Items discussed:

Mayor Willis: Price City Police Secretary job advertisement closed, 24 applicants applied, 7 will be interviewed/HB 147 passed, all documents that need to be signed by residents have to be digitized and available online.

Sergeant Shawn Sackett: JAG Grant – no funding for police vehicles this year/increase in all incidents that Price City Police Department respond to/appreciation letters from residents/people to Price City Police Department thanking them for their assistance in helping with incidents.

Lisa Richens, Finance Director: the Finance office is busy working on the budget, quarterly reports, loan closing, URS issues/problems, etc.

Miles Nelson, Public Works Director: PRV failed Saturday, April 4, 2026, causing three leaks throughout Price City followed by one more Sunday morning/water supply concerns/restrictions from residents/promote water wisely campaign/WTP study consolidating with PRWID/pickleball courts project – two bids submitted/Spring Transmission Line – first chose bid backed out/Canal crossing project will be complete soon/traffic study complete for 3rd East and 4th North, upgrades to existing lights along with signs to yield to pedestrians.

Councilmember Miller: Received grant for tourism, gave back because could not meet deadline.

Nick Tatton, Administrative Director: Real property inventory submitted for grant to help update/SERDA Energy Symposium event (August)/Open Enrollment April 28, 2026 held at Price City Auditorium/Criminal prosecution contract, no bids received, only option is to contact Carbon County for an extension/Purchase Power Adjustment program - Lo tap changer to substation.

Steve Richardson, Electrical Utility Infrastructure Specialist: Lo tap charger worn out, two available in United States, one is four years out, would be a four-day blackout period during replacement, alternative – mobile station would cost \$480,000, Lo tap charger & replacement approx. \$300,000. SCADA upgraded recently can watch substation west and south.
