standards (UWES).

The UWES is a voluntary initiative aimed at conserving water, lowering costs, and promoting long-term housing sustainability across the region.



Program requirements include:

- A.** Municipal adoption of the program.
- B.** Compliance with the adopted UWES requirements.
- C.** Recorded documents including:
 - i.) Plat note with required language signed by a district representative.
 - ii.) Water Conservation Easement.
 - iii.) HOA governing documents (where applicable).

The district provides the required language and forms, which are available on wcwcd.gov.

Homes in Ultra Water Efficient Developments are subject to the Excess Water Use Surcharge for water use above 8,000 gallons per month.

Perpetual development requirements include:

- A.** Connection to a public water and sewer system.
- B.** Smart water meters.
- C.** Maximum of 2,000 square feet of drip-irrigated landscape, lawn prohibited.
- D.** No private swimming pools, private spas allowed up to 100 square feet.

Washington City formally acknowledges its approval of the Ultra Water Efficiency Standards (UWES) program as adopted by the Washington County Water Conservancy District.

In accordance with the program requirements, Washington City confirms its intent to implement and support the UWES framework within its jurisdiction. Specifically:

1. **Municipal Approval and Implementation**

The City acknowledges the UWES program as a voluntary, perpetual water conservation initiative and supports its application to qualifying developments within Washington City.

2. **Billing and Surcharge Administration**

The City agrees to administer and collect applicable water rates for UWES properties, including the Excess Water Use Surcharge for monthly water use exceeding 8,000 gallons, in accordance with District requirements.

3. **Permitting and Development Compliance**

Through its development review, permitting, and inspection processes, the City will make reasonable and good-faith efforts to ensure compliance with UWES requirements. This includes reviewing proposed improvements and, where applicable and legally permissible, restricting or denying non-compliant features.

In particular, the City will make reasonable efforts to prevent the installation of prohibited or restricted features on UWES-designated properties, including:

- Traditional turf lawns, which are prohibited under the program, and
- Private swimming pools, which are not permitted (with limited allowance for small spas as defined by the program).

4. **Coordination with District Requirements**

The City will coordinate with the District and developers to ensure appropriate plat notes, conservation easements, and related documentation are incorporated into applicable projects, and that compliance is verified through normal inspection and code enforcement processes.

Washington City recognizes the importance of long-term water conservation and sustainable growth in the region and is committed to supporting the successful implementation of the Ultra Water Efficiency Standards.

- Progress photos 1 - 3 of the Lakeside Open Space Trail System

The applicant is requesting approval to amend the site plan zoning map by adding “Evaporation Pond” as a commercial zoning designation and reallocating Open Space so that the Open Space acreage remains the same. The proposed changes are as follows:

- Add 1 acre of “Evaporation Pond” to the commercial zoning designation which is located at the very north end of the development adjacent to Washington Fields Road.

- Reallocate 1 acre of Open Space as follows.
 - Change .5 acre of Low Density to Open Space in pod 17
 - Change .5 acre of Medium Density to Open Space in pod 8

Recommendation

The Planning Commission reviewed this request on March 4th, 2026 and unanimously recommended approval, onto the City Council, based on the following findings below.

Findings

1. That the requested zoning conforms to the intent of the land use designation of the General Plan.
2. That the requested zoning amendment will be compatible with surrounding developments.
3. That no other changes (only those as outlined above and in the attached exhibits) are implied to the remaining Alaia PCD project plan.

Alaia Landscaping Narrative

April 1, 2026

General Landscaping:

It's understandable that assumptions are being made about the lack of new landscaping that has been installed in the project since we purchased Stucki Farms in 2024. However, there are a couple of key points to understand.

