Welcome & Roll Call

The City Council meeting began at 6:02 p.m. Mayor Austin called the meeting to order and welcomed those in attendance, including all Council Members, City staff, and members of the public.

Department Head Reports

Library Director – Linda King

Linda King addressed the Council and announced that floral arrangement activities will begin on April 9, with available spots remaining. The program will conclude on April 22.

Parks and Recreation – Shannon King

Shannon King addressed the Council and reported that the football helmets have been received and are in excellent condition. An order for shoulder pads will be placed soon. The home run fence has been installed, and the cook shed is scheduled to be set up on April 11.

He also reported that the removal of goat heads is nearly complete, with thirteen barrels collected. The ball diamonds require leveling. Additionally, there has been discussion about discontinuing the use of iPads at the stands and instead utilizing city phones with Square for payment processing.

Mr. King noted that the park cameras are currently not operational and that each camera is connected to its own router. He suggested consolidating the system so all cameras operate on a single router. He also mentioned ongoing discussions about establishing a general sports fund to separate these expenses from the general budget.

Public Works – Travis Atkinson

Mayor Austin congratulated Travis Atkinson and the department on recently obtaining certifications.



Mr. Atkinson reported that the city currently has twenty non-reading meters and is actively working to reduce that number. He noted that the school may have leaks, as indicated by high meter readings.

He also reported a recent one-foot water leak at Riverside Garland, which has been repaired. Councilmember Atkinson requested an update on stolen stop signs; Mr. Atkinson stated that four stop signs have now been reported stolen throughout the city.
