

COMMISSION WORKSESSION

March 23, 2026

Minutes of a scheduled worksession of the Sevier County Commission held this twenty-third day of March 2026. Meeting commenced at 10:30 a.m. with Commissioners Scott Johnson, Greg Jensen, and Ralph Brown in the Conference Room, Room 116, of the Sevier County Administration Building, 250 North Main, Richfield, Utah. Clerk/Auditor Steven Wall, Deputy Clerk/Auditor Barbara Crowther, and Executive Director Malcolm Nash were also present.

Additional information given for Mission at Richfield LLC Charitable Exemption:

Greg Anjewierden, representing Mission at Richfield LLC, discussed with the Commission their application for a charitable exemption for a skilled nursing center in Richfield. He indicated that they are a 501C(3), that all of the excess money they make goes back into the facility, that they do provide charity as needed in the facility, and noted the approximate amount of charity for 2025 being greater than the taxes paid. The Commission thanked him for the information and would consider the matter during the regular Commission meeting later that afternoon.

Discussion on Use of Fairgrounds with reduced fee:

Fairgrounds Supervisor Colton Conder, Tourism Director Amy Myers, and Deanna Thompson met with the Commission concerning use of the Fairgrounds. Ms. Thompson explained the Patriotic Camp program she would like to hold at the Fairgrounds, noting that it is part of the Field of Stars program which started 35 years ago. She said that their goal is to teach children about patriotism, and in previous years it has been a fundraising opportunity. She said that rent at the Fairgrounds has increase substantially, and she is requesting a decrease to support the work she is doing. It was noted that she had previously rented a room at the Fairgrounds, but used the entire facility; and the increased cost reflects use of the entire facility. Ms. Thompson said that the facility has already been rented for the week they would like to use it, but would like to use it in the future. The Commissioners thanked her for the information, and noted that the County is basically trying to cover the costs of the facility.

There being no further business to come before the Board, meeting adjourned at 11:02 a.m.