First, we inherited open space areas that should've been landscaped years before our acquisition of the project by the previous developer/ownership group. One of those areas is the detention basin at the corner of Stucki Farms PKWY and Washington Fields Road along with the adjacent medians and streetscape along the westside of Washington Fields Road. Anytime we start development of a parcel in Alaia, we calculate and assign a development budget that also includes landscaping. Since this area had already been developed by South Landing Development and they had also captured the bulk of the revenue from the attached lot sales, we initially didn't have funds allocated for landscaping this area after our purchase. As we have developed other parcels and sold those, we have been able to allocate funds to address this area, which we understand is a priority for Washington City and our residents.

Second, in order to install landscaping, water service is a necessity. This area until recently did not have any nearby water meters. As a condition of our purchase in 2024, the previous developer/ownership group had committed to pay the associated water impact fees to have water meters set. Without disclosing exact numbers, the impact fees paid to date have run well north of several hundred thousand dollars. The timing of the submitted water meter applications along with the payments of the impact fees has not been as quick as we had hoped and planned for, but John Hehnke in Public Works and Melanie Hansen at the WCWCD have been very supportive and helpful with processing those applications and payments from South Landing Development.

While waiting for water meters, we engaged LandWorks to update and finish the initial landscape design created by Jeff Peay at Civil Science. We feel our current design will elevate specific areas of importance like the arrival experience in Alaia, the roundabouts and the entrances to our Villages and Farmhouse. And, it's a design that is mindful of water consumption and water conservation. We are not planning turf in park strips and other pocket park areas throughout the property like the previous developer/ownership group.

Future Landscaping Areas:

Please see the attached Washington Fields Road Phasing Plan, which depicts three specific phases along the westside of Washington Fields Road. Phase 1 (the detention basin at the corner of Stucki Farms PKWY and Washington Fields Road, the adjacent medians and streetscape along the westside of Washington Fields Road behind the homes in Crossroads PH1 and PH2). For a more detailed view of the planned landscaping for this area, please reference the attached Phase 1 (L1.1) Landscape Design. You'll notice that we are making a significant investment in the quality of our landscaping regarding the types of trees, shrubs, etc. At this time, we do not have

budgets set aside and allocated for Phase 2 or Phase 3. Phase 2 is currently experiencing considerable construction activity and Phase 3 has yet to be developed. Any new landscaping installed in these two phases would be either greatly damaged or in the way of future development.

Timeline for Washington Fields Road Phase 1 Landscaping:

April 1st - April 30th

- Approve final changes to Phase 1 (L1.1) Landscape Design
- Complete site preparation to Phase 1 to identify and fix legacy drainage issues from Crossroads PH1 and PH2
- Send Phase 1 Landscape Design out to bid (5 - 6 installation contractors)

May 1st - May 30th

- Modify budget and changes to Phase 1 based on bids and feedback
- Finalize contract with installation contractor
- Calendar start date with installation contractor based on availability
- Coordinate procurement of landscape materials with contractor and suppliers

We've also attached other plan sets for future areas to be landscaped within Alaia for your review. Again, these areas will be landscaped as the adjacent parcels are developed and the surrounding construction activities have stabilized, so the new landscaping isn't greatly damaged.

Open Space Currently Being Landscaped:

Please see the Lakeside Open Space Phase 1 Landscape (L1.1 - L1.3) Designs. We have been actively installing this open space trail area with landscaping and lighting since February. For reference, the Phase 1 design, landscaping and lighting for this open space area will exceed \$450,000 not including water impact fees for the 2 new water meters servicing this area. We anticipate the installation of the landscaping to be completed within the next 2 - 3 weeks. See the attached progress photos.

