March 18, 2026**

Huntington City Council met in its regularly scheduled council meeting March 18, 2026 at the city office building located at 20 South Main Street. Meeting started at 6:30 p.m. with Mayor Leonard Norton presiding.

Mike Greenan expressed gratitude to Scott Gordon and Robert Baker for helping his mother and reminded residents, if you see something, say something. He also addressed the council about the intersection between the cemetery and Canyonview Middle school.

JR Bird introduced himself to the council and informed them that he is running for House District 67.

Agenda Item 9. Mayor's Report

Mayor Norton reminded residents that with the arrival of spring, they should begin cleaning up their yards and assist neighbors who may need help. He addressed ongoing issues at the city dumpster site, emphasizing that it is for Huntington residents only. Dumping of concrete, dirt, or other prohibited materials is not allowed. Individuals found in violation may be required to cover cleanup costs. Residents were also asked to remove trash cans from the street in a timely manner. Mayor Norton expressed appreciation to office staff for their work on the Title 9 ordinance, as well as to city and maintenance staff for their efforts in keeping the community clean. He reported that an advertisement has been placed in the newspaper for a flower watering position and a custodial worker. Castle Valley Special Service District (CVSSD) has completed its project involving the replacement and addition of isolation valves. A secondary water line has also been installed on 350 East, with final completion expected in July. Secondary water service is tentatively scheduled to begin on April 15.

Agenda Item 10. Department Reports

Fire Department: NO FIRE REPORT WAS GIVEN

Maintenance Department: Scott Gordon reported that snow plows have been removed and placed in storage. The shop has been prepared for annual maintenance on city vehicles. Staff have begun preparing the parks for the season and have repaired a broken water line.

Agenda Item 11. Youth City Council Reports

Gloria Wilson expressed appreciation to the Youth City Council for their assistance in preparing Easter eggs for the upcoming Easter egg hunt. The event is scheduled for Saturday, March 28 at 10:00 a.m. at Lions Park.

Agenda Item 12. Council's Reports

Gloria Wilson reported that the sign at the cemetery has been removed and will be powder coated. She has also held discussions with the Mayor regarding proposed improvements.

Judd Beagley reported that City Clean-Up will run from March 31 through May 12. He reminded residents that the clean-up is for branches only, not garbage or weeds. He also expressed appreciation to city workers for preparing the baseball field for upcoming practices.

Devin Wilson reported that he had no significant updates at this time and apologized for limited availability over the past month.

Lesla Miller expressed appreciation to Robert and Scott for repairing the entrance at the rodeo grounds. She reported that the jackpot event scheduled for the previous Saturday was canceled due to low participation. She also noted that this year's rodeo will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will not include grand marshals in order to allow for an earlier start.

Tom Kay reported that he attended a Land Management Use meeting presented by SERDA. He also noted that Planning and Zoning reviewed a subdivision application and zoning clearance, recommending several changes. Additionally, he reported that the Fire Department identified a damaged front tire on the brush truck, and the front tires have since been replaced.

Agenda Item 13. Zoning Administrator Report

Jessica Lee reported that she completed eight zoning clearances, including two new home builds, two accessory structures, and four trailers approved for placement at Kim's Trailer Haven. She also reported that three vehicles were tagged for compliance, with two issues already resolved.

Jessica addressed a situation involving an individual staying at the rodeo grounds and provided notice to vacate; the individual complied within the given timeframe. Additionally, she has been working on a proposed subdivision and has communicated with several residents regarding the placement of additional dwellings behind existing homes.