Maintenance Areas in Alaia:

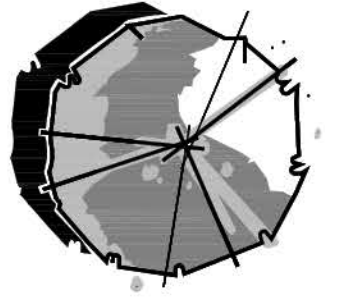
We have three types of landscape maintenance areas in Alaia. The first, our HOA controlled areas, look acceptable, but there is room for improvement. The general feedback from homeowners has been mostly positive. In December, in an effort to improve the maintenance of these areas, we replaced our landscape maintenance contractor. However, due to turnover at HOA Living (CAM), our HOA property management group, the new contractor (BrightView) wasn't given clear guidance on short-term expectations and needs. Since February, we've been working directly with BrightView to fill the communication gaps and to improve these areas for our residents. The second landscape maintenance area, which includes parcels and lots owned by private owners and/or builders, needs more attention. Last fall, HOA Living notified these owners to maintain their parcels and lots (remove trash and mitigate weeds). Otherwise, HOA Living will contract to do it for them and invoice these owners for the associated costs. The third landscape maintenance area, which includes areas

owned and controlled by Preserve at Stucki Farms, will also get more attention going forward. We've hired an independent maintenance contractor to maintain these areas going forward until they are turned over to the HOA. BrightView has also committed to oversee the maintenance of some of these areas, because we've had issues with weeds in these areas seeding the other maintenance areas.

Weed Mitigation Activities:

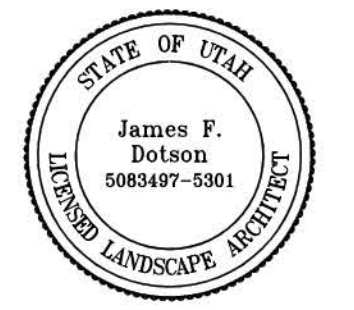
This week pre-emergent and post-emergent were applied by BrightView to the first and third landscape maintenance areas. Due to the recent rain, they have committed to reapply the post-emergent on Saturday. During the next 2 - 3 weeks our independent maintenance contractor will be scraping the weeds along several of our major roadways including Washington Fields Road. We believe these activities will make a significant difference this summer regarding the prevalence of weeds and debris within our project.

Background Information:

Based on the code changes from December 2023 and discussions in our Council Retreat, the process for RAP Tax grants has changed. Applicants have been asked to give a brief outline of their request in 2 minutes or less. The Council approved a maximum of \$50,000 in the 2025/2026 budget for RAP Tax grants.

The Council also added this language as a guide for approval of grants: Due to the limited amount of RAP tax revenue that will be allotted to Washington City, the funds awarded by the Washington City Council shall be limited to entities located within Washington City or which provide significant tax revenue to Washington City. All other projects outside of Washington City have the ability to petition Washington County or other cities for funding.

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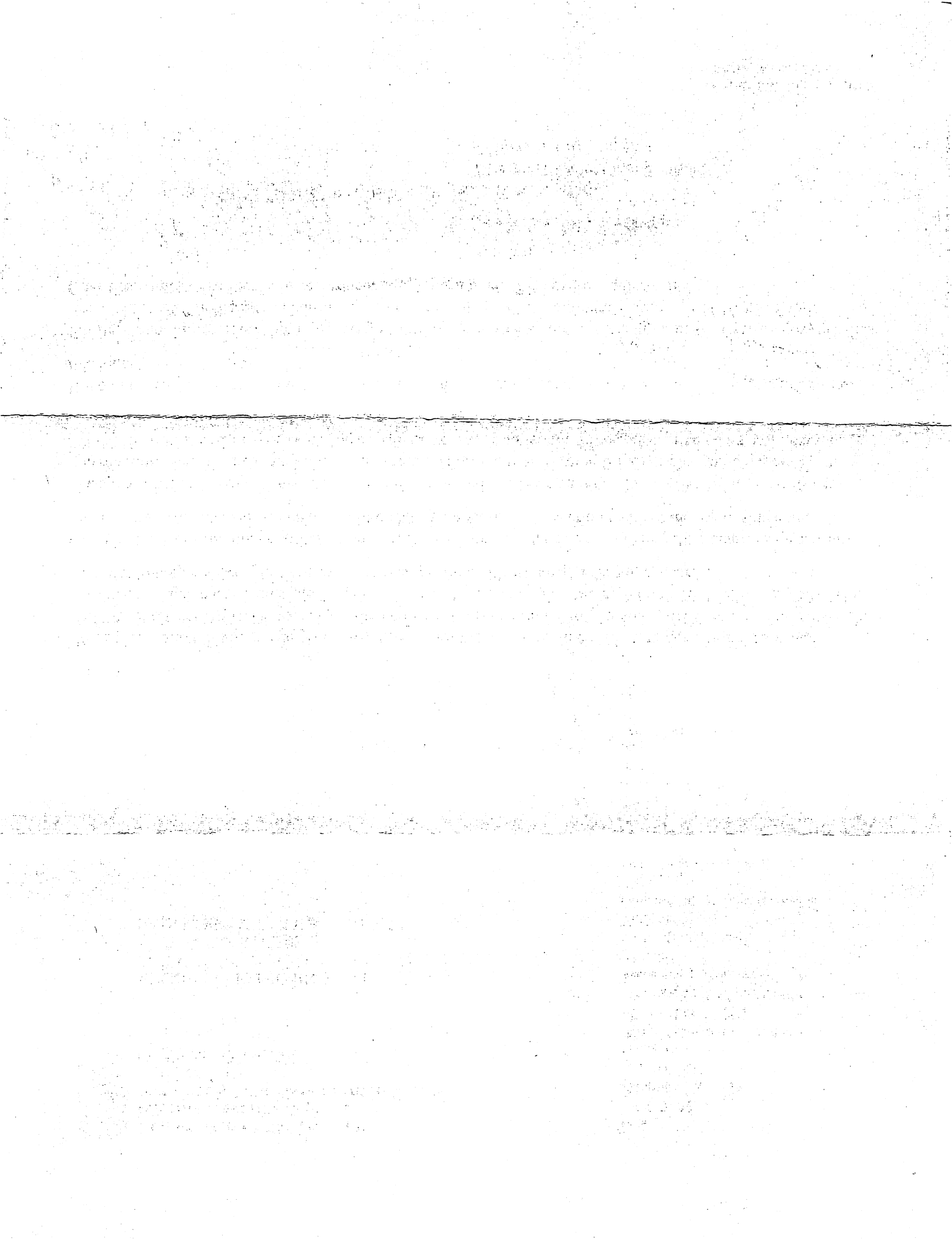

Describe in general terms the concept and objectives of the project:

Encore Performing Arts creates educational theater experiences for both younger and older young artists. Our Senior series is dedicated to ages 13-18 and emphasizes teaching life skills through unparalleled arts education, mentorship, and extraordinary theater experiences. These professional-quality shows deliver a high-quality theater experience for patrons while teaching the young artists: Critical thinking and complex problem-solving, Giving and receiving constructive criticism, Communication, Confidence, Leadership, & Empathy. Our Senior productions also include our Show with a Pro series, which features professional, adult actors, directors, and/or other production and creative staff. These shows give the young artists valuable exposure to the mentorship of professionals in the field.

We perform four Senior productions per year, and they average around \$25,000 to put on. Some of our past shows include "Anastasia," "Les Miserables," and our original production of the classic "A Christmas Carol." Our future shows will include "The Lion King" and "Peter and the Star Catcher."

This funding will help us to give more scholarships to young artists in need. We feel that money shouldn't be a barrier to arts education in our community.

What is the artistic or cultural rationale for this project? How will the project contribute to artistic/cultural development within Washington City?

As you know, arts education is extremely important, especially for the youth. Art teaches things about life and culture and the world around us that other things can't teach. And particularly

performing arts teaches these things in a way that sticks with them because they actually get to live the experiences, for a time anyway. In addition to teaching life skills through theater skills, we also teach the young performers about our culture through the context of the plays we perform. What follows are specific examples of how just a few of the plays taught our young performers about the world around us.

During Les Mis, we learned quite a bit about the French Revolution, its aftermath with Napoleon, and the specific battle the play centers around, the June Rebellion, in 1832. Anastasia brought a similar lesson with the Bolshevik Revolution and the rise of the Soviets, plus the added fun of 1920s Paris and the Jazz Revolution. Our production of Seven Brides for Seven Brothers taught about westward expansion and the toughness that was required of our forebears in 1850s Oregon. All of these productions provided the young performers with insight into what it was like to be a revolutionary; they stepped into the shoes of Jean Valjean, Adam Pontipee, and Anya/Anastasia Romanov to experience what it was like to live in history.

All of this is to say that we not only provide quality arts education and real-life skill applications, but we are also able to reveal our culture through the experiences of the characters they're bringing to life. That's the whole point of art, to reveal our culture. Plays do that, and we love that we get to do that for our young artists.

Who are the potential beneficiaries of this project? Please specify numbers and ages, etc.

The Senior productions serve 120-150 young performers each year, aged 13-18 years.

How specifically will this project contribute to overall Washington City growth and economic development?

Encore Performing Arts is located in Washington City. We also employ team members who are located in Washington City, as well as many performers who live there as well (the young artists are not compensated). These factors contribute to job creation for your residents. All of our productions are open to the public and advertised all over Washington County. While we usually perform in St. George, we would be stimulating Washington's economy by using local contractors and suppliers for costumes, props, sets, advertising, etc.

How will this project enable a demonstrable incremental increase of new/expanded entity offerings as opposed to helping fund already existing offerings?

While this program does exist, we are always looking for ways to give more scholarships to young performers in need. As I said above, we feel like money shouldn't be a barrier to participating in the arts. By expanding our scholarship offerings, we are opening up more space for arts in our community.

How will the applicant entity promote and attribute the project as having been enabled by RAP Tax funding? What project promotional materials will contain the Washington City RAP Tax logo. How can elements of a project be promoted at being "made possible through RAP Tax funding"?

All RAP logos are listed on our website and on each playbill. We would love the opportunity to fund an entire show with RAP funding, in which case we would put the logo on the front of the playbill with the language, "XYZ production brought to you by XYZ RAP Tax Funding."

Our Senior series is our biggest program. It's one of five programs we have at Encore Performing arts, but being the biggest means that the cost is more. At this time we usually have four Senior series productions, and the revenue/costs reflect doing those four shows. By receiving RAP funding we will be able to provide more scholarships for youth in need. We've been able to give around \$1,700 per show in scholarships, which is enough for about six participants. This grant would allow us to at double the amount of needy youth we can serve.

Describe the timeline for completing this project including the starting date as well as various phases or stages throughout the project until its completion.

We started this project in January 2026 and will complete it December 2026. The Senior program's season line up: Anastasia, February-March 2026; The Lion King, June-July 2026; TBD production, July-September 2026; and A Christmas Carol, November-December, 2026.

A RESOLUTION DISTRIBUTING THE RECREATIONAL, ARTS,
AND PARKS TAX IN WASHINGTON CITY TO ENCORE PERFORMING ARTS

WHEREAS, Washington County submitted a ballot opinion question to the residents of the county pursuant to state law, on November 4, 2014, allowing the residents to vote on whether to impose a one tenth of one percent (1/10th of 1% sales and use tax ("RAP tax")) for the purpose of funding recreational and cultural facilities and organizations such as the following:

- A. Publicly owned or operated athletic fields, parks, playgrounds, gymnasiums, swimming pools, campgrounds, trails, or other facilities used for recreational purposes; and
- B. Non-profit organizations, institutions, and municipal or county cultural councils having as their primary purpose the advancement and preservation of art, music, theater, dance, cultural arts, or natural history; and

WHEREAS, the Washington City Council entered into an Interlocal Agreement with Washington County and other municipal corporations within the county (St. George, Hurricane, Santa Clara, Ivins, Enterprise, Toquerville, LaVerkin, Springdale, Leeds, Virgin, Rockville, Apple Valley, Hildale, and New Harmony (collectively "Municipalities")) regarding the distribution of potential RAP tax revenue in order to ensure that the distribution of the RAP tax revenue is fair to residents, and ensure that the Municipalities and the County work together to improve recreation, arts, and parks throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, the residents voted yes to support the tax and the tax became operative on April 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, Utah Code Section 59-12-703 authorizes the County and the Municipalities to expend RAP tax revenues collected to fund cultural and recreational facilities as well as to fund the ongoing operating expenses of recreational and cultural facilities, as these terms are defined in state law, within the County and Municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that awarding the RAP Tax is in the best interest of the citizens of Washington City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Washington City Council hereby approves the distribution of RAP tax for fiscal year 2026-2027 which distribution is shown below, and shall become effective on April 8, 2026.

Describe in general terms the concept and objectives of the project:

The advancement of the arts is an initiative of the Washington City Arts Council (WCAC), designed to strengthen, sustain, and expand access to arts throughout Washington City. WCAC's core objectives are to support local artists, preserve and celebrate cultural heritage, and improve quality of life through inclusive arts education, exhibitions, performances and public events. By providing professional development opportunities, public exhibits, and hands-on workshops, WCAC advances artistic growth while encouraging community economic health and civic engagement. Through community partnerships and accessible programming, the Washington City Arts Council seeks to ensure that the arts remain a visible and essential part of Washington City's present and future.

What is the artistic or cultural rationale for this project? How will the project contribute to artistic/cultural development within Washington City?

WCAC's work helps Washington City grow as a place where creativity is welcomed and celebrated by both residents and visitors. Through year-round events, exhibits, and hands-on workshops for all ages, the Washington City Arts Council invites people to explore the arts while building creative and practical skills. By offering opportunities for youth and adults alike, we support academic, social, and personal growth—and encourage imagination, problem-solving, and thoughtful, creative thinking along the way.

The WCAC Board believes the arts are strongest when the community comes together. That's why we collaborate with partners such as the Washington City Historical Society, Washington Cotton Days Committee, Washington City Concert Band, Utah Tech University, Washington City Council,

Southern Utah Weavers, Dixie Watercolor Society, and the Southern Utah Art Guild to develop programming that celebrates our shared history and creative talents through the arts. These partnerships create practical opportunities for local artists to be seen and heard. Events such as our Artisan Holiday Market and Spring Gala give artists a place to showcase their work, grow professionally, and connect with the community—helping reinforce Washington City’s identity as a vital and supportive arts community.

Who are the potential beneficiaries of this project? Please specify numbers and ages, etc.

The primary beneficiaries of this project are residents of Washington City (pop. 35,000+) and the surrounding region (pop. 210,000+), including adults, families, and school-age children. WCAC programs are intentionally designed to serve a broad age range, from youth and teens to adults and seniors, ensuring inclusive access to arts education and cultural experiences for the entire community. Through hands-on learning and public events, participants gain opportunities to develop creative skills, cultural awareness, and community connections.

- Art Education Programs:

WCAC offers monthly art workshops that typically serve 15–30 participants per session. These workshops are open to adults and youth (generally ages 8 and up, depending on the medium) and frequently fill to capacity, often with waiting lists. In addition, more than 400 individuals have subscribed to our Workshops email list to be notified of future workshop offerings, demonstrating strong and growing community demand. These workshops benefit participants by fostering artistic skill development, creative confidence, and lifelong engagement in the arts.

- Artisan Holiday Market:

The Artisan Holiday Market benefits a wide range of artists, artisans, and creative small businesses, including emerging and established artists, students, and cottage food producers. Estimated attendance at the 2025 Holiday Market was between 750-1,000. We hope to grow this celebration in the coming years so that it becomes a destination event in the heart of Washington City.

- Secondary Beneficiaries:

Secondary beneficiaries include tourists and visitors to Washington City who attend WCAC events and programs. These visitors gain access to locally produced art and cultural experiences, while their presence supports the local economy and strengthens Washington City’s identity as a vital arts and cultural hub. WCAC hopes to integrate its programming with the City’s Downtown District development project currently underway.

How specifically will this project contribute to overall Washington City growth and economic development?

WCAC is proud to be a committed arts and cultural resource in Washington City, offering year-round programs that add creativity and connection to everyday life. Through public events, workshops, festivals, and exhibits, we bring people of all ages and backgrounds together to enjoy the arts. Along the way, we support local artists, attract visitors to our community, and help boost nearby small businesses like restaurants, shops, and vendors.

RAP funds will allow us to increase accessibility and enhance the quality of WCAC's programming. This includes workshops for youth and adults, presenting professional exhibitions, and organizing large-scale events like art festivals and markets that attract both residents and visitors. These events create meaningful community experiences, and by investing in the arts RAP funds help cultivate a lively and diverse artistic environment that contributes to the overall quality of life in Washington City and reinforces the arts as a driver of economic development.

How will this project enable a demonstrable incremental increase of new/expanded entity offerings as opposed to helping fund already existing offerings?

RAP funds will allow us to expand and enhance our current arts programming by increasing the number of community workshops, exhibitions, and public events we offer throughout the year. With additional support, we can reach underserved populations (e.g. low-income families, seniors, individuals with developmental disabilities, Indigenous communities, veterans, rural communities, developing artists, etc.), introduce new artistic disciplines, and bring in guest instructors to elevate the quality and diversity of our offerings. These funds will also help us expand our marketing efforts and provide better materials and facilities for participants. Overall, RAP funding will enable appreciable growth for our programs, allowing us to serve more residents while deepening the impact of our arts programming within Washington City and across Washington County.

RESOLUTION R2026-XX
A RESOLUTION DISTRIBUTING THE RECREATIONAL, ARTS,
AND PARKS TAX IN WASHINGTON CITY TO WASHINGTON CITY ARTS COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Washington County submitted a ballot opinion question to the residents of the county pursuant to state law, on November 4, 2014, allowing the residents to vote on whether to impose a one tenth of one percent (1/10th of 1% sales and use tax ("RAP tax")) for the purpose of funding recreational and cultural facilities and organizations such as the following:

- A. Publicly owned or operated athletic fields, parks, playgrounds, gymnasiums, swimming pools, campgrounds, trails, or other facilities used for recreational purposes; and
- B. Non-profit organizations, institutions, and municipal or county cultural councils having as their primary purpose the advancement and preservation of art, music, theater, dance, cultural arts, or natural history; and

WHEREAS, the Washington City Council entered into an Interlocal Agreement with Washington County and other municipal corporations within the county (St. George, Hurricane, Santa Clara, Ivins, Enterprise, Toquerville, LaVerkin, Springdale, Leeds, Virgin, Rockville, Apple Valley, Hildale, and New Harmony (collectively "Municipalities")) regarding the distribution of potential RAP tax revenue in order to ensure that the distribution of the RAP tax revenue is fair to residents, and ensure that the Municipalities and the County work together to improve recreation, arts, and parks throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, the residents voted yes to support the tax and the tax became operative on April 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, Utah Code Section 59-12-703 authorizes the County and the Municipalities to expend RAP tax revenues collected to fund cultural and recreational facilities as well as to fund the ongoing operating expenses of recreational and cultural facilities, as these terms are defined in state law, within the County and Municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that awarding the RAP Tax is in the best interest of the citizens of Washington City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Washington City Council hereby approves the distribution of RAP tax for fiscal year 2026-2027 which distribution is shown below, and shall become effective on April 8, 2026.
